ROCHESTER AREA FEDERATION OF WESTERN ROUND AND SQUARE DANCE CLUBS INC.

OUR FEDERATION REPORTS THAT:

--chairman of the 1972 Dance-O-Rama, Bob Bourne, has named Greece Athena as the most likely spot for the next Dance-O-Rama.

--the Federation Summer Dances were a huge success and it was recommended that they be held again next year. Chuck Prister thanked the Federation in behalf of the callers.

--the Monroe County Fair was a huge success. Seventeen clubs participated in the Fair. Eighty-two couples signed up for lessons. A motion was made to have another demonstration at the Fair next year. This was seconded and passed.

--the liability of a Sales Tax on Square Dances was much discussed. Club dues and gate receipts may be subject to tax. A judgment may be levied against any square dance club officer, retroactive to 1965. Two clubs in Binghamton have already had judgments levied against them. A group in Syracuse has started a Defense Fund and requested help from the Rochester Federation. Our Federation lawyer, J. McCollum, is in contact with the lawyers handling the Binghamton cases. What happens in those cases will set a precedent for the rest of the State. At the October meeting Mr. McCollum reported that ground work is being done to change the State Tax Law. At present, the activity consists of lobbying which must be done as private individuals. It was suggested that we write our State legislators and express our dissatisfaction with the present Sales Tax law.

--that a motion was passed designating the Federation as the Central Organization to collect the money and form a Defense Fund for Sales Tax liabilities; and a resolution was passed that each club member be asked to donate a dollar.

--the Callers Co-op dance which is being held on Nov. 14 from 2 to 10 p.m. at Irondequoit High School, deserves strong support from all the Clubs because the proceeds will help to swell the Defense Fund which is to the advantage of us all.

--the Clubs were reminded that the Federation is the proud owner of a considerable number of Guide Books for Square Dancers. These books are very interesting and informative. They can still be purchased for \$.50 for a single copy or \$.35 each in bulk. For further information, contact Lou Sirianni (392-4258).

--Ned Hasbrouck suggested that the Federation sponsor a telephone answering service. This service would be used for general square dance promotion and specifically would be used as the central clearing house for the latest square dance information, such as dance schedules, locations, times, and possible cancellations. It was estimated that this service would cost each club about \$15 a year. The delegates were asked to discuss this with their Clubs.

--that president, Phil Maine, appointed Ned Hasbrouck to head a committee to publicize NATIONAL SQUARE DANCE WEEK next year.

--that Club dues for the Federation are \$5.00, instead of \$10.00, previously reported.

A LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Dear Editor:

Western Square Dancing in the Rochester area now offers a fine diversified program of different levels of dancing, but how many people are aware of this? Many couples terminate their dancing either because they become bored or because they can't keep up the pace of dancing several times a month. I think the time has come for us all to recognize the existence of these levels and to acknowledge their important place in the square dancing world, including here in the Rochester area. If we are to keep people dancing it is important for them to know where they can go to dance at a particular level. It is also time to put an end to some dancers snubbing other dancers because they drop out of one club in order to dance with a higher level club. Each couple should have this information enabling them to find a place to dance a level where they are comfortable and happy.

I suggest that we have a listing in the Promenader of each club, whether federated or not, with a letter designating its level of dancing and whether the dances are open or closed:

- A - A Basics Fun Level Club, limited to the first 50 (or 75) basics. Ex.: Chuck Prister's group. Dances are open.
- B - Regular Club Level, slightly above "A" with a few added figures known to all. Most of the Federation Clubs fit into this level. Dances open to B groups and above.
- C - High Club Level, extra good level with new calls taught. Ex.: ECK-O SQS, SWINGIN' EIGHTS, SINGALONGS. Open to B groups and above.
- D - Intermediate Level, slightly above Group C. Membership by invitation. Dances closed. Ex.: K.A. SQS.
- E - High Intermediate Level, for experienced dancers desiring to dance to more material than offered at the above clubs. A limited number of advanced basics used. Membership by invitation. Dances closed. Ex.: LILAC SQUARES.
- F - Advanced Level, using a greater variety of material, including a large number of advanced basics. Much emphasis on position dancing done very smoothly. Ex.: ROLLAWAYS. Dances closed. Membership by invitation.

I also suggest that the DanceORama would be more interesting to our many experienced dancers if the programming included some Hot Hash, Advanced Level, Challenge, Workshops leveled for new dancers, club dancers, and above level club dancers. The 1972 staff is well qualified to execute all these different levels. I am tired of hearing people say that they are not going to DanceORama because they don't want to dance all day with the new dancers and they also don't want to do challenge dancing. Let's have some of all levels like other festivals offer.

Please remember that you are always welcome at our dances at any time, in any numbers, on the regular donation basis.





 3 Swd LOD on L, close R, cross thru twd RLOD on L (both XIF), hold 1 ct;
 4 Spot trn R-fc (W L-fc) in 3 quick steps R,L,R(W L,R,L) & end fcg ptr with M's bk to COH.-;

- 5 - 8 TWIRL,2,3,TCH; WRAP,2,3,TCH; UNWRAP,2,3,TCH; CHANGE SIDES,2,3,TCH(fc ptr);

5 W twirls R-fc under joined lead hnds as M vines LOD swd L, cross R behind L, swd L, tch R;

6 M steps R,L,R slightly RLOD but almost in place as W does a L-fc twirl almost in place under same hands to end in wrap pos with M's L hnd & W's R joined in front of W & other hands joined at W's R hip & both fcg the wall, tch L;
 7 Retain hold of M's R hnd & W's L (release others) & as M steps almost in place (L,R,L) the W unwraps R-fc to end fcg ptr, tch R;


8 Change sides in 3 fast steps R,L,R with W moving under joined M's R hnd & W's L & ending with ptr fct & M's bk to wall, tch L;

- 9 -16 REPEAT Meas 1 thru 8 of PART B
 Starting with M on outside of circle fcg in & ending in SCP ready to do Part A. (On 2nd time thru dance end in CP with M fcg wall ready for ending);
 DANCE GOES THRU TWICE (Intro,A,B,A,B,ENDING) (12 Meas) Exactly like the INTRO except in Meas 12 the twirl is done in place then step apart (change hnds) & ACK as music ends.
