## TWO DIFFERENT DANCES

The Muscular Dystrophy Dance and the Dance-0-Rama are coming. For years these events have been highlights of the dancing year. They come only a couple of weeks apart, but there are broad and interesting differences in their make-up. For instance:

## PURPOSF

The Muscular Dystrophy Dance is intended to raise money, as much as possible, to be contributed to the fight against the disease. It was one of the earliest and remains the most. successful benefit effort by square dancers in this area,

The Dance-o-Rama is intended to present a broad pot-pourri of round and square dance levels, styles, workshops, and callers. It serves as a "coming out" party for new graduates and gives them a good look at the broad spectrum of dancing, and the multitude of friendly dancers that await them. It is essentially "non-profit" in structure.

## FEATURES <br> $\qquad$

The most outstanding single feature of the Muscular Dystrophy Dance is the extent to which the theme is carried out in decorations and costumes. For one night, the ChurchvilleChili High School is transformed into a wonderland with such props as a working carousel; a giant spacecraft; a. 20 foot tall elephant; real harem girls, and many other unbelieveable works of art so attractive it seems cruel when the dancing and the fantasy have ended, and it's clean-up time.

The Dance-0-Rama offers diversity: the opportunity to dance to 5 National Callers, National Round Dance Cuers, and our excellent local callers and cuers, all in one day! Whether beginner or veteran, round dancer or folk dancer, there's enough of your favorite activity to keep you happy all day.

## ORGANIZATION \& SUPPORT -----

The Muscular Dystrophy Dance is organized by a core of dedicated volunteers, many of whom have worked on this event for a number of years. Some of the committee members are not even square dancers, but all share a common interest in fighting Fuscular Dystrophy. The central figures in the committee are George \& Una Shaw, whose knowledge of this dreaded disease has been a personal one. They all work very hard and deserve our help and support.

The Dance-0-Rama is one of the functions sponsored by the Rochester Area Federation. Each year a new Dance-0-Rama Comittee is formed, with representatives of the various member slubs as coordinators. Each member club is assigned a specific part of the effort, with volunteers within the club getting the work done. In this way, the area square dance clubs collectively organize and staff the Dance-0-Rama each year. If you are asked to help out, don't be bashful.

Support both of these functions -- be sure your new dancers (and old, for that matter) understand that these are truly "special" occasions, each for its own distinctive reason. Each is guaranteed to satisfy, with all the dancing you could want -- See you there ! ! !




It's time again for us to begin looking around for new staff members to work on the PROMENADER, beginning in September. It requires long hours of work, but is tremendously rewarding. We"ve heard it said that each year"s issues have a different "personality" as each editors put a little of themselves into the paper.

Here's how the "system" works, for those who are interested:

Helping with the Promenader is normally a two year committment----the first year is as subscription editors, , With responsibility for aubscriptions and mailing, address changes, etc. This phase of the operation takes about 8 to 12 hours a month.

Soo000, I am taking this opportunity to help the new dancers by putting down a few important tips on the dress and etiquette for square dancers.

## Men's Dress

5. Don't goof up a set unless you know what you are doing.
6. Don't imitate the caller; he is supposed to stand still.
7. Don't star thru with your left foot.
8. Don't whistle for your corner if he or she is out of position.
9. Don't walk out of a set, unless the other three couples leave you standing alone.
10. Don't talk during a dance unless you can hear what you are saying. That way you won't offend anyone else. If you follow these rules, you won't go wrong more than once, I think.

To the new dancers: Don't believe all you hear about me. Nobody, but nobody, could dance that lou-say, (lou-say.. ...a French word meaning "it's better to pay, than to dance with hin")

# Important Information for All Square Dancers!! 

NEW YORK STATE SALES TAX<br>and the<br>SQUARE AND ROUND DANCE CLUBS<br>1971 to 1977

In August, 1971 the news was released that Ashton Elliott, president of Shufflin Shoes Square Dance Club and Norman Brocious, president of Shirts and Skirts Square Dance Club were liable for $\$ 4.911 .00$ and $\$ 1,445.25$ respectively for sales tax that should have been paid and collected on the admission charge at club dances for the period from August 1, 1965 to May 31; 1971,

Since there was no state wide organization at that time, a "Square Dance Legal Fund" was established under the supervision of a three man committee to deal with the issue. Through the generosity of callers, cuers, and dancers, $\$ 4,921.01$ was raised to pay necessary legal expenses of the Square Dance Glubs in fighting the lawsuit, The Callers Cooperative of Rochester held their first Fall Fun Fest in November 1971 and donated $\$ 557.50$ to the legal fund. Vaughn Parish, a caller from Boulder, Colorado, carried a pigey bank with him across the country so dancers everywhere could donate to our legal fund. Dancers from New York state and Michigan sent contributions.

Tax attorneys were paid a retainer of $\$ 2,000$ to represent us at the many meetings with the State Tax Comission between 1971 and 1976. As a result of letters written by square dancers, New York State Senator James Powers and Assemblyman George Steinfeldt had a bill passed through the State Senate and Assembly to make square dance clubs tax exempt. However the bill was vetoed by Governor Rockefeller and no further action was taken in the legislature.

