COURTESY IN SQUARE DANCING - WHAT'S hAPPENING TO IT? By Jerry Carmen
(NOTE - This is the second of a two part series. Part I The Problem, was in the March Issue of the "Promenader". Part II - Solving the Problem)

Who's to Blame?
After thinking this over, your first impulse will probably be to ask who's the blame for this-- the callers or the dancers? It's a natural human instinct to want to place the blame on someone other than yourself, so probably the callers will say; the dancers, for not practicing it adquately, and the dancers - the callers for not teaching it adquately in the first place!

It's my personal belief that callers and dancers (club leaders especially) should he working together as a team. Without COOPERATION and COMMUNICATION the team falls apart and very important things such as courtesy and consideration for your fellow human beings can get lost in the resulting confusion. Discontent and suspicion arise and the group is not pulling together. That's where our troubles begin. Therefore, perhaps we are all to blame in some way. Callers Can Help

We callers can help by remembering that many of these attitudes are formed in class. Callers are not just developing people that square dance, but are really developing people to work together and help each other. Square dancing is never fun when you're on your own.

Jim Mayo, a nationally known caller and member of the CALLER LAB Board of Directors says it very well in an American Square Dance article he wrote in 1977... "If people were prepared adequately, the frustration and the dropout rate could be reduced...We must find some way to keep from making enemies of 50 percent of the people we recruit into our classes. Those who drop out of square dancing out of frustration do not just go back to their TV's. They also tell their friends about their experiences and this makes our recruiting job much more difficult."

If our caller-teachers do an adequate job of emphasizing and re-emphasizing proper square dance etiquette, perhaps it will stick. Most things cannot be said or done just once and remembered. Club Leaders Can Help

If our club leaders and dancers practice good etiquette, keep an eye on the guest, the shy couple and the one who's trying but not quite making it, and make certain the breach of etiquette in the club will not be tolerated, we will have clubs with larger class retentions, more guests and more regular-attending members.

Square dance etiquette is essentially no different than any other form of etiquette. It is a set of observarces designed to show consideration and respect for all others present -- or, in its condensed form, the practice of the Golden Rule. The following examples are by no means a complete list, but should be familiar:

1. APPLAUD at the end of a tip. This signifies you enjoyed the dance and creates a happier atmosphere.
2. NEVER walk by a square that needs a couple to fill it. Likewise, NEVER walk out of a square after you enter it.
3. DON'T form cliques.
4. SQUARE UP as soon as the music goes on.
5. SMLLE, and forget the cares and worries of the day. Your expression goes a long way in helping others relax.
6. GIVE an encouraging word.
7. HELP discourage parasites who prey on our activity for ego satisfaction -- contributing nothing but division and dissention in their selfish search to gain a feeling of importance.
8. DON'T talk while the caller is instructing.
9. LOYALTY to your teacher, club and friends earmarks you as a person of character and wins for you the respect of others.
10. REST if you must, but be willing to fill in a square if "one more" is needed.
11. THANK the other dancers in your square at the end of a tip.
12. WEAR appropriate square dance attire.
13. INVITE guests into your square.

Please do not take the incidents I have presented as typical of what is happening in our activity. These incidents, to be sure, are infrequent and I am certain the majority of square dancers are wonderful, considerate people. But the problem is big enough that we should all be concerened. It has taken decades for us to shake off the "barn dance and liquor" image. Let's hope we do not have an "exclusive-experts only need apply" image to overccme in the future.

At the next dance we attend, let's all look for someone who looks lost or out of place and make an extra effort to make them feel welcome.

Live music makes all the difference when participating in country dances. When Country Dancers of Rochester was organized in the summer of 176 , the only live music in the area was performed by the Blackthorn Ceilidh band. We did use several blue grass groups from time to time but on these evenings we featured southern styled squares. Skip Evans has been our booking "agent" since the beginning (and plays a real mean piano \& penny whistle as well as being able to dance up a storm). He has encourage other musicians in the area to "try our kind of jig and reel type music". The result is that now we have three bands and a fourth on its way.

