## LETTER TO THE EDITOR

January 22, 1971
To the Square Dancers of Rochester:
There is, and always has been, a lot of discussion aboat the large proportion of people who work their way througt a square-dance class, only to drop out in a comparatively short time. It occurred to me that it would be a good thing to have some facts and figures to talk about. To get some facts, I have made a survey of what happened to the class graduates for one year, from a group of clubs in the Rochester metrodolitan area.

Because it seems quite common for spring graduates to join their clubs right after graduation, only to fade away durine the subsequent year, the survey was made to
find out how many of the graduates from the spring of 1969 have paid dues in one or more of the clubs in the fall of 1970.

The group of clubs consists of those who published their lists of graduates in the 1060 Mas issue of the romenader. The "metropolitan area" was defined to incluae the Boots ' $n$ Slippers in Hilton, but not the Lima Grand Squares and others farther away. This leaves eight. clubs: Belles ' $n$ Eeaus, Boots ' n Slippers, Country Twirlers, EKC-O Squares, Genesee Dancers, Henriettia Friendship Squares, Irondequoit Squares and Swingin' Eights. The figures for the dropouts include all who are not members of any of these eight clubs, even though they might have joined some other nearby club.

Only married couples were counted, as it is rare for singles to remain long in square dancing, and at least. one club does not admit singles to membership.
The condensed results of the syrvey are:

The figures show that we are fully justified in our worry about the dropout rate. Half of the couples who lasted through 28 to 20 weeks of instruction have disappeared within 16 months after graduating! We know that there are some who don't stay because of health, moving out of town, changing family circumstances, etc., but we can't avoid the conclusion that there are a lot of people who have been disappointed, have not found whatever reward they expected as a resulf to taking all those lessons.

I believe that there is a need in the Rochester area for clubs in which the material is deliberately held to what is called, in some parts of the country, "fun level". New graduates could return in the fall and dance comfortably at the level they achieved at graduation, and those who do not wish to attend religiously each meeting of the club could miss a few without being overwhelmed when they do go. This idea seems to work well in other areas. A large proportion of the clubs in the West Coast area of Florida is of this type.

Of course, the bie question is what to do about it? What is it that these people wanted and didn't find? Oniy a series of interviews-in-depth with the dropouts themselves could answer this question for sure, but in my opinion a lot of them don't want to spend their summer going to workshops, and they also don't want to come back to the club darces in the fall, only to find that they are not skilled enough to dance with the people who di.d.

A fun level club might be a new organization, or the result of a self-chosen policy by one or more of the existince clubs. One other nexessary move would be to explain to all class graduates the difference between the "fun level" and the "workshop" clubs, and to encourage each couple to choose freely the type of club which best fits their personal tastes. Sure, each club likes to hand on to the sraduates of its own class, but the question is not whether some other ciub is going to steal them away from you. The real question is, would you rather see your raduates dance happily with some other frouc, or droy away from square dancing entirely?
