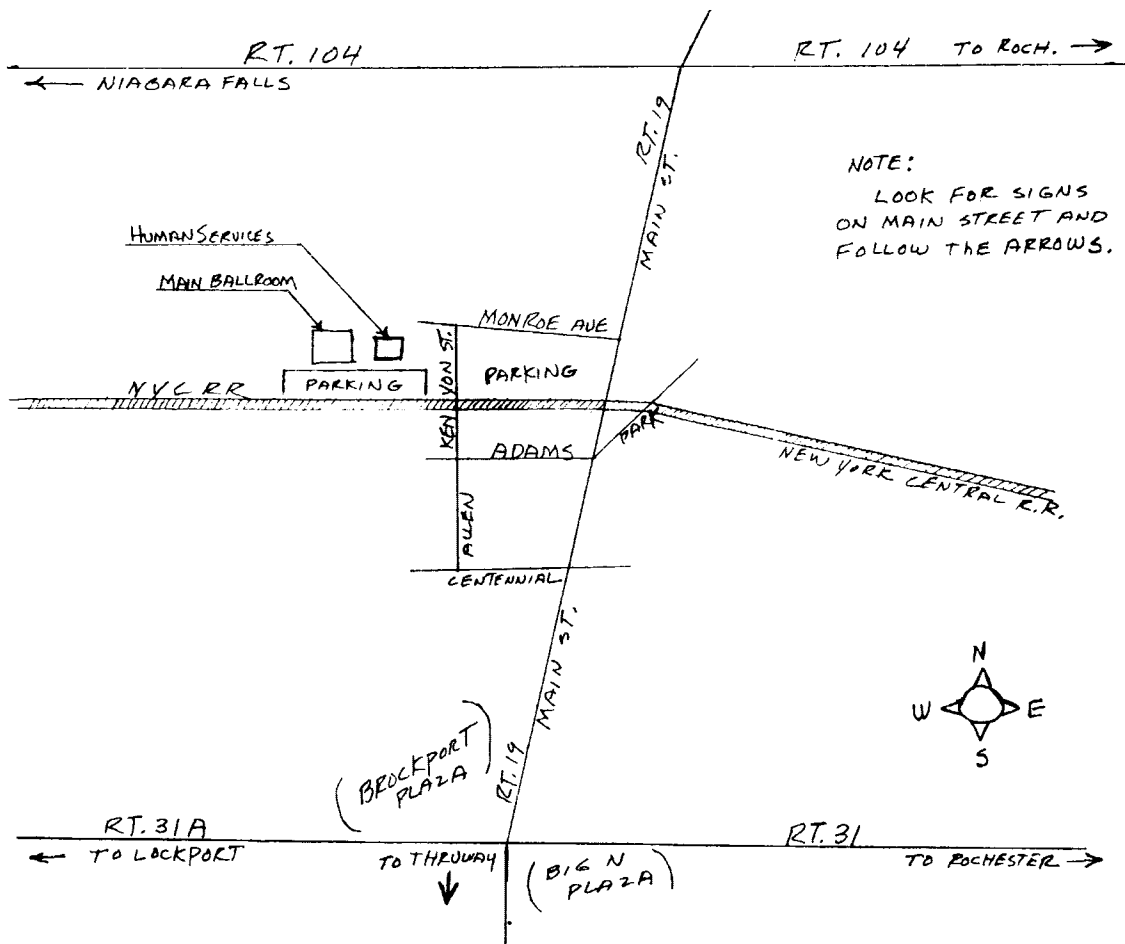

Callers Co-Op

HOW-TO-CORNER: A call with DIXIE in its name starts from two tandem couples facing ("Tandem" couple means with one partner behind the other in Indian file), and begins with the inside two dancers taking right hands to Pull By. What happens next depends on which one of several DIXIE movements is called.

The basic call of the series is DIXIE CHAIN; the insides Pull By with the right hand, everybody Pull By with the left, and then the two in the middle Pull By with the right, to leave everyone facing out. The next variation is DIXIE GRAND, which means that the insides Pull By with the right, everybody Pulls By with the left, and then the outsides face each other and all eight Pull By with the right hand. This usually ends with everybody facing their corner, ready for an Allemande. To do a DIXIE DAISY, the centers Pull By and do a Left Turn Thru with the outside two, after which the centers Pull By again while the outsides remain facing out. The most familiar in the DIXIE series of calls is probably DIXIE STYLE TO A WAVE. For this one the inside two Pull By and give a left hand to the outsides, and then everybody turns just one-quarter to the left, to end up in a left-handed Ocean Wave.

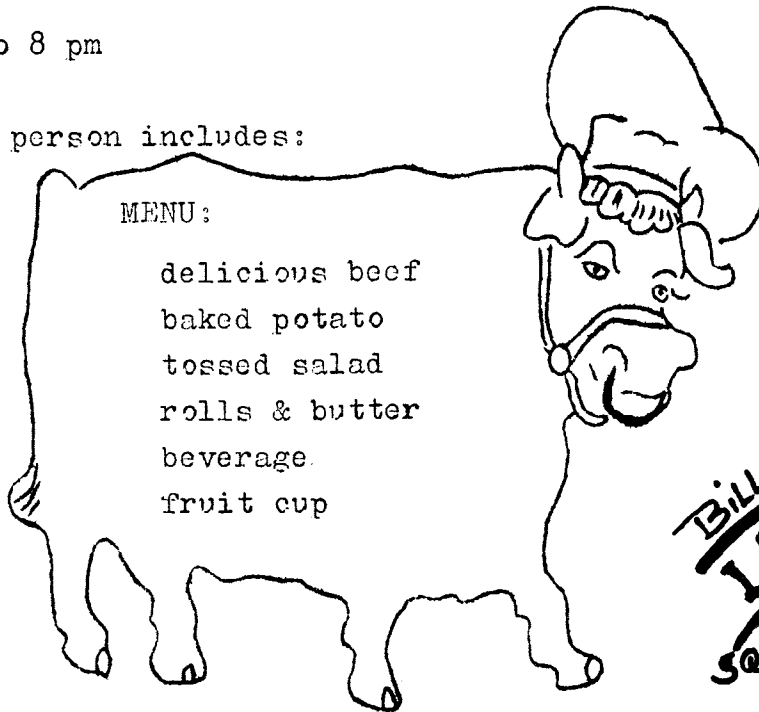

GLASS SLIPPERS

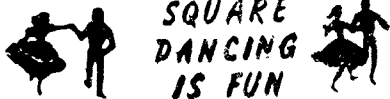

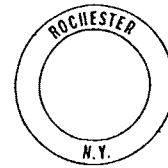

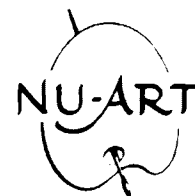
