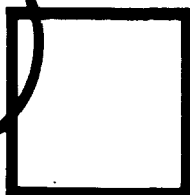


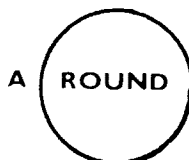
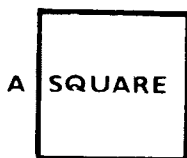

Also back in December many clubs held elections and this is my first opportunity to congratulate the losers and offer my condolences to the winners. Some of the clubs had only one slate. In a way it's unfair to the candidates, it doesn't give them a chance to lose. As for me, being very democratic, I must have a choice. Sooo I voted for all the wives.

So much for the past and now to the present.

Have you noticed all the new calls that have been coming out? Everything from "Engine Trade" to "Rotate the Crops". The Callers are finding it hard to cover them all. Soooo I decided to help them out and write a definition for one of the new calls.

The new call I choose is "Tote that Barge". It's been a real big hit down South.

Tote that Barge: This is a combination call made up from two old calls, the "Dixie Charge" and "Lift that Bale". The call was written by Joe Hiampipic from Orlich's Alley, better known as "Jumpin Joe".

Definition: First, check your set, make sure it contains eight people, four of each. Men and women. You can tell the women, they wear clothes with zippers on the side or back.

Now this call starts when the set is in two lines of four. One line is facing East and the other West, but if you look at some of the other sets, they may have lines facing North and South. Some may even be facing NN by E or S by WW, etc. Don't pay any attention to them. You are right!

You begin with the man turning to face his left hand lady and takes her right hand in his left. If his left hand lady is right handed, then he will take her left hand in his right hand. So far simple, huh!

Next, he will walk around the left hand lady, passing right shoulders or pass left shoulders around the right hand lady. Either way will come out OK. Pass all the way around until the man's back is facing back to the ladies front. This part is very difficult if the lady doesn't cooperate. Mine didn't.

Assuming you cooperated, we will continue. This next part is for "those who can" or "those that still want to" (there is a lot of freedom in this call). At this point, those that do, the man will "Barge thru" and "Tote" the lady after him, then they will turn to face each other and do a quick "Quetch". You can hold this position as long as you want because that is the end of the call.

To the Callers: No thanks is necessary, I was glad to help out.

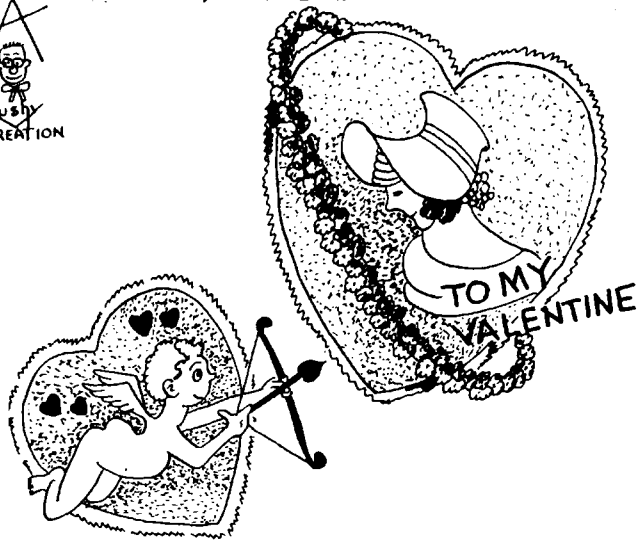
