Spring is here! Classes are graduating, and new dancers are entering the clubs. I'll always have a sentimental spot for the new dancers, for I can remember when I went thru class, I went thru class, I went thru class. Thru class three times? No, not really, but Art Harris, my teacher, said it seemed like it.

Soo, I am toking this opportunity to help the new dancers by putting down a few important tips on the dress and etiquette for square dancers.

## Men's Dress

1. Shoes - necessary, especially if you want to appear gracious in de-feet.
2. Belt - in most cases necessary to stop a disaster
3. Pants - absolutely necessary, if for no other reason but to cover your shorts.
4. Shirt - should have collar, cuffs, or both.
5. Hair - not necessary, but sideburns are, for balance

## Ladies' Dress

1. Dresses - are necessary, mini, maxi, many.
2. Petticoats - should only show at the bottom.
3. Belt - necessary to break up the contours.

5. Fancy Laces - not necessary on shoes without laces.
6. Anything else, true or false, should be hidden.

## Man or Lady

1. Wigs - I don't want to split hairs on this but if you do wear one, be careful on a "dive thru". saw one hanging from a guy's cuff link.

## Etiquette

1. Don't enter a set that already has four couples unless you intend to round dance.
2. Always put your best foot forward, if you have one.
3. Don't allemande left your left hand lady if she is right handed
4. Don't bow to your partner unless you are facing her or him.
5. Don't goof up a set unless you know what you are doing.
6. Don't imitate the caller; he is supposed to stand still.
7. Don't star thru with your left foot.
8. Don't whistle for your corner if he or she is out of position. $X$
9. Don't walk out of a set, unless the other three couples leave you standing alone.
10. Don't talk during a dance unless you can hear what you are saying. That way you won't offend anyone else.
If you follow these rules, you won't go wrong more than once, I think.

To the new dancers: Don't believe all you hear about me. Nobody, but nobody, could dance that lou-say. (lou-say...a French word meaning "it's better to pay, than to dance with him")

One of those other callers was Don Beck, the originator of "FERRIS WHEEL, PINGPONG CIRCULATE, etc." It was also there that he met his wife Betty, she becoming his favorite dance partner.

After earning a degree in Mechanical Engineering, Jerry came to Rochester with his new bride, Betty, to work for the Eastman Kodak Company.

## BECOME A BETTER DANCER

 By Jerry CarmenYou will have less chance of being confused if you know who your partner is in various formations in the square. Here's a glossary defining partners under most situations.

Your partner is:

## anyone you SWING

## anyone you PROMENADE

the person you meet after doing an ALLEMAND LEFT
the girl to the man's right as he is facing the center in a CIRCLE
anyone you start a DO PASO with
anyone you start a GRAND RIGHT and LEFT with
the one next to you in a SQUARED-UP SET
the other person on your half of a LINE
the person facing the same direction as you in an OCEAN WAVE
the person beside you when all the couples are stacked up such as after WHEFL AND DEAL or DOUBLE PASS THRU
Your partner is constantly changing as the square is in motion, so you must be aware wether you are in a line, wave, etc. Remember, you will have a better chance of identifying your partner by joining or touching hands with the people next to you immediately after completing a call to check the formation you are in. Also, by doing so, you may help someone next to you and save the square.

## TIPS FOR BETTER DANCING

If you become completely lost, do not turn around. This will make it difficult for someone behind you to help you recover. It is much easier to guide someone into place by guiding them from the back.

If you are lost, you should turn your head in all directions to see where you should go; and if someone says to turn around or you see that you should turn around, then do is. Otherwise, retain your facing direction and let someone guide you into place.

## 2 TIER SKIRT \& GATHERED SKIRT

The following article is from the Fall ' 78 Issue of the FLADA Flyer, (Newsletter for Western New York \& and The Niagara Frontier). Thank you Dave \& Dorothy Borchard, Editors, ( 316 Hedstrom Drive, Buffalo, New York 14226) for permission to reprint it.

The article was written by Linda Wheeler. Her husband Jim is President of FLADA (Frontier Leaders And Dancers Association). They live at 347 Rosedale Blvd, Eggertsville, New York 14226.

Who among us ever thinks she has enough square dance skirts or dresses? With a little patience and about 3 yards of material ( 4 for a dress) you can create a new wardrobe.


Choose one combination of tier lenghts for complated skirt length desired. ( $\frac{1}{2}$ Inch seam allowance throughout.) Cutting lengths for 7", 8", 9" bottom ruffle respectively.

Sew together the top tier pieces, then the bottom tier pieces leaving one seam open on each. Gather the bottom to fit the top with right sides together. Run gathering stitches thru 2 widths, break thread and start again-- thread is less apt to break if gathering is done in sections. (You will have 2 widths of the bottom tier gathering into each top tier width.) Sew side (or back) seam apply zipper, 7" for skirt. Gather top to fit waistband. Or gather to fit your favorite fitted bodice, then sew back seam and insert zipper, $18^{\prime \prime}$ or $22^{\prime \prime}$ for dress.

Hem: turn under $\frac{1}{4}$ " twice to enclose raw edge \& Stitch.

LUCKY LADY: -If you have a tucker attachment for your sewing machine, your time will be cut in half! With top tier under the presser foot and bottom tier feeding through the tucker (right sides together) you can gather and attach all in one step. Set your machine stitch legnth at $8 \frac{1}{2}$ or 9 stitches per inch, then set the tucker at 6 to make a tuck in every 6 th stitch. Don't fret if you get to the end and discover that top and bottom tiers did not come out exactly even. If it's fairly close, that's good enough, cut of I the extra.

I also like to use the tucker at the waistline for a very smooth gathered look. Set the machine at the longest possible stitch length --6 (maybe even 5); then set your tucker for 1 (a tuck in every stitch) and go slowly. Pin to bodice or waistband, and if t the skirt is a little too small to make ends meet, clip a stitch here and there to fit.

The bodice of any dress pattern can be used for a square dance dress. Be sure to allow for opening the back seam for zipper.

One more tip: If you are attaching the skirt to a bodice to make a dress, I have found that raising the waistline on the bodice by $\frac{1}{2}$ " to $3 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ works out well to alleviate the problem of 16 layers of patticoats, pettipants, panty hose, etc. all meeting in that one part of the anatomy that we like to keep looking slim.

You can make a plain gathered skirt out of 3 or 4 widths of material cut to the desired skirt length (allow an extra inch for $\frac{1}{2}$ " seam at top and bottom). To get bottom fullness without thickness at waist, make a series of pie shaped darts about $3^{\prime \prime}$ at the top and $8^{\prime \prime}$ deep with six inches between the darts. Cut out material from darts and then gather in sections. Attach to waistband for skirt or to bodice, as suggested above, for dress.

When you're in a set,

1. NEVER talk during a tip. It's just plain bad manners to interrupt another person - the caller. Talk with a smile only.
2. NEVER, NEVFR talk during a walk thru. The caller is attempting to assist someone. You don't have to listen if you don't want to, but do allow the other dancers to listen.
3. NEVER be "pushy" even though you know the call and the others don't. Better the set breaks down, than to offend someone by pushing! There's a vast diffference between guiding and pushing. If you are guiding a person properly, only you and the other person should be (only slightly) aware of it, NOT the whole set!
4. NEVER forget you're a square dancer!
