

Callers Co-Op

HOW-TO CORNER: Perhaps you have already met this month's call under the name of "Half-Tag, Trade, and Roll."
This is a combination of three basic calls: Half-Tag the line (which we looked at last October), then
Neighbors Trade, followed by AND ROLL. We have done
things like "Men Roll Back and Promenade the Next" or
"Ladies Roll Out and Take a Backtrack", but AND ROLL is an "add-on" call that has a special meaning of its own.
It must be used after a call that finishes with some
kind of turning motion. AND ROLL means that each
dancer, individually and in place, makes a quarter turn
in the same body-turning direction as in the preceding
call. For instance, "Right & Left Thru AND ROLL" ends
with a left face after the courtesy turn, but "Flutter
Wheel AND ROLL" finishes with a right face.




Wayne Westerners
