Caller's Profile

BOB & NORA SLOMCENSKI ( Round Dance Leaders)

Bob moved into the Rochester area from his hometown of Naugatuck, Conn. in June of 1969 to accept an engineering position at Xerox Corp. Shortly after his arrival, his new next door neighbor literally dragged Bob to his first square dance. The then newly formed "Swinging Singles" became a regular habit of Bob's.

Bob met Nora Smith, a Rochester girl employed at R.T. French Co., in October of 1969 and introduced her to the world of square dancing. Although they have never officially taken square dance lessons, both Nora & Bob have been dancing regularly since 1969.

It wasn't until 1971 that Bob became interested in Round Dancing, for it was then that he (without Nora) took basic lessons from Charlie & Perkie Tucker. Bob began teaching round dance basics to the "Swinging Singles" in January 1972 (while still taking lessons himself).

Bob & Nora were married in April 1972 and that fall it was back to the Tucker's class so that Nora could learn rounds and so that Bob could pick up some teaching pointers. "I owe most of what I know about round dancing to Charlie and Perkie", says bob.

The Slomcenski's were introduced to "Tecumseh Squares" in November 1973 by Bruce Shaw, the club caller. "It was a great break for us",says Bob. "They've really helped us to become established as Round Dance Leaders".

At present Bob & Nora work for "Tecumseh Squarea" as Round Dance Cuers, Leaders of a Round Dance Club/Workshop and teachers for "Tecumseh's" second Round Dance basics class. They also belong to the "Caller's Cooperative of Rochester" and occasionally do guest appearances at the "Country Twirlers".





CCR HOW-TO-CORNER

SPLIT CIRCULATE is done from parallel ocean waves. Those facing in wald straight across, the same as for All Eight Circulate. The ones facing out roll into the neighboring position, the same as for Scoot Back. The key to this movement is to imagine that the square is divided in half by a wall that splits both waves down the middle. Dancers then circulate in their own narrow loop on each side of the wall, without crossing into the other half of the set.
