15TH "NATIONAL" A SUCCESS

The cry of "Swing your Chicks in '66" which was associated with the 15th National Square Dance Convention in Indianapolis last June, has now faded into history.

Press releases from the publicity chairman indicate that a total of 14,016 dancers attended what turned out to be the third largest "Nation al" ever, exceeded only by those held previously at Detroit and Long Beach.

Dancers were present from 44 states, Canada and several foreign countries. As expected, Indiana led all states with 5,740 registrants, then followed Illinois with 1,574, Ohio with 1,323, Michigan with 1,310 and Kentucky with 874. There were 50 or more dancers from 22 different states and 25 or more from 30 states.

New York State was represented by 36 dancers. How many were from our Rochester is not known. We'd like to hear from anyone who attended who could give us an account of the gala convention

ALREADY, THE <u>16</u>TH IS IN THE MAKING. Next year, the National will be held in Philadelphia on June 29-30 and July 1st. The cry on this one is: "Swing your Queen at Sweet 16". Site of the Convention will be in the new, airconditioned Philadelphia Civic Center.

Flyers and registration blanks are now avail-able for the "big Swing" in Philly. To obtain copies, and for all information on registration write to: 16th National Square Dance Convention, Elwyn Post Office, Elwyn, Penn. 19063.

Convention site in 1968 is Omaha, June 20-22. Convention site in 1969 is Seattle, June 26-28.
