40[™] Dance-A-Rama Celebratin' America's Dance by the Nation's Capital September 2-5, 2010 Hilton Alexandria Mark Center, Alexandria, VA

Ya'll Come for "Celebratin' America's Dance by the Nations Capital" at the Hilton Alexandria Mark Center, Alexandria, VA, September 2-5, 2010.

The Hilton Alexandria Mark Center has 496 Deluxe Guestrooms and 45,000 square feet of flexible meeting space. We will have more than enough space for all the dance halls, vendor rooms, meeting space, etc. Complimentary parking is provided for overnight guests. Parking at the hotel's main garage is provided at \$5 per day with in/out privileges for attendees not staying at the hotel. The 40th DAR is also paying for street parking around the hotel because we anticipate we will have a lot of local dancers attending the 40th DAR. We will be putting down flooring in the five halls (Round Dance, Mainstream, Plus, Advanced/Challenge & Lines/CW) that we will be dancing in.

Plan to spend several days in Alexandria—the Hotel will honor the special rate for three days before and after the DAR! Begin enjoying the area by arriving on Monday, Aug. 31. Fly in to the Ronald Reagan Washington National Airport and catch the hotel shuttle from the airport to the Hilton Alexandria so you will be ready to start touring. The first tour starts early (8am - 2:30 pm) on Tuesday morning for the Cathedral, Shrine & Monastery (lunch is included).

Additionally on Tuesday, the two-day Pre-Convention Callers Seminar will begin at 9 am led by Ken Ritucci, Tom Miller, Mike Callahan, and Butch Adams. If anyone knows of any new callers, be sure to let them know that there is an opportunity for them to get some first-class instruction!

On Wednesday, Sept. 1, a great tour will take place from 8:30 am - 2:30 pm to two of the Smithsonian Museums. On Wednesday evening we have arranged for folks to attend "Sheer Madness" at the Kennedy Center from 7-11 p.m.

We will spend Thursday, Sept. 2, touring George Washington's Mount Vernon home from 8:30 a.m. to 2:30 pm. Besides seeing the wonderful grounds and museums, Martha Washington will join you for an engaging 30-minute presentation before lunch! We have also scheduled an Alexandria City Tour from 1-5 pm, which gives you plenty of time to have dinner and get ready to attend the Trail End Dance that evening with Tom Miller calling. Dom and Joan Filardo will be cueing that evening.

The Washington DC City Tour can be taken on Friday from 8:30 am - 12:30 pm or on Saturday from 1:30-5:30 pm. You can enjoy one of the city's finest tour guides who will introduce you to the history, architecture, and grandeur of Washington, D.C.

For variety, we have scheduled a River Cruise-Spirit of Washington on Friday, Sept. 3, from 11 am - 3 pm. You will be entertained with a fascinating narrated tour of DC's historic harbor, easily seen from the huge panoramic windows. You will also have a Grande Buffet lunch, a singing wait staff who will dazzle you with impressive renditions of your favorite tunes, and rock till you dock to DJ music of Top-40 hits.

On our 2^{nd} tour on Saturday, Sept. 4, 8:30 am – 12:30 pm, you will experience a docent tour of the fabulous Kennedy Center, take a leisurely stroll through Georgetown, and drive down Embassy Row.

On Sunday, Sept. 5, 8 am - 1 pm, we will have a dangle dance tour in the Greater DC area visiting historical site. Locations cannot be printed so they will be a mystery until you actually get on the buses!

Square Dance Leadership Award Honors SSDUSA Board Member

Rochester, NY has a unique award that is given each year to a person or couple who have displayed leadership both in square dancing and in the community over a sustained period of time. This award is the Daphne-Norma Leadership Award. It originated in 1977 when two local couples, John and Daphne Fink, and Frank and Norma Salvagio, were very active in the square dance community. John and Frank wanted to do something to honor their wives for all the hard work they put forth. They created this award, which includes a silver tray engraved with the name of the winner and the year, and a silver candy dish. These are passed on to the new winner each year, and he/she/they are expected to fill the dish with candy and carry it to each square-dance-related event that they attend. The winner also receives a pin and plaque that are theirs to keep. The award is presented each year in May at the annual Dance-O-Rama, which is our local coming-out party for new graduates.

