## BECOME A BETTER DANCER <br> by Jerry Carmen

Don't rush! Webstex defines dancing as moving with measured steps, regulated by music. Dancers who become aware of how many steps are required to complete a call and who walk to the beat of the music, get much more enjoyment out of the activity. As in all dancing, the caller should tell you what and the music should tell you when. A caller or dancer who does not allow sufficient time or steps to complete a call is "clipping". If the caller clips, the dancers may rush to catch up and the feeling of dancing is lost. If the dancer clips, a caller observing the dancers for his timing may clip also, and the result is a rat race. All callers are aware of the theory of timing - allowing a sufficient number of beats of music for the dancers to complete the call comfortably - but not all callers practice it. If a dancer knows he is moving to the music and is taking the proper number of steps to complete the call, he should REFUSE to be rushed, even if it means dropping behind. If enough dancers did this, it would force the dancers and callers who clip to slow down and dancing would be more comfortable for all.


## Caller Profile



Music and dancing have always been an important part of his life. The genesis of his musical career was as a child with training in both the violin and accordion. He first called traditional dances during his high school years.

Throughout the past sixteen years of square dancing and eight years of calling Ken has spent many happy hours working in all segements of the activity. A revision of the Mainstream program, a revision of the Quarterly selections List and a minor revision of the Plus I list. These are attached for your review.

The committee on Definitions has provided clarifications and some minor revisions to the definition of Continued next column

terms for the basics numbered 39 through 69 on the CALLERTAB list. These definitions will be distributed to all CALLERLAB members within a month. More important, however, is the vote taken on the Basic "RECYCLE". The membership of CALLERLAB voted by a large majority to keep "Recycle" as a NO-HANDS move. We would urge all callers and dancers to emphasize this during 1979-80 in order to give it a fair shake.

CALLERLAB also discussed the subject of Dance level identification. The result was that a resclution was passed which should help clarify what is recommended for all clubs and callers. The resolution provides guidance and yet affords sufficient latitude so that all clubs and callers can operate effectively within the wording. For your interest, the resolution follows:
"Be it resolved that CALLERLAB adopt a policy suggesting that members call movements within the advertised/designate plateau and use calls from any plateau other than that which was designated, and/or any unlisted experimental, only after walking or workshopping that call, and be it resolved that conducting a designated level workshop shall mean, workshopping the calls listed for that plateau."

While this reads "Members", GALJERLAB hopes that all callers, clubs and festivals will follow the spirit of this resolution and make it easier for dancers to know if they are attending the correct dance for their particular comfort, confidence and skill level. It does not brand anyone (club or caller) as a particular type of person, but rather indicates what the calls for that program will include. When everyone follows this guidance, the callers will be able to program better and thus inprove the injoyment of all dancers.

We would like to remind all callers that CALLERLAB is conducting the Callers' Seminar at the National SquareDance Convention in Milwaukee on June 28, $29 \& 30,1979$. There will be two sessions daily and the staff includes several of the outstanding trainers with in the calling (28 )profession. There is no charge for this seminar.
