LOU & PAT BARBEE

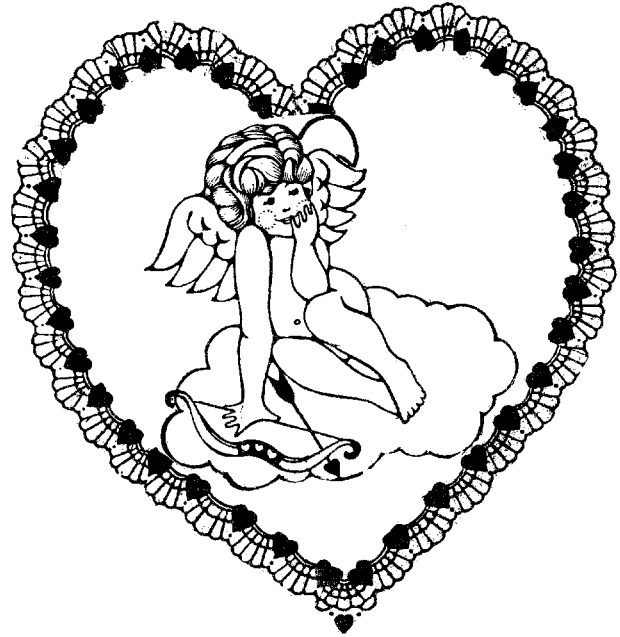
