## SQUARE DANCE CONVENTION

The Country Dancers of Rochester and members of many western square dance clubs had fun doing traditional country dances together in the Contra hall at this year's Dance-0-Rama.

The featured guest caller this year was Ted Sannella, a well known country dance leader from the Boston area and creator of "Ted's Triplets" - a series of dances done" by three couples in what appear to be short contra lines.

To date Ted has created 25 Ted's Triplets, none of which has a name. A better composer of dances than of names of dances. Ted has given each of triplets a number - "Ted's Triplet Number Four," for example.

Although the triplets are recent creations they are very much within the realm of traditional country dancing. They are made up of very few basic figures or "calls" - perhaps a dozen or so. Like all traditional country dances, they are composed to match the phrasing of the music to which they are danced. The music and dance figures which Ted uses are based heavily on early American and English traditions. The dances require relatively little reliance on a caller, for patterns are simple, and the figures of each dance are pre-determined (as is true of round dancing.) Although each dance is usually "walked through" and then prompted for the sake of those who have not yet learned the pattern. The leader can stop prompting once the group seems to know what it's doing. The joy of Ted's Triplets and other forms of traditional country dancing comes not from the caller's element of surprise, but rather from moving gracefully in patterns which match the phreses of the music exactiy, from listening to the beauty of the music itself, and (of course) from enjoying the company of the other dancers.

At this year's Dance-O-Rama local callers Ed Butenhof and Rich Castner joined Ted Sannella in leading dancers in the Contra hall. For part of the day dancing was done to live music played by the BLACKTHORN CEILIDH BAND. Special thanks are in order to these people and to Barb Butenhof who made the arrangements for the Contra hall

The Country Dancers of Rochester is quite different from the other clubs which belong to the Federation, primarily because we don't do westem square dancing. Instead, we do traditional and modern contra dances; traditional or "eastern" squares; English country dances (some of which date back to 1650); and occasionallỳ a polka or waltz.

The public are always welcome at $C D R$ dances. No classes are necessary, for most of the dances on any particular evening are "walked through," and the experienced contra dancers help out the newcomers.

It is the custom of our club to wear casual, comfortable clothes. Few people come in western square dance attire. A number of people wear colonial or other costumes, particularly for special parties.

CDR will continue to meet throughout the summer, every Thursday evening from 8:00 to 11:00 PM at St. Thomas's Episcopal Church (Highland Avenue at Winton Road).

Coming spectal events include a picnic nd dance in Mendon Ponds Park with Ed Butenhof calling (July 6th) and an evening later in July when David Valentine will teach some Irish country dances as well as our usual program of contras and squares. See the schedule in this Promenader for details.

For additional information, call 244-1375 or 271-4617.

Cortras，traditioral squares and＂basic＂or＂extended basic＂groups represert an important part of the total square dance activity．They are important for many reasons antong which are the following：
a）They require a knowledge of only a limited number of basics and are therefore more easily learned（or relearned after an absence）．
b）They are part of our dance history－our ties with the past．
c）They don＇t involve intense mental effort and people tend to laugh and relate more to others when they can relax．
d）Contras are especially well phrased to the music－similar to round dancing．They help dancers recognize phrases and appeal strongly to experienced dancers who feel pleasure from dancing with the music．

Obviously people dance for many different reasons and seek different satisfections．When you add round dancing，mainstream，advanced and challenge to the above，you have an enormous range of ways to enjoy yourself within the square dance activity．

What we need are more groups which dance at easy levels and therefore more places to dance for those who want more relaxed dancing or who just want to dance＂orce in a while．＂Who krows，perhaps we can keep many of our dropouts dancing somewhere if we offer enough variety．
