WHY THE INTEREST IN DANCE LEVEL?

We never quite know how to explain to the new graduates that they cannot really dance <u>anywhere</u> they choose as soon as they are out of class. We sometimes leave them with the impression that our own club is the only "true" kind of square dancing, and that the 'high level' clubs are somehow made for people who are ogres that enjoy punishing themselves and others with near impossible figures.

In fact, we all are on various rungs of a ladder with differing abilities and interests, and no one ever reaches the 'top'. Callers have to grapple with this when they come into a strange hall, and with the first tip, try to determine what the abilities of the dancers are by observing whether certain calls tend to break down the sets. A good caller can find the club's level and call a dance that is challenging, but not too much so.

A good caller and dance often make you feel that you can "Do it all." I have vivid recollections of my first encounter with Hot Hash. I was certain that I could do it -- after all, it sounded like the same calls I knew how to do. It was a humbling experience....fortunately the others in the set were understanding, as we spent a lot of time waiting for the next 'allemande left'!

But how do you know when you're ready until you've tried it? You don't.....but there should be a way to make the experience a lot less traumatic. The other side of the coin is that the advanced level dancer should be allowed to enjoy his kind of dancing. If the square breaks down each time a tough call comes along, he never gets a chance to really "do his stuff" and this can be equally traumatic.

We have Fun Level, Club Level, Mainstream, Mainstream Plus, Advanced, Experimental, Challenge, and a lot of in-betweens. We need a yardstick to measure our vocabulary (the calls we know) and a way to know what clubs (or dances or halls) are at our "comfort" level, which are just above but attainable, and which are embarassingly beyond us.

It is up to the individual clubs to let the world and their dancers know what kind of dancing they feature and how it compares with that of other clubs. There is no place for belittleing other dance levels, whether more basic or more advanced than our own. Instead we must help each dancer to find his 'comfort' level and most important, keep them dancing! If we help each other, all square dancing will benefit.



AN OPEN LETTER TO ALL HOCHESTER AREA SQUARE DANCERS

WE ARE DEEPLY CONCERNED:

-about the number of new class graduates who will not be back dancing this season because they are afraid and discouraged.

-about the number of 2-5 yr. dancers who are giving up square dancing because they are "sick of workshopping themselves to death".

-about the whole square dance picture in the Rochester Area that cannot afford to lose as many dancers as it has been losing each year and still continue to grow.

LET'S FACE THE FACTS.

we are all very lucky to live in a populous area where many levels of dancing are offered. We, as seasoned square dancers, can almost choose the level that we are comfortable (or challenged) with and find it in this area.

But the person who is really suffering is the new class graduate who is just trying to gain confidence at what he or she has learned through class. There are also people who love to dance but because of some personal or family situation, whether it be finances, job situation or what have you, cannot dance even once a week. Why shouldn't there be a place for these people to dance and have fun?

WHAT ARE WE DOING ABOUT IT?


Non-Federation Notes

EXPERIMENTAL WORKSHOP with Jerry Carmen. Dance the latest calls. Sundays Nov. 7 and Dec. 5. 7:30 - 10 p.m. at the Hamlin VFW, Rte. 19, Hamlin, N.Y.


