FEDERATION DELEGATES MEET

Ken Schreib, of Lima Grand Squares, newly elected Executive Secretary of the Rochester Federation called his first meeting of the Board of Delegates Tuesday, Oct. 26th at Cutler Union.

Chief item of news of the meeting was the report issued by Lou Stork, 1966 Dance-O-Rama Chairman, that previous arrangements to hold this event at Vince's 50-Acres will have to be cancelled and a new location contracted for as soon as possible. Management of Vince's had indicated earlier that they plan to install carpeting on the floor and this would make it unsuitable for dancing.

Lou is presently busy talking to representatives regarding the usage of the very few spots in Rochester that are suitable for an event of this type. The Delegates voted to support Lou in his efforts and gave him near "emergency" power to act on behalf of the Dance-O-Rama committee.

Other business included a "farewell" report regarding PROMENADER'S financial status by business manager, Bill Harvey who is moving to Connecticut, discussions regarding publicity and promotion of square dancing; possibility of a "March of Dimes" dance; possibility of a series of once-a-month dances for the beginner classes, called by Tom Trainor. No definite action was voted on any of these items.

Members of the present Board are listed elsewhere in this issue. Dance-O-Rama committees have been named and these will appear in future issues.

The next Federation meeting is expected to be called in January.

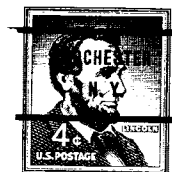
