On the ski slopes, the trails are marked Beginner, Intermediate and Advanced so people can be comfortable and enjoy themselves.


Square dancing is fun! Right! Levels of dancing can, in my opinion, make our activity more enjoyable. People enjoy and respond favorably to success, not frustration. Most people are concerned about our drop outs in square dancing. If we level our dances and the club and caller follow the lists for that level, we should have happier members.

The <u>dances</u>, not the club, are labeled. A club could have one dance at Mainstream Plus II (Plus 2), a second dance at Mainstream Plus Quarterly Selections (QS) and a third dance at Mainstream (MS).

Here are the levels and abbreviations recommended by CallerLab. B-Basic program 1-38; EB-Extended Basics program 1-54; MS-Mainstream program 1-69; QS-Quarterly Selections (formerly experimentals); Plus I (12 more calls); Plus II (12 more calls); A1-Advanced Dancing Part I; A2-Advanced Dancing Part II; C1-Basic challenge calls and C2-Extended Basic Challenge calls.

Not all clubs choose to label their dances. When a dance is labeled, please use the abbreviations in the intrest of standardization. If you haven't tried labels, perhaps if you try it, you'll like it!


Singing Squares



Contra Corner

by Ed Butenhof

"I can't do contras, I've never taken lessons!" Many square dancers seem to feel they can't do something new unless they've had formal lessons. After all, we had to take lessons to square dance, didn't we?

Actually, the necessity for lessons in square dancing is a relatively recent thing. When your parents learned to square dance, they were able to do so by being fourth couple and watching what others did. In New England, people still learn contras by jumping in and following along. Hands beckon, voices call, and while confusing at first, all becomes clear quickly.

The difference is that traditional squares and contras do not require memorization of long lists of "basics". Most of the calling is directional. The challenge is to adjust your movements so that they flow smoothly with the music rather than to react properly when the caller says "reverse the canopener" or some such.

Actually, there's a rather short list of "basics" used in contras, most of which you already know: chain, right and left through, dosado, promenade, circle, star, cast off, swing, balance, forward and back, contra corners, and hey for three. In addition you need to learn who's active and who's inactive, and which direction is up (or above) and which is down (or below). Doesn't sound to fearsome, does it?

The biggest problem faced by most square dancers in learning contras is to slow down and stop rushing the calls, to relax and enjoy moving with the music. They must learn that the caller is not going to trick them with something unexpected, but is merely helping them by reminding them of the sequence.

There's no need to come every week, either. If you're away for 3 or 4 months, the rules won't change. No new "basics" will have been added while you weren't looking.

Come and join the fun. Contras are addictive but they're good for your dancing fun.


