FEDERATION DELEGATES MEET
Ken Schreib presided over his second meeting of the Federation Board of Deiegates on Tuesday, January 18th at Cutler Union

Plans for a donation to be sent to the survivors of the deadly blast at which up to 20 persons have reportedly died in a natural gas explosion in Keokuk, Iowa were discussed Several clubs reported they have already sent donations. The final decision was to delay the collection as a Federation function until during the Dance-0-Rama when a general donation would be asked for from the dancers on the floor. The money collected would then be forwarded to the fund headquarters under the name of our Federation.

Application for membership by the Swing-a-


Longs was read. A lenghty discussion followed which was terminated by a motion that the application be tabled for further study.

Ken Schreib introduced comments in regard to questions in the legal field which bear on the Federation as an organization and on the member clubs as well. The general feeling was that the club delegates would inquire as to any lawyers who are club members so that the Federation could engage him. If no lawyers are dancers, then Schreib was cmpowered to engage a lawyer for legal assistance.

A motion was introduced to effect a change in the present constitution to raise the maximum amount of money to be retaincd in the treasury from the present $\$ 100$ to a maximum of $\$ 500$. This change in the constitution will now have a 30 day period in which it will go to the clubs for review. a delegate vote to be scheduled at the next meeting
