The Prado's, the DeGraves, the Tucker's and the Kinsley's also assisted as First Mates to our Captain Callers and cued the rounds on the square dance decks. We know everyone enjoyed and appreciated this excellent group as much as we did.

As for the evening, BEAUTIFUL is the only way we can describe the entire area—from the lighthouses that greeted dancers coming on board to the clipper ships, mermaids, fish nets, wharfs, etc. that transformed the school into a nautical wonderland. This transformation took many hours to complete, but was kept on course by the capable hands of Don Wacenske and his crew.

Again, BEAUTIFUL and delicious is the way we must describe the Ship's Galley, which was filled with a variety of delicious, homemade finger sandwiches and cookies--many donated by dancers and friends. Heading up the crew in the Galley were Sylvia and Murray Kellogg.

FIDDLE-A-ROUNDS is the first club in the history of the MDA dance to take the trophy away from Hilton's Boots "N" Slippers by having 98.5% of their members present. That was no easy duty, but many hands pitched in. Congratulations FIDDLE-A-ROUNDS. The Teen Trophy went to Swinging Squares, a group of pre-teens. Congratulations to you also. These happy, smiling faces were definitely BEAUTIFUL.

Janet and George Musshafen added excitement and pleasure to the evening for many dancers. They headed the Raffle Committee which raised more than \$800. Door prizes and raffles were won by dancers from many different areas, and we would like to congratulate the winners. We would also like to thank the many local banks and stores who responded to our requests with such generosity. The thoughtfulness of these people is also a heart-warming and BEAUTIFUL experience.

In summary, dancers, there are simply too many people to acknowledge and too many "thank yous" to say. We simply can't do it all here. For those of you who couldn't attend the dance, I have only touched the surface, but perhaps you can begin to understand what "BEAUTIFUL" means. For those of you who "Did Your Thing" and attended the dance, YOU ARE BEAUTIFUL. By attending, you helped contribute to the cause to defeat Muscular Dystrophy, and that's BEAUTIFUL. Thank you.
