

I have come to realize that when I goof up a set it isn't always my fauld <u>or</u> the other dancers in the set. Who else could it be? The Caller, it could be, that's who.

He who stands so proudly up in front and looks like he was born with a silver microphone in his mouth.

Callers come in all shapes and sizes. I noticed only one physical contour that most of them have in common, a large nose. Do you suppose it's because they use it for resonance?

There are Callers from all parts of the country. There are Callers from the south with their drawls. They can goof me up. They want to make sure it's understood that they are calling to everybody.

They call: "promenade you-all and ya-all pass thru, keep smilin' you-all, ya heer now". No, I didn't "heer now" and blew the set.

Did you ever hear the callers from the New England States? They have some calls that sound like this: Faw-werd up and back" and "Sinners in". I thought they were talking directly to me.

Then there are what I call the Lazy Callers. They tell you they invented a new call and it's called, "Startwirl-thru-trade-by." They call it, then just stand silent for two minutes, while you try to dance it. Naturally I blew this call too. If they really get ambitious they will put together 30 or 40 calls, and call only once during a tip. They could be replaced with a computer. Now I must say that there are some Callers who are helpful. They give you cues and lead you thru some of the calls. But there are some others who only <u>think</u> they are giving you helpful cues.

For instance, the other night a Caller called "Square the Barge." Why? I don't know, unless it was because it had been raining for days and he thought he ought to call something that floats. Anyway he called it and his starting cues were: "one, two, three, four" and about half way thru, the cue was, "now finish it". Big help! Man, he done sunk that Barge.

Maybe the answer to the different ways and accents of of the callers is numbers. Everybody will learn the calls by numbers and the Caller will quarterback. He will call 14-22-69 Hike! and away we'll go. This would be fine until some Caller jazzes up the numbers and makes sounds like a Tobacco Auctioneer's chant, then we would be back to standing there saying, "Did he say seben or eleben?"

Sococococo maybe numbers aren't the answer. I guess we will have to just dance what we can and thank God for Left Allemande.

I don't know if I have proven my case, but from now on one of my favorite alibis is going to be: The caller goofed!

And I'm sure somebody is going to say, "You might just as well, you used everything else." Well

# Callers Co-Op

HOW-TO CORNER: TURN & WEAVE starts from a DPT formation; that is, when the set is in position to do a Double Pass Thru. The insides Turn Thru and then everybody Passes Thru ( to a Trade By position). The new outsides face to the right to become the ends of an Ocean Wave, while the new insides meet with their <u>left</u> hands and turn one-quarter to be the centers of the waves.

You might hear PASS & WEAVE, to indicate that the movement starts with a Centers Pass Thru instead of the Turn Thru. Other possibilities are HALF-TAG & WEAVE, starting from parallel lines instead of the DPT formation, or maybe SCOOT & WEAVE, beginning with a complete Scoot Back from parallel waves.





Caller's Profile

LESLIE BRADT started square dancing in Jan. of 1966. Being quick to pick it up, he graduated that same spring, in March. He was a member of the Little Squares Club, who's caller at the time was Bruce Shaw.

In the fall of 1966, he learned how to do singing calls at the age of twelve. He was encouraged and taught by Bruce and Una Shaw. Impressed with the results, they suggested he try doing a singing call at the Christmas demonstrations that the Little Squares did. Then in the same year, with Bruce as his sponsor, he did a singing call at every demonstration after.

Leslie called at various clubs throughout the city such as: Boots & Slippers, Genesee Dancers, and Country Twirlers. People recognized Leslie for his singing voice.

Around 1967, Bruce Shaw and the Little Squares made an appearance on Miss Rita's Romper Room for a demonstration. Bruce did a hash call, and a singing call, and Leslie did a singing call. This was done consecutivly for two years around Christmas time. He was then thirteen.


