High interest in learning about ADVANCED dancing was evidenced by the large crowds attending the Introduction to Advanced Dancing sessions at both Dance-O-Rama and the National Convention earlier this summer, and by the enthusiastic group attending the All Position Dancing series sponsored by two of Rochesters Advanced Dancing clubs during July and August.

The National Square-Dance magazine likewise reports a surge of interest in Advance dancing (as separate from Challenge dancing) that has resulted in many new clubs, festivals and weekends that are designated as Advanced...that is they specify that they were using the Callerlab list of Advanced Dancings Basic calls. Dancers who know this level of material enjoy dancing with each other and come from all parts of the country. At the National Convention in June, in Atlantic City, the Advanced room held couples from all over the U.S.A. (and some from Canada, Europe and the Orient who could dance successfully and with great enthusiasm to a different caller every 15 to 30 minutes.

Where do the new dancers come from? Rochester's population of Advanced dancers will be enlarged this fall when Mike Callahan's latest class of Shamrock Squares graduates in a few weeks, and when the Jack of Hearts begins a new series of classes in late September. Jerry Carmen will offer a new "Funshop" (workshop) later in the fall, as well as, a monthly All-Position-Dancing (APD) series...this APD is fun and challeging in and of itself, and it's excellent training for Advanced/Challenge dancing. Call 271-3258 for more information on any of these classes.

How do the three Rochester area Advanced Dancing <u>Clubs differ?</u> Although all three clubs are doing advanced material, they each handle it in a different way. Jerry's Funshop offers about half the advanced list of calls in a ten-week workshop, with emphasis on position dancing. This group then dances alternate Sunday evenings, in Batavia. The Shamrock Squares offer an extended series of classes, about twice a year, and covering the 60 or so basic figures of Advanced dancing. The club features the current experimental figures of square-dancing along with the advanced basics. Classes meet on Mondays and the club on Tuesdays. The Jack of Hearts, a member-run club with Ross Howell as caller, offers a series of classes covering the complete list of Advanced calls. Both the class and club meet on Wednesdays, with the club featuring live calling with Ross Howell one week and tape-dancing to other nationally known callers on alternate weeks. The emphasis is on practice and gaining expertise with a variety of callers and a gradual introduction of new, more advanced material.

Several of us have danced frequently at all three of these clubs and we enjoy the friendliness and skill of these dancers, as well as, the different format each club offers. So as you see, Advanced dancing is 'alive and well' -- and enjoying a slow and steady growth in the Rochester area.

<u>Next month</u> we'll have a description of Challenge dancing in this area.

At its last meeting the Callers Co-Op of Rochester voted to support CALLERLAB's program of dance identification. That program is not perfect nor is it final, but it is a start, and it will be in use with clubs all over the country.

Each club should seriously discuss how to identify its dances. Orlo Hoadley, Ed Butenhof, Bruce Shaw and Ben McGilvery, officers of CCR here answer questions that area dancers will probably be asking.

- Q: What's all this noise about Dance Identification? We all know that what we're doing is Modern Western Square Dancing, don't we?
- A: Sure we all know that. If you've been around for a while you also know that there are a lot of clubs in the area, and they don't all dance in the same way. If you're new at the game, this is a fact of life that you will learn one way or another. The general idea is to get this information to the new dancers before they have to learn the hard way, or perhaps even get discouraged by a few unpleasant experiences and drop away from square dancing entirely. Besides, even if experienced dancers learn about the programs of a few clubs, there are darned few who know what they might expect at <u>all</u> of the clubs.
- Q: So what is Dance Identification supposed to do?
- A: Dance Identification means that symbol put with each club's schedule in the Promenader every month will let prospective visitors know what kind of a dance to expect. This is helpful for both local dancers who would like to visit around and for out-of-town travelers who would like to find a congenial group to dance with.

CCR (continued)

- Q: You're going to get into an awful hassle when somebody tries to put ratings on all of the clubs.
- A: Nobody's going to put ratings on clubs, and nobody's going to try to say that one club dances "better" than another, whatever that might mean. What it amounts to is that the clubs themselves are asked to announce in print what kind of dancing they do, for the convenience of dancers who may be interested in visiting. Why should any club object to doing that?
- Q: What are these identifying symbols supposed to tell us?
- One of the ways that dances differ is in the vo-٨ı cabulary that the caller uses, or in other words, the number of calls that the dancers are familiar with. For instance, you know that if a club invites its class to a Christmas or Valentine party, the caller has to confine his calls to the ones that the class has already learned. For any dance, the number of calls the dancers are expected to know is only one factor. To give his dancers variety, one caller might teach them a large vocabulary of calls, and another might confine himself to fewer calls, but use them in many different ways: --with a man where a lady normally is, left-handed, from various different formations of the set, etc. This type of dancing is known as All-Position Dancing (APD). The calls are listed in a way suggested by Callerlab. which is a national organization of square-dance callers, founded in 1974. The movement towards Dance Identification is national, and not just a local pipe-dream.
- Q: Do you mean that the caller is not allowed to use anything but the listed calls?
- A: No. The caller will probably continue to do what most of them have been doing for years: use any calls that he chooses to. What it does mean is that the caller should expect that he will have to teach any call that is not on the list, and he should be able to expect that the dancers who come to that dance will be reasonably familiar with all of the calls that are on the list.
- Q: In other words, it's a way for the clubs to tell the inexperienced dancer to stay away if they can't hack it.
- A: Not at all. It's a way to help dancers to find dances that they can enjoy, whether what they want is to stretch themselves a little or spend an evening with material that they already know well. It can also help dancers to avoid the unpleasant experience of getting into a place where they are completely over their heads, or at least warn them in advance that it might happen. We have had both open and closed clubs in the Federation for years, and nobody wants to change that. Whether a club wishes to welcome everybody or restrict their admissions is still a matter for the clubs themselves to decide. As a matter of pure fact, most of the clubs in the Federation are restricted now. Even though they are supposedly "open", they expect that any visitor has been through a square-dance class, and anyone that hasn't \sim would have a pretty tough time of it.

- Q: Well, I don't go visiting and I don't go square dancing when I'm traveling out of town. So what good does this identification business do me? I already know what kind of dancing my club does.
- A: For one thing, you will be less likely to get visitors who will be unhappy, either because the dancing is too much for them, or because the caller isn't being fancy enough for them. For another thing, the identification will tell any visiting caller what kind of a dance you'd like to have him call. Besides, what have you got to lose? Why not try it for a while and see how it works?
- Q: Well, maybe. How is it supposed to work?
- A: When a club's dance schedule is sent to the Promenader, it would include for each dance a letter code to indicate what kind of dance it will be. These groupings are suggested by CALLERLAB and your caller can give you more details.
 - B = basic The first 38 basic calls, which most classes will have learned by Christmas time.
 EB = extended basic - The first 5th basic calls.
 - EB = extended basic The first 5th basic calls, about where a class would be by Valentine's Day
 - M = mainstream The 68 basics that a class will normally learn plus the 10 additional calls labeled "Mainstream Experimental" --some of which may eventually become Mainstream basics.
 - M1 = mainstream plus 1 includes 12 additional calls
 - M2 = mainstream plus 2 adds yet another 12 calls.




A = advanced CB = basic challenge C = challenge each involves yet more calls which dancers will be expected to know. These lists will be changed from year to year as new calls are added and others dropped.

Q: How do we know which identification to use?

A: Again, discuss it with your caller. He or she will have the CALLERLAB lists. Decide what your club enjoys doing--this isn't a competitive activity, it's an enjoyable, relaxing one. Do your own thing, and tell others what that is, so they can join you if it's their thing too.


