## BECOME A BETTTER DANCER <br> By Jerry Carmen

This month we're going to discuss something that has been said before, but needs to be said again. Part of our enjoyment in square dancing is to be able to dance as much of the tip as possible. We do not pay our money to stand around and watch others. Since the square we are in will probably break down one or several times during the evening, the name of the game is RECOVERY. One can tell good, experienced dancers because almost as soon as their square breaks down, they are back dancing again. The sooner the new dancer learns to recover, the greater will be his enjoyment, and the better he will be accepted among the older members. Here are some hints which you should remember:

1. DANCE WITH YOUR HANDS -- Try to join hands with the people beside you immediately after completing a call. By doing this you can know where your partner is and see whether you are in a line, wave, etc. You might also help to orient your neighbor who has lost his direction.
2. DON'T TURN AROUND when you axe lost. Walk slowly straight ahead or around the outside of the square. look around to see where everyone else is by moving your head, and extend your hands for help. Much shoving occurs because the lost person freezes and keeps his hands by his side leaving nothing for guiding except his back. By extending your hands, you will most likely be led rather than shoved into position.
If you miss part of a call, don't race through it trying to catch up. Instead, forget the part you missed and try to pick it up where everyone else is. If a person is not in position to do a call and you can't guide them, do the call as if they were there. Waiting for that person puts two more people behind and breaks the square down.
LEARN TO LISTEN TO THE CALIER when you hear a call you have forgotten or never heard of. Most of thr time the caller will tell you how to do the call after he has said the name.
If all the above fails and the square breaks down, everyone should immediately square up with a minimum of talking. Then, listen to the caller and watch other dancers. As soon as the other dancers are in ${ }^{-}$ lines of four, the head men should take their corners' hands and with that couple make a line of four. If, instend, you see the others in ocean waves with the men on the ends, the head couples should immediately turn to face corners and form right handed waves to continue dancing. You may not end up with original partners and in sequence, but at least you will not be standing! Some dancers can do this so smoothly that the caller may not realize they have broken down.
Ed Foote, in his "Tips for Better Dancing", says that the two primary reasons for squares breaking down are:
3. Failure to listen to or believe the caller.

Failure to take hands with adjacent dancers at the completion of every call to forim good lines or waves.
