SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT

Discussing our great activity with many other dancers, we find they feel as we do, that if we're not careful, our dancing will go backwards thirty years.

The gimmicks, short-cuts, and what-have-you are a total nuisance.

Remember, you are only one of eight people in a square and for that reason, courtesy is most important. Don't get annoyed if someone else in the square breaks the square, you will have your turn. If you are a man, be gentle with the ladies. Don't squeeze their hands during a Grand Right and Left; or don't squeeze their arms on an allemande left; don't pick them off their feet during a swing and don't do anything to them that you wouldn't want done to your own wife.

At the end of each "tip", clap your hands. This is done for two reasons: To tell the caller that you enjoyed his calling and that you are appreciative for a job well done; also, that you are proud of yourself for dancing well. Thank the other three couples in your square and let them know that you enjoyed dancing with them.

When the needle is put on the record for the next "tip", don't wait for others to get out on the floor; show your enthusiasm by getting up and being ready to dance.

From time to time you will see dancers doing all sorts of fancy things that you were not taught by your caller, but don't get involved in these actions. They are not the right way to dance. Sometimes poor dancers try to camouflage their inability to dance properly by doing fancy motions which they think look sharp. Good dancers don't need these gimmicks to make them look professional. If you combine these basic rules with the other rules of common courtesy, you will enjoy many years of dancing pleasure.

Here are some gimmicks we have encountered, and what square dance teacher has taught them? I dare you to name him.

Kicking: Do this with your partner; better yet, not at all!

Do si do: Why the bat wing? We are humans, not birds! And, also it is not a waist swing at this point.

Right and left thru: Come on boys, one hand is not enough. You're supposed to courtesy turn your lady. Here is your chance to put your arm around her waist to make this a smooth turn.

Right and left grand: Pat a cake - who needs it? I did this when I was growing up. Now I'm full grown. How about you?

2 couples promenade: The other two were never taught to swing the opposite. If your four couples agree, go to it. But again, this is a gimmick. Most of the time it is poorly timed and the set gets behind.

We enjoy fun and are not serious dancers, but we do feel as others do, that dancing should be smooth. All the rest that someone has added is unnecessary. And who knows, maybe you'll like it if you try it!

Tongue in cheek: Happy and smoooooooooth dancing.

CALLERS PROFILE

"Wild" Bill Wilcox

In 1963, "Wild" Bill and Judy started taking square dance lessons in Erie, Pa. Halfway through the lessons, Bill was transferred to Duluth, Minnesota, but Judy was able to stay and finish out the course. With wishes of "good luck" to the Minnesota clubs both Bill and Judy were graduated and sent on their way to happy dancing. After about a year, Bill, who loves to sing, got the 'bug' for calling and with the encouragement of the local callers, he started doing some singing calls and one night stands. His first class was in the 'cellar' with his teenagers and their friends. Before that year was over, one of the callers decided to give up one of his clubs and the brave and beautiful dancers of the Seaway Swingers asked Bill to try his luck. He got a year's experience in teaching and club calling and was elected to Vice President of the Northeast Minnesota Caller's Association, when another transfer came through. Upon arrival in Rochester, New York, the bug kept biting and with only one year's real experience, Bill and Judy decided to start a new group of dancers in Webster. Three couples were the beginning of the Web-Spinners Club in the fall of 1967, but as three isn't quite enough for a square, they went

Guess who had another new granddaughter? John & Vera Sillick. Boy, their family sure is growing.

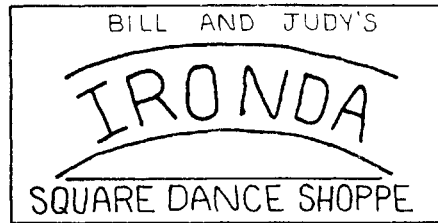

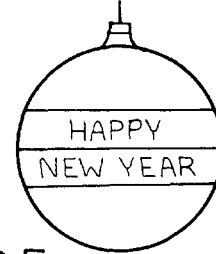

9-16 REPEAT PART A MEAS 1 - 8 --except end facing ptr & wall in CP.

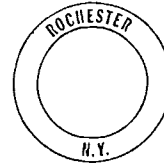

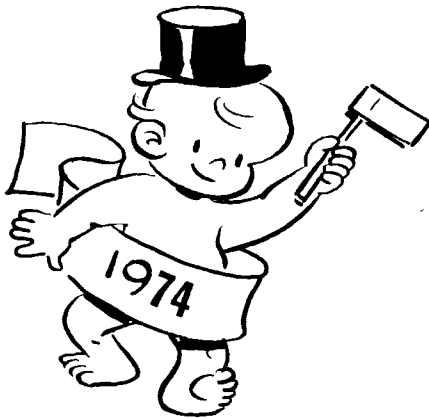