Finally, on August 13, 1976, the State Tax Commission published a "Notice of Determination" in which they said the American Square Dances and the Round Dancing portion of the activity was an "Instructional Activity" and not subject to sales tax. Those of us who had followed this over the past five years were pleased that clubs were finally tax exempt. However, one very important thing to remember is that the club exists for instructional purposes. At every dance (class and club) you learn something new. Flyers should refer to the charges made at the door as either instructional fee, tuition, or something of that nature. We suggest that you refrain from using the words "admission" or "donation".

On November 13,1976 a bill for $\$ 12,713.46$ was received from the lawyers for services rendered. After paying the $\$ 4,921.01$ we had, there is a balance due of $\$ 7,792.45$. Our new problem is how to raise the money to pay the balance due. Several things have and are being dones Mo Howard is having a tax dance on April 15 ; the Clintondale '76ers Square Dance Club of Clinton, Michigan have sent a check for $\$ 50$ because they feel this will benefit square dance clubs throughout the country, other clubs and dancers all over New York State have sent donations. If each couple would contribute the tax they would have paid on square dance admissions and dues since 1965, I am sure we would raise the money. Just think of it, if you attended just 10 dances a year during the past five years at $\$ 2.50$ per dance you would have paid $\$ 8.75$ in sales tax, even if you only attended 10 dances in the last year at $\$ 2.50$ a dance you would have paid $\$ 1.75$ in sales tax. Most of us do attend more than 10 dances.

Spin, Trede, and Turn
by Ted Wegener, Calif.
Starts with parallel ocean waves with girls on the ends. Turn $\frac{1}{2}$ by the right to put the men on the ends. The men will turn $\frac{2}{4}$ to face the girls. The girls turn by the left $3 / 4$ to form a new wave of girls. Then the center girls trade (like spin chain thru). All the girls will then step thru to be courtesy turned by the man facing them. Ends in facing lines.

## LEUKEMIA DANCE 1977 SATURDAY, JUNE 11 th

Here comes summer, and once more plans are under way for the Leukemia Dance. The last Leukemia Dance was held on our lawn, in July 1975, and the grand total raised to help Pediatric Leukemia Research was $\$ 2500$.

There was no Leukema Dance in 1976 due to the death of our son Jimmy, age 9, a victim of leukemia, who was very much a part of the first dance. However, another year has come, and children are stricken with Leukemia/Cancer daily, as cancer is the number 1 disease killer of children. Therefore, we must continue to fight.

This year the 1977 Leukemia Dance will be sponsored by the CURE CHILDHOOD GANCER ASSOCIATION. "Cure" is made up of parents and friends who have recently lost children due to Leukemia/Cancer, or who presently have a child under treatment. There are no administrative costs, as the time, talents, and energy needed are all donated by 1 ts members.

The dance will be held Saturday, June 11 th, at Burger Jr. High School: W. Henrietta, NY. (Turn at Cartwright Inn.) This is to assure that the rain will keep off our heads. (Those of you who attended the last dance will know what we meanl) The hours are from 2-10 p.m. and tickets are available thru your clubs.

Dewey started to dance (traditional) in 1959 and went into traditional calling in 60 . He taught his first western class in 1961. (Most of them are still dancing.)

He was always interested in a little "Challenge" in dancing as well as calling, and he and George Jobbusch started one of the first

## Advanced Dancing News

This is the first of a new column on Advanced and Challenge Dancing. Its purpose is to inform local dancers about the opportunities in square dancing beyond club level, and to dispell myths which have arisen in regard to this type of dancing.

Advanced dancing has been gaining greatly in popularity the past few years all around the country, and to help couples know where they can feel comfortable dancing, the Challenge Callers are currently compiling lists of calls designating the calls for different Ievels; that is, Mainstrean, Mainsitream Plus, Mainstream Plus 2 (not out yet), Advanced, Basic Challenge, Extended Challenge, Advanced Challenge, and for those few really ambitious couples - Super Challenge!

Areas without qualified callers usually have dancers getting together dancing to specially prepared workshop tapes put out by the country's leading challenge callers.

Around the Rochester Area, there are now several opportunities to workshop beyond Club Level. In future articles, these will be discussed. Any questions about this may be directed to the writer of this article.

It is, frankly, not for everyone... but for those who have the time, interest, and ability to pursue it, Advanced and Challenge Dancing provide many, many hours of fascinating activity. Of those who do not choose to participate, we ask the mutual respect amd acceptance that characterize the square dance movement in general.

This year's Dance-0-Rama will provide five levels of dancing within the four square dance halls, plus two hours of Introduction to Advanced Level. It is to the dancers' advantage to seek out the hall where they may dance comfortably with dancers of similar ability. Dancers who have not workshopped for Advanced and Challenge Dancing should not try to dance in these halls. Spectators are always welcome and the dancers would be glad to explain this activity to anyone interested. More news on Advanced Dancing next month.
