There are 2 memberships we talk about: the individual that is included in your Dance-A-Rama registration every year if you register and the club membership.

The 2 are not the same -- the individual membership provides you with the benefit of receiving the Intercom and being a member of our wonderful national organization that promotes square dancing for the single dancer.

The club membership is an annual payment that is based on how many members in your club. Are you a member? If you went to DAR, 2006 in Columbus, OH, yes you are. You paid your dues. If you didn't attend, send your money and the form at the end of this newsletter to Patsy Nester and become a member.

Is your club a member? Ask your president and if not, send in your money to Patsy Nester. The fee is \$10 per year for clubs up to 50 members, \$15 per year for clubs with 51 - 100 members, and \$20 per year for clubs with 101 or more members.

I hope that helps straighten out the difference between the 2 memberships!

On September 25 he decided to drive to the top of Pike's Peak. He told his daughters by telephone that the aspen were changing colors and it was beautiful. For a reason as yet unknown, on one of the turns he made it only 30%, went over the mountain, and was killed. His funeral was September 30.

This is a great staff and they are as excited about returning as we are to have them here.

We have a By-Law that makes it almost impossible to fill this position. the By-Law requires that for a person to be a candidate for a voting position, they must have been a member of SSDUSA for the previous 12 months. From this small number of people, no one was willing to take the job.

To overcome this problem I suggest that we search for leadership from the entire Single Square Dance Community. To do this, the By-Law would have to be changed to eliminate the need to have been a SSDUSA member for the previous 12 months, and replaced by "MUST BE A MEMBER or WILLING TO BECOME A MEMBER of SSDUSA" to be eligible for nomination or appointment to a voting position of SSDUSA.