SSDUSA members have been the recipients of this award numerous times over the years, including 2008 and 2009. I was honored to receive the award in 2008 during my year as president of SSDUSA. This year, Carl and Shirley DeGraff, long-time members of SSDUSA, are the recipients. Carl and Shirley both began square dancing as teens and have continued without a break. They met at Cloverleaf Squares Singles Square Dance Club and were married in 1988, just a month after working on committees when Cloverleafs hosted the 1988 DAR in Rochester, Both of them again worked on committees when we hosted the 2006 DAR here in Rochester. Carl and Shirley travel to many square dance festivals and have rarely missed a DAR over the years. They are also very active in their church and devote many hours of service there as well.

Carl is currently our By-Laws Chairman, with Shirley working with him on that committee. Carl has served the board in that capacity for two years thus far. We on the board are very proud to have him with us and are especially proud of him and Shirley for their devoted service to square dancing. They are certainly deserving of this special award. When you see them, look for the special award pin they are wearing and be sure to congratulate them on this very special honor!

FRANK NORRIS YELLOWROCK SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED

Single Square Dancers U.S.A. is pleased to announce that two new callers, Drew Bramlett of Garland, TX and Dale Chase of Dale City, VA, and two new cuers, Marilyn Graham of Jefferson City, MO and Eileen Okolowicz of Spencerport, NY, have been selected as the 2009 winners of the Frank Norris Yellowrock Scholarship.

Drew is currently a fourth year college student at Richland College getting a degree in musical theatre. He took square dance lessons with the Rebel Rousers in 1996 when he was seven years old. He has decided to enter the square dance calling ring to help preserve and promote the square dance activity, and because of the lack of young, up and coming callers.

Dale started back square dancing about five years ago after not dancing since the 1970's. He completed Plus, went on to learn DBD, and became interested in calling. He has been calling periodically for about 18 months and feels that attending a caller school would help him tremendously to "fine-tune" his calling.

Marilyn began square and round dancing ten years ago in Topeka, KS. She retired four years ago and returned to mid-Missouri to be closer to family, and soon discovered that there were no cuers in the entire Northeast Missouri District. About two years ago she bought used equipment and records and began teaching herself to cue. She has cued at four district clubs besides her own club, Capital City Squares. She is planning to attend a cuer school next June in Topeka, KS. She has been very active in dance leadership in Kansas and Missouri, and currently is the local Vice President, District Secretary, and State Delegate and is serving a second term as President of Heart of America Single Square Dance Association (HASSDA).

Eileen joined the Cloverleaf Squares class in 1985 and danced until 1992. She rejoined class in 2001 and has been dancing ever since. She took A1-A2 lessons in 2005 and now dances both the lady's and man's parts in Mainstream, Plus, and Advanced. She took round dance lessons in 1986 (Phase 2) and in 2004 (Phase 3). She cued one song at Amateur night in April 2008 and three songs at Amateur night in May 2009. She hopes to attend cuer school in 2010. She has also been very active in dance leadership, including serving as Co-Chair of Dance-A-Rama 2006 and as Vice-President, President and Past President of SSDUSA. The money in this scholarship fund has been generated over the years by the sales of Yellowrock Directories. Since SSDUSA no longer publishes the Yellowrock, this source of funding the scholarships has been eliminated, but we are able to continue to award scholarships due to the generous insurance policy left to SSDUSA by Frank Norris. Frank was our Yellowrock Scholarship Chairperson for many years until his death in the spring of 2007. This gift will help ensure that the fund continues to be available for years to come. If any of you are thinking about estate planning and are looking for a worthy beneficiary, please consider the possibility of helping our activity by contributing to this scholarship fund.

The purpose of the fund is to help new callers and cuers with the expenses associated with getting started in the profession. It is open to any caller or cuer age 16 or over who has three years or less experience. Anyone interested in applying must submit a demo cassette tape or CD, along with an application, to Velma Doyle, Yellowrock Scholarship Chairperson, 3938 Crestfield Dr, Groveport, OH 43125. You can download a copy of the Yellowrock Scholarship application from the SSDUSA Website <u>www.ssdusa.org</u>, or contact Velma. The deadline for receipt of the completed packet is August 1. Scholarships are awarded each year at the annual Dance-A-Rama festival.


