## den's jress

1. Shoes - necessary, especially if you want to appear gracious in de-feet.
2. Belt - in most cases necessary to stop a disaster.
3. Shirt - should have collar an cuffs, or both.
4. Hair - not necessary, but apparently side burns are.
5. Hat - not necessary, unless you are dancing up a storm.

## Ladies' Dress

1. Jresses - are necessary, mini, maxi or duck.
2. Petticoats - should show only at the bottom.
3. Belt - necessary to break up the contours.

10- Don't talk during a dance unless you can hear what you are saying, that way you won't offend anyone else.

If you follow these rules, you will never go wrong more than once, I think.

To the new dancers: Don't believe all you hear about me. Nobody, but nobody, could dance that lousy.