Our two main bands have been the Blackthorn group and the Irish Musicians Club (in particular, Marty 0 'Keef and Frank Murphy with Skip). TIPS FOR BETTER DANCING
By Ed Foote

Whenever possible, use forearm grips for turning movements, such as for the calls swing thru, spin the top, turn thru, etc. This will enable your turns to be made precisely and keep the square in good alignment.

If you are in an ocean wave with hands held and a swing thru is called, the initial half swing should be made by retaining the hand hold, but then go into a forearm grip for the next half swing.

At Swingin' Eights, we have a new and unique square dance call which no other club has even heard about. It originated at our March 3rd club dance. Bruce Shaw was calling when suddenly Curly "'rhe Stripper" Crane attachedhimself to the undergarment of one of the gals in his set (her name is being withheld to protect her innocence). She tried desperately to free herself from this tenacious male but in moments her puffy, fluffy black slip was ripped down and dangling around her legs and ankles. What it Means to Me to be a High-Level Dancer Eileen Howard

Now we're not hot-shot dancers, far from it, but for the past three years, we've been seriously interested in learining what we can about Advanced and Challenge dancing. We were fortunate to have had our classes in the Advanced Basics from that master caller, Ross Howell, who is acknowledged as one of the top challenge callers in the country. After those lessons, we danced weekly to Ross at the Jack of Hearts club and it was an increasing joy to be able to handle the figures with more and more ease. Ross' choreography is intriguing with its subtle maneuvers, smoothflowing patterns and use of one high-level call after another.

When the opportunity came to join a workshop group to do some "hasement sessions" with a c-1 teaching tape, we saw this a chance to get acquainted with the beginning challange level calls. Several times we had a live caller ( Fon Libby, Joe Uebelacker, Norm Poisson, Chuck Stichcomb) and that was a thrill:----To have a caller right there in the intimacy of our two-square basement setup. Neat!

Those sessions have been followed by another series of workshops using tapes of several national callers from some recent $\mathrm{C}-1$ dances they"vs held. This continues to hold our interest and our group works well togather; we've become good friends over the past year or so, as we've learned to handle the calls with more familiarity.

The most recent opportunity to further ourselves inthese reaches of square dancing is now before us. For this we can thank Ted Whitacre who is offering classes in the basics of challange dancing with the objective of giving us a thorough grounding in these seventy or so calls from many different positions. Such positioning is a speciality of Ted's, as we've experienced in dancing to him this past year at the advanced level. We no longer quake when we hear a coordinate or a motivate from an unusual setup---- as the square moves in a direction opposite from usual, we're beginning to say that this feels "normal" (when we make it that is!) that thrill of achievement is wonderful, isn't it!

One of the special advantages of learning highlevel dancing is the opportunity then afforded you to attend some very special weel:ends - of ten there is an entire hall devoted to each of several levels; (Advanced, C-1, C-2, for example) and you meet devotees from many other regions of the country. As the caller puts the floor through its paces, the universality of the square dance language becomes apparent, as does the value of using the prescribed lists of calls as published by Caller Lab. Everyone reacts together and the patterns flow smoothly. The joy of accomplishment is evident as the dancers applaud each other as well as the callər. When you get in a hall that proves to be over your level, you find yourself squaring-up a lot; this is disappointing but sorehow challenging as well. It feeds the determination to learn more so that all will go will go well next time.

One more thing to share with you about what it means to be a part of the Advanced \& Challenge movement. It' the feeling of comraderie you have with the crowd of dancers who fills at an event such as the National Square Dance Convention, and its the downright thrill you experience when you scan the best of callers chosen for the NationalChallenge Convention-names like Berry, Davis, Foote, Gulley, Hodson, Howell, Kopman, Libby, Poisson, and Preston-----.
and you realise that you've danced to all of them at one time or another during the past year or so! When you see ther they seem to recogonize you----well, no-not by rame. Not yet.
