DO YOU LIKE HOT, DILL PICKLES? At the "after party" for Red Bates. a number of gucsts remarked about the "hot" flavor of the home made dill pickles which are a specialty of Joe and Audree Brodner. president of the Irondequoit Squares.

By special permission, PROMENADER is pleased to print the Brodner recipe as follows.

Use clean, firm, freshly picked pickles, othermise the pickles may be hollow and soft They should be not more than four inches long and not more than one or two days old. Nash and brush pickles and place in ice to chill. Snip ends and place in jar Then add.

1/2 hot pepper
small staik of celery
$1 / 2$ or medium clove garlic
1 tablespoon salt
small amount of dill
add cold water and seal the jar.
Shake jar io dissolve salt, and jar should be shaker wide a day for about four days. as sait wili settle to bottom.

Pickles may be eaten after two weeks. that's when they taste the best.
