The dance in 2007 is being hosted by the Single Square Dancers of Arkansas Association (SSDArkA). This is a state singles organization whose main purpose is to promote single square and round dancing in the state of Arkansas. There has never been a national square dance held in Arkansas to our knowledge so this will be a first. Come be a part of this great event and help us make "Dancing on the Rock" a hugh success.

We have a great staff of callers, cuers and line dance instructors. Calling squares will be Mike Hogan from Nebraska, Shane Greer from Oklahoma, Doug and Don Sprosty from Iowa, Tim Tyl from Texas, and Ray Wheelington, one of our own state callers from Texarkana. Cueing Rounds will be Jerry and Barbara Pierce from Alabama, Robbie Carrington Tennessee and Patti Wheelington, also one or our own from Texarkana. Leading and instructing line dances will be Joe Johnson, also from Arkansas. As you can see, the line-up is splendid and the dancing should be at its best.

Both after parties on Friday and Saturday night consist of continued dancing to live bands preceded by ice cream socials. The ice cream was such a big hit in Rochester we decided to follow suite and offer the same. Both bands are local and are well received around the state. Friday night will be country dancing to the sounds of Midnight Express and Saturday night will be a variety of music presented by Warren Crow.

N. Little Rock and Little Rock are located in the heart of Arkansas with the two cities being separated by the Arkansas River. Located in the southern part of Arkansas is a large diamond mine, which is open to the public for digging, therefore derives the theme of "Dancing on the Rock".

The Wyndham Riverfront Hotel (Host Hotel) where the dance will be held is located on the banks of the Arkansas River just 5 minutes off Interstate 30 and less than a mile from downtown Little Rock with free on-site parking

for all guests of the hotel and the Dance-A-Rama. The room rates are \$79.00 a night. If a rollaway is requested there will be an additional \$15.00 charge per rollaway per day. Hotel policy does not allow more than 4 people to a room.

After the dance is over in Little Rock, that address will be deleted.

Amenities offered by the hotel are high speed internet, alarm clock/radio, coffee maker with coffee, cable television, hair dryers, iron and ironing boards, and an outdoor pool. Located in and adjacent to the hotel is Benihana Japanese Steak House, Riverfront Restaurant and Steak House which offers a great buffet lunch and a lounge. For those who choose to fly to Little Rock, The Wyndham offers free airport shuttle service to the Little Rock National Airport which is only 8 to 10 minutes from the hotel.

There will be over 10,000 square feet of dance space for your dancing pleasure. There will be separate halls dedicated to mainstream, plus and round dancing all located on the first floor. Advanced and challenged halls will be located on the second floor. We have invited a great variety of vendors for your shopping pleasure who will also be located on the first floor just around corner from the dance halls. The hotel only has 223 guest rooms so we encourage you to make your reservations early if you plan to stay at the host hotel by calling the hotel toll free number (1-866-657 -4458). Be sure to mention the Single Square Dancers USA Dance-A-Rama in order to receive the negotiated rate of \$79.00. As of this date they have approximately 60 rooms already reserved.

Our second hotel of choice is the Double Tree Hotel located just across the river in downtown Little Rock. The rates for this hotel are \$89.00 for a single or double. They offer self parking at no charge to any overnight guest along with a complimentary shuttle service to and from the airport.

Neither hotel offers space for RV's or campers but camping is available just 10 minutes away at exit 150 off Interstate 40 at Burns Park (1-800-643-4690). Burns Park is one of the largest municipal parks in the country with 1,600 acres that features a log cabin built prior to the Civil War, a covered bridge, a dog park, handicapped accessible fishing pier, hiking trails, and more.

American Airlines is our official airline. reservations call 1-800-433-1790 and give authorization # A1387AA. For best discounts, make reservations at least 30 days prior to your departure date.

We would like to thank all who have already supported Dance-A-Rama 2007 by pre-registering or by buying souvenir items. At this time we have 130 people registered. Are you one of them? If not, we invite you to register and buy one of our souvenir items. YELLOWROCK SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS

Do not include name or location on the tape.

The Caravanning Solo's mission is to provide our solo dancers an additional avenue to be active in square dancing in a group environment where they are assured dances by participating in the use of a solo dance board.

About 2 1/2 years ago 12 single dancers in Snohomish County Washington got together for a potluck and to discuss the possibility of forming a group to go dancing with; this idea blossomed. We now have a membership list of 97 solo dancers from Snohomish, King, and Skagit counties. We caravan to two dances a month and have a group social one time per month; usually a potluck/meeting/board games day at someone's home.

We decided to call ourselves Solo Dancers instead of Single Dancers so that we could provide an opportunity to anyone, single or married, who wanted to square dance, but due to circumstances, they danced Solo. We have a great time with our caravans, carpools and monthly potluck socials. Making good friends in the group has been an added bonus and thus other activities have been enjoyed, such as boat rides, dinners out, miniature golfing, hiking, plays, square dance demo at a nursing home, and the Washington State Square Dance Festival, to name a few.

Out of the 97 members, we have a core group of about 25 to 30 people who are very active. One of our members made our Solo Dance Board and we take it to all our caravans, usually bringing from 8 to 15 people with us to each dance. Our monthly potlucks, held in member's homes are usually attended by 12 to 27 people.

Yes, we have many more women then men, but our core group of men will usually dance on the Solo Dance Board even if they have brought a partner with them. That partner gets first and last dance with her guy
