The years have proved that by far the most class recruits come because an enthusiastic member of the club gave them a good pitch, and persuaded them at least to come to a free Open House dance and give it a try. The demonstrations, at the Fair, at shopping plazas, at church parties, anywhere else you can get in, are well worth while, but their value lies in exposing a lot of people to square dancing, so they at least know a little something about it when they are invited to your Open House.

In other words, if anything gets done, it is because some person or persons do it. And if we continue to have a Dance-O-Rama each spring it will be because a number of people are willing to take care of all the planning and the detailed jobs that are needed to make Dance-O-Rama go.



BECOME A BETTER DANCER

CALLERLAB (the international association of callers) has helped greatly in standardizing dance levels. Dance level identification has its greatest value at special dances and festivals where general square dance public is invited. It tells callers and dancers which calls may be used in a particular hall or tip. For reference, dancers should obtain a list which indicates the various levels and the calls associated with them. This is published periodically in the PROMENADER or can sometimes be gotten from your club caller on request.

CALLERLAB says that all callers should not use calls outside the advertised level without first workshopping or a walk-thru. As a dancer, you have a right to complain to the caller and the organizers if this is not done. Some have suggested if you are sufficiently dissatisfied, to ask for your money back and leave.

As a dancer, you also have the responsibility of being able to dance the advertised level. You should not attend a dance where you do not know most of the calls associated with the level. It is unfair to expect other dancers to pull you through. You might break down squares consistently and frustrate other dancers who want to get through the tip. An exception to this is if you attend with a square of your friends who will dance with you no matter what the results.

You can determine which level you dance by examining a list and noting which level you know the most calls. If there are only a few calls you don't know, ask your caller if he will workshop them, or at least walk you through between tips. Most callers will be very glad you asked. If you wish to learn all the calls in the next level, look for clubs or callers advertising workshops at that level.

Above all, please remember that "higher level" does not mean "better dancer". A good dancer at any level smiles often, is friendly, and executes the calls he has learned smoothly, confidently, and to the music.



LEGACY SELECTS NEW LEADERSHIP

During LEGACY IV held May 10-13, 1979, in Louisville Kentucky, the trustees of Legacy selected a new group to guide the organization during the years ahead. Chosen to serve in the capacity of Executive Secretary were Dick and Jan Brown of Bellevue, Nebraska. The Brown are succeeding Stan and Cathie Burdick who had held the position of Executive Secretary since 1975. Prior to that time LEGACY operated under the guidance of it's creators: Charlie and Bertha Baldwin, Stan and Cathie Brudick and Bob and Becky Osgood.

LEGACY was conceived by these three couples, all editors of prominent square dance publications, in 1972. Their goal was to form a service-leadership organization for the purpose of developing better cummunications among the many facets of the square dance activity. This has resulted in the scheduling of bi-annual meetings of square dance leaders for the purpose of exchanging ideas, dicussing problems and providing possible solutions. Since the first LEGACY gathering in 1973 through the present time there have now been four of these "think tank" sessions. LEGACY is a leadership resources center attempting to establish a public trust for the continued development of American Square Dancing.

LEGACY IV HIGHLIGHTS

The fourth bi-annual meeting of LEGACY Trustees was held in Louisville, Kentucky, May 10 through 13, 1979. This gathering attracted 212 Trustees from 35 States, one Canadian Province and two European countries thus living up the the LEGACY motto: "International Assembly of 'Trustees' of the Square Dance Activity."

Beginning with the Thursday evening dinner through the Sunday morning resolution session there was continuous activity ranging from light-hearted fun and games through detailed discussion meetings. The selected topics for discussion during LEGACY IV were the three "E s" - Education, Ethics and Economics.

Each of these subjects were evaluated in respect to their effect, both positive and negative, on the entire square dance activity. During the various discussion group sessions, designed to allow all Trustees to pursue each topic as it relates to their specific segment of the dance activity, everyone was afforded the opportunity to openly express themselves.

Among the highlights of the discussion on ethics was the fact that there is a need to deseminate to the local level the knowledge that Callerlab has a grievance committee that may be utilized to resolve caller related problems.

During the examination of the effects of economics on square dancing there was a general realization that, unfortunately, there appears to be no way to escape the path of inflation. Only a simple warning to those instrumental in the operation of dance activities to review their fiscal policies and make adjustments where necessary could be issued by the Trustees of LEGACY IV.

The Third "E" was education. It was in this area

The Third "E" was education. It was in this area that there was expressed the greatest need for improvment. Through education many problems found in the activity could be resolved.

Other significant highlights included Bob Osgood's presentation of not one, but two Silver Spur awards during the Saturday evening banquet. Recipients of this prestigeous award were John and Freddie Kaltenthaler and Stan and Cathie Burdick. It was a very significant occasion for everyone in attendance.

All in all there is a lot of sitting, a lot of talking, and generally a lot of hard work that takes place during a LEGACY meeting. But every minute is extremely worthwhile.

The Enjoyment of this LEGACY gathering was greatly enhanced by the hospitality of the host organization under the leadership of Russ and Roberta Carty. Truly a worthwhile and enjoyable experience for everyone in attendance.

TIPS FOR BETTER DANCING By Ed Foote

Whenever you pass thru with someone, <u>always</u> pass right shoulders, never left shoulders. Only exception is from a left hand wave - there you will step straight ahead.

In crossing trails with someone, the person on the right will always cut in front of the person on the left, regardless of sex.

If you have executed a call and you are positive you have done it correctly, do not let someone who is unsure of the call make you change your position. Stand your ground and force that person to take the proper position. This will keep the square zoing:

If the caller calls a call you have never heard, do not give up and quit. In the vast majority of cases the caller will tell you how to do the call after he has said the name, especially if it is not one of the "basic 75".

Even if you have never heard a call, if it is not complicated, there is no reason for you not being able to do the call if the caller talks you thru it.

If your square breaks down, square back up and then have the head couples slide to the right and form normal facing lines of four with each girl to the right of a man. Now watch the other squares. Often the caller will get the squares back to facing lines a couple times before finally getting to a left allemande; when he does get them to facing lines, your square can now pick up the next call and you are dancing again.

You may wind up with your original partner.or corner, but you are dancing and that is the name of the game.

This will not work every time, as sometimes the caller does not bring people back to facing lines before a left allemande; but it works often enough to be worth doing. In fact, some callers will intentionally bring people back to facing lines in order to pick up those who have broken down early; if you do not accept this opportunity to get back dancing, you may have a long stand until the next left allemande.






