Single Square Dancers U.S.A. is proud to announce that Ruth Howell and Velma Doyle have been awarded the YellowRock Scholarship. Ruth and Velma will each receive four hundred dollars to further their calling and cuing career.

Ruth Howell lives in Maple Grove, MN, and is affiliated with the Rainbow Rhythms. She is a new cuer. Ruth started square dancing in 1994 and round dancing in 1995. She met her husband at the New Mexico's Singles Festival, and they first round danced together at Dance-A-Rama, 2003 in Albuquerque that same year.

Ruth stated that seven years ago, a cuer from her area suggested she buy his equipment so he could retire. She said it took her a while to really get the bug to be a cuer and that cuer still has not retired yet.

Velma Doyle lives in Groveport, OH and is affiliated with Bucks & Does Singles and Orbiting Squares Single Square Dances clubs. She learned to dance in 1985 and has been active in three clubs as a square and round dancer and club leader. Velma says, "She is an amateur caller who loves to do singing calls, but my hash calls are rudimentary." She wants to attend caller school to increase and improve her skills.

She does occasional guest tips at local dances and has called at parties at friend's homes and for demos at nursing homes and churches. She has been an apprentice member of the Central Ohio Callers Association since October, 2003.

To apply for a Yellowrock caller/cuer scholarship the caller/cuer must be at least 16 years old (before September 1 of the current year) and have no more than three years regular calling/cueing experience. The caller must send a cassette tape of one singing call and approximately two minutes of "patter" calling. For the cuer, a cassette tape with two types of tempos (i.e. set waits) must be sent. Do not include name or location on the tape.

## In Loving Memory....Joseph 'Joe' Fioretti

Joseph "Joe" Fioretti, 48, Homosassa, died Thursday, Dec. 15, 2005, at his home after a year long battle with cancer.

Survivors include his wife of 29 years, Elizabeth G. (Elley) Fioretti of Homosassa; one son, Joseph C. Fioretti of Ocala; three daughters, Jennifer Fioretti and Julie L. Fioretti both of Orlando, and Lisa E. Fioretti of Homosassa; his father, Frank R. Fioretti of Lady Lake; brother, Frank R. #### What's a Yellowrock?

There are three answers to that question. We are all familiar with the unofficial call "Yellowrock". If you are not, ask a dancer to show you one. Yellowrock is also the name of a directory of clubs for single (or solo) dancers, and a scholarship fund for up and coming callers and cuers.

Single Square Dancers USA (SSDUSA), publishes a directory every year, listing Single Square and Round Dance clubs, and clubs where the solo dancer is welcome. This directory is called the Yellowrock. Listing your club in the directory is free, and the directory sells for \$5 each from an SSDUSA officer, or \$6 if ordered in the mail. The Yellowrock Directory is printed pocket size, so it can be carried easily as you travel.

The Yellowrock Caller Scholarship was established many years ago by SSDUSA. Each year a scholarship is awarded to at least one new caller or cuer. The money from the scholarship can be used by the new leader to attend a caller or cuer's school or for anything they need to be a caller or cuer, like equipment or records. The money in the scholarship fund is generated by the proceeds from Yellowrock Directory sales. We don't have a complete list of everyone that has been granted a scholarship, but one of the first was a well known caller by the name of Dee Dee Dougherty.

Advertisements in the Yellowrock are also available, and help defray the cost – ultimately enabling us to donate more to help future callers and cuers. Contact Larada for advertising costs. It's a great place to advertise your special dances for the next year.
