## 1975 FEDERATION REPORT TO THE DANCE COMMUNITY

Following is a brief summary of this year's activities within the Federation:

## "Promenader"

The 1975 Editors, Marve and Kay Falls, report that the Federation's publication has an ample treasury. There are three more issues to be published within this budget.
Current circulation is approximately 1100 copies per month. Editors for 1976 are Jack and Jean Henne key with new Co-editors - Jerry and Dotti Willer.

## Dance-O-Rama

The response and co-operation the DOR Committee, chaired by Bob and Jeannette Meager and Al and Marilyn Taffet, received from both the dancing and caller/cuer community was heartwarming. This year's dance was financially successful. Almost all clubs contributed. Those very few clubs who did not participate missed an opportunity to work and share the joys of a meaningful, beautiful Festival to culminate the dancing season. The new 1976 DOR Chairman, Frank and Norma Salvagio, were elected at the May Federation meeting. Suggestions for next year are most welcome.

## Insurance Committee

Member Larry Herendeen (Insurance adjustor) and Attorney Jim McCollum report that the policy offered by the N.Y. State Federation may not cover visitors to your club dances. They are working with an area insurance company to tailor-make a policy to fit our needs to be offered through the Federation next year. More information will be made known next fall. A minimum of 15 participating clubs is needed.

## Publicity Policy Planning Committee

This 15 member committee, spearheaded by Frank Salvagio, has met and done an outstanding job in recommending ways to better publicize modern style Western square and round dancing. A finialized report will be made available this summer.

## Banner Stealing Association

Participating and non-participating clubs were published in a recent issue of the "Promenader." The Fed. Corresponding Sec. has copies of the Assn. Rules and Regulations. The goal of the Assn. is to promote inter-club travel.

## Bicentennial

The Federation liaison is working with the Director of Bicentennial Activities. This office has endorsed our DOR and plans are being worked out. The Federation will participate in a public event, a Colonial Heritage Ball to be held September 20th. More information will be forthcoming.

## Annual Calendar of Special Dances

This area needs more co-operation. If special benefit dances, national caller dates are listed, everyone would benefit. If a club prefers to list only " N " and the date of a national caller, that would be of assistance. The Fed. Vice Pres. maintains this calendar, make contact! Date conflicts are everyone's loss.

## Monroe County Fair

Co-ordinators are Ken and Lil Boss (334-7904). Volunteer to demonstrate.

## Plaza Demonstrations

Long Ridge Plaza - co-ordinated by Ben and Sadie McGilvery (865-5942). Other plaza demonstrations arranged through individual clubs.

## Open House Dates and Class Schedules

Chuck Prister (266-1818) is co-ordinator. He needs more club response. Deadline, July 16th.

THE INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF SQUARE DANGE CALLERS
Five hundred and sixty-five callers and wives or spouses attended the Second Annual Square Dance Callers Convention, sponsored by Callerlab, at the Marriott Hotel in Chicago, March 24-26.

Following a theme of "Time for Action", the callers, both "local" and "nationally-known" callers, held discussions, heard speakers, and developed statements on some of the important issues of great concers to the square dance "world".

Perhaps the most significant project that reached its elimax and won approval as the result of this convention was the development of a new, updated list of 68 square dance basics, including "family" groups. This list does not replace the present well-established group of "75", but is meant to be supplemental for current, revisedorder, instructional use only. It is also strictiy experimental for a one-year period, and will be revised and updated at the next Callerlab convention in April 1976.
A "code of ethics" for callers was adopted. Some of the other subjects that were discussed during the three-day conclave were: Our Professional Organization; Callerlab, Past and Present; The Basics-Tools of Our Trade; Dance Standards: An Identification System; A Good Mixi International Exchange and many more.

It was announced that the convention will be held again at the Marriott in Chicago, April 12-14, 1976
