Message From Your President



We are excited to be Alabama Bound! The SSDUSA Board has been working hard to get things ready for your enjoyment. We are doing our part and now we need your support to make it a great event. We need your help to get the word out about the great dancing and all of the FUN we have at our Dance-A-Rama festivals. If you need any registration forms, please contact Ron Holland or me, and we will send them to you. Please register and make your hotel reservations ASAP. Pre-registering helps us plan a better event and guarantees you a room at the dance venue. To cut down on expenses, you may want to contact our roommate locator, Laurie Steward. The cost of the room is the same for one to four people. If for any reason you are not able to attend this year's DAR, please at least renew your membership by completing a membership application and paying the \$6.00 annual dues.

Too few people signed up for the tours we had arranged for Friday and Saturday, so we had to cancel those two tours. However, we still have two great tours: the Changing Face of Birmingham on Thursday, Aug 29 and the *Mystery Dangle Tour* on Sunday, Sept 1. Although the tour deadline has passed, we will continue to accept reservations for these two tours until the buses are filled. It would be a shame to come to Birmingham and not take the opportunity to see these local points of interest. Our Thursday tour will begin with a drive through Birmingham, as our tour guide points out sites of interest and tells us about the city's history. We will visit one of Birmingham's famous landmarks, The Original Peanut Depot, which opened in 1907. Now known as Alabama Peanut Company, the company roasts many pounds of peanuts each year including new flavors such as Salty Dill Pickle on Thursdays of each week. You may want to purchase some delicious roasted peanuts to carry back home....if they make it that far! We will see a short film and take a walking tour with narrative through Sloss Furnaces National Historical Landmark, the oldest preserved industrial plant of its kind in the world. I especially look forward to our included lunch at the Irondale Cafe, the Original Whistle-stop Café, which was made famous by Fannie Flagg in her book which was later made into the movie "Fried Green Tomatoes." We will ride through Redmont Historic District, where we can enjoy the beautiful architecture and gardens. We are to be back at the hotel at 4:30 PM, which will give us time to relax and get ready for the Trail-In Dance starting at 7:30 PM. Joe Goins and Tom Davis will be calling and Robbie Carrington and Diane Martin-Hamilton will be cueing the rounds. The dance locations for our annual mystery dangle dance on Sunday morning are, of course, a "mystery." Keep in mind that if you are into shopping, you can easily do so since our hotel is connected to a shopping center and just minutes from Riverchase Galleria, the largest enclosed shopping center in Alabama. It contains more than 150 stores with a food court for informal dining, plus several full service restaurants. It is good that we can park next to our hotel for free in the Riverchase Galleria parking lot.

Just look at what we have to offer! We have a great line up of callers and cuers. We have 4 different halls and none of the dancing will be on carpet. There will be square dancing programmed for you whether you dance Mainstream, Plus, DBD, A1 or A2. There will be rounds from levels II thru V or VI. Also, there will be line dancing. Programming will include sessions on Intro to Plus, Intro to DBD and Intro to Advance. All of the halls are on the same level, and staying at the host hotel will get you close to the action.

Tours

Highlights of Birmingham - 9:00am to 4:30pm, Thursday, Aug. 29 (\$??):

In the morning we ride into Birmingham and start with a brief walk around Railway Park, a 19 acre green space that celebrates the city's industrial and artistic heritage. Here we will learn about the origins of the city. Our next stops are to several sites important to the history of the American Civil Rights Movement: Kelly Ingram Park, the 16th Street Baptist Church, Dynamite Hill, and Bethel Baptist Church. Our lunch will be at Niki's West, which claims to be Birmingham's finest restaurant since 1957. In the afternoon we go to Sloss Furnaces, which was once the largest manufacturer of pig iron in the world. It stands today just as it did in the late 19th century, a monument to the Industrial Revolution. With its web of pipes and towering stoves, this unique National Historic Landmark provides visitors a glimpse into Birmingham's rich industrial heritage. Our next stop is the Birmingham Civil Rights Institute, followed by an hour at the Birmingham Botanical Gardens. Price includes transportation, tour guide, and lunch.

<u>Mountain Brook/Homewood/ Barber Museum/Booksmith Tour – 9:00am to 12:30pm, Friday, Aug 30 (\$??):</u>

We will drive through Mountain Brook and Homewood. (Mountain Brook was at one time the 8th wealthiest city in the US.) Next we visit the Barber Motorcycle Museum which is home to over 1,400 motorcycles that span over 100 years of production. More than 650 bikes can be seen on any given day! Our final stop is at Booksmith, a one of a kind bookstore in the world that only sells autographed copies of books. Price includes transportation and tour guide.

Arlington Antebellum House/Negro League Baseball Museum/Rickwood Field/Legion Field Tour – 9:30am to 12:30pm, Saturday, Aug 31 (\$??):

We start our tour with a visit to Arlington Antebellum house, a small but well preserved home where an upper middle class family lived during the period leading up to the Civil War. The next stop is at the Negro League Baseball Museum. (Willy Mays played on their local Negro League Team.) The final stop is at Rickwood Field/Legion Field. (Rickwood is America's oldest baseball park.) Price includes transportation and tour guide.

Mystery Dangle Dance-8:00am to 12:00pm, Sunday, Sept. 1 (\$??):

This tour includes motor coach transportation and dancing at mystery locations. This is always one of the best tours each year! Price includes transportation and tour guide.

WELCOME TO BIRMINGHAM: the largest city in Alabama. The metropolis of Birmingham accounts for approximately one quarter of the entire state's population. It's considered one of the country's most livable cities because of its contributions to medical research, service-based economy and lively downtown. It also features 99 historic neighborhoods often referred to as the cradle of the American Civil Rights Movement. With its vibrant history, beautiful scenery and temperate weather, there's plenty to see and do while visiting Birmingham.
