DANCE-O-RAMA DINNER & HOUSE EXCITING
Last month we discussed the caller and publicity committees and their functions.
Since then the Dinner and House committees have gotten busy.

Bob and Ginny McNair, assisted by Bud and Claire Young head the Dinner Committee. They have made arrangements with the Kodak Park cafeteria people and here is how things line up. Dinner will be served in the Service dining room on the main floor of the Recreation Center from 5 to 7 P.M. Six hundred people can be seated so if most people come to dinner there will be two or three sittings.

The menu they have is a mouth-watering one even to an old Kodak regular like me:
Tossed salad with French dressing; Roast
Prime Ribs of Beef; Oven-Browned Potatoes;
Swiss Beans; Rolls and Butter; Apple Pie with topping and Tea, Coffee or Milk.
Coffee and Coca-Cola throughout the entire afternoon and evening are also Dinner committee responsibilities and this year coffee will cost a dime because of the ten hour coffee break.

The House committee headed by Louis and Lillian Stork, assisted by Chuck and Doris Radamaker have inspected the facilities at the Center and feel that the second floor cafeteria and lounge will accommodate 40 squares and the gymnasium on the third floor will take care of 60 squares. What a sight 60 squares on one floor will be for those of us who have yet to make a convention. Naturally, the committee will see to it that there are rows of chairs or bleachers for us to sit on in those weaker moments.

The House committee is also in charge of parking arrangements and cleaning up afterwards. There is plenty of parking space available-the afternoon dancers and probably some dinner and evening guests can park across the street from the Center the late comers will have a short walk from the Visitors parking lot some few hundred yards to the West.

These committee heads will be needing <u>lots</u> of help so if you would like to <u>choose</u> an assignment like taking dinner tickets or something I'm sure any one of them would be glad to hear from a volunteer.

During 1963 we learned 14 new dances. In the same length of time we forgot 14 old dances. An old dance, by the way, is any dance other than the dance the Tuckers are in the process of teaching.

We danced thru the Golden Gate, during the Neapolitan Nights and the Lazy Days of Summer. We danced Anytime, with a Happy Feeling and in A Rockin' Mood. We danced to An Irishman's Dream which was a nightmare for most of us. We met Mr. Lucky, Bill Bailey, a Devil Woman and the Tuckers sent the whole Club home early one night by reintroducing Mack the Knife. But, like round dancers everywhere, we danced in the shad-The average F-A-R has done Dancing Shadows at least 119 times since it was first Rescheduling runs rampant at our club-introduced and I, for one, was glad to get out of those shadows and into some bright City Lights.

We started the year with the smallest treasury of any club in the Rochester area (about \$4.73).
