

PRESIDENTS'

CORNER

The leadership Meeting sponsored by the Federation and the CCR on December 32 was very successful. The turnout was good, the discussion was lively, and the dinner and dance afterward were much enjoyed. Besides the topics discussed during the seminars, one of the big advantages of a meeting like this is the opportunity for people from various clubs in the Federation to get together, get acquainted, and compare notes.

One of the main discussion topics was the recruiting of new members for our beginners classes. There's another very important kind of recruiting, and that is recruiting from the members of our clubs the people who are needed to run all of the activities. Think for a moment of all of the things that must be done, for your clubs, your Federation, your Dance-O-Rama, and the PROMENADER that is edited, printed, and circulated for your benefit. There have to be people for the overall direction of the organizations, people to take care of the club arrangements with their classes, people to arrange for callers and see that there are places to dance, people to take care of the money that none of these organizations can run without, people to keep records and maintain communication within the group and between groups, people to serve on such committees as --- whatever their names might be in your club--; refreshment, greeting, house, decorations, membership, sympathy, special party committees, etc., etc.

A few years ago it wasn't too hard to find dancers, who were willing or even eager to accept the responsibilities of a management job for the sake of the prestige and personal satisfaction. There are rewards besides the compliments and thanks: becoming a part of a close-knit and smoothly-operating group (as we hope all of them are), the sense of accomplishment from accepting a job that needs to be done and carrying it out, the feeling of being one of a core of people that makes things happen (even if what happens is only that the group continues to run smoothly), and at least one fringe benifit, that you go to the head of the buffet line at parties.

Lately though it seems that attitudes have changed, and all too often the job of a nominating committee is mainly to beat the bushes for people who can be persuaded to take on the responsibilities of an office. There are a few familiar reasons for refusing. The most legitimate is probably "We have done our share; it is time for someone else to take over." Other good reasons are frail health or spending a large fraction of the year in another part of the country. We also hear "We can't because we have too many other activities," or "We belong to another club too, and they need us more because they are smaller." In my opinion, people who accept the benifits of membership in a club---Squaredance or any other type club---should also accept the idea that they are responsible for their fair share of the personal services that the club must have. The next time you are approached to take part, please ask yourself very seriously how good is your reason for saying

Perhaps part of the problem is that some of the jobs are too demanding. If so, it might be a good move to split up the duties and spread them around over more people. If things get too bad, I can suggest one ultimate solution: Blow the club treasury on one big final party, and then tell your caller "From now on, you're in charge. You run the club and we'll pay you to come and dance." As a matter of fact, there are quite a few caller-operated clubs around the country. But before you do that, you'd better check with your caller and find out if \underline{he} - or even more importantly, his wife wants to take on all these responsibilities that nobody else does.



And soooo the holidays and parties are over, and here I am trying to write my February column while fermenting sugar plums are still dancing a round in my head.

Well, what's going on now? Oh, I know, I read that there is still some Streaking going on. These are some of the bare facts.

Streaker crossed field at soccer game, they should have put a net over him. Stupid Streaker streaks thru Nudist colony, no body noticed him! Did you read about the troubled married couple who joined the Nudist colony to air there differences?

True story: Doralyn Hill, of Belles N' Beaus, was on a uptown bus, in front of Sibleys. Streaker came in the back door of the bus, ran thru and out the front door. The bus driver turned to Doralyn and asked her if she would be able to identify him. Doralyn said, "Sorry, I didn't see his face!"

I feel I must warn you that some of these "Streakers" may run thru your set one night. There are three things you can do if this happens.

First, you can close your eyes and have the rest of the set describe what they saw. You can depend on this because you probably will be the only one with your eyes closed.

Secondly, you can keep your eyes open and watch the expressions on the other dancers faces, also the interesting expressions on the "streakers" as they are going away.

Thirdly, you can join them! If you do this, do not, "streak" in your own set. You will just go around in sircles and won't be widely appreciated in the end. Also, your husband or wife, whichever, will try to stop you and will probably want to cover up your head. Socooc the best thing to do is to "streak" thru the other sets in a straigh' line, continue out the door and catch the Amtrak to Chicago. This way you won't be involved in no cover up.

Hope I haven't shook you up too much with my advice as I hate to dance in a nervous set. You never know what might happen with everybody up tight. The caller could call "Peel off" and wow!

You say it will never happen, well I'll tell you something that may happen. I may join them and streak thru the sets. If I do, you will be able to recognize me. P'll be the one with Jockey shorts on!

In lieu of a choice, the Committee suggests work by callers and dancers on trouble spots in the Mainstream plateau and on recent Quarterly Selections.

The following is one of the current QS. EXTEND (The tag) by Jimmy Davis

The present use of EXTEND THE TAG is best described as the ability to move from one ocean wave formation to another wave formation. All dancers in the ocean wave will step thru and form an ocean wave with the couples they are facing. If your extension leaves you facing out, then remain facing out... The action is most common from a wave between two couples as in the formation set up by having the Heads Pass The Ocean. It may also be used after a fractional Tag The Line figure to extend into a different formation.

BECOME A BETTER DANCER by Jerry Carmen

APD - those three letters seem to be a focus of controversy among callers and dancers today. If you are not familiar with these letters, they mean "All Position Dancing". On further investigation, I realize that the people who turn their noses up at the term really do not have an in-depth knowledge of the mechanics of modern square dancing. In simplified terms, APD means being able to execute a call from anywhere you might be in the square and end up in the proper formation facing the correct direction. Before CALLERLAB made the term APD popular, we used to refer to it as knowing your basics.

APD has always been with square dancing in some form. Some traditional contra dancers have RIGHT AND LEFT THRU executed with two boys facing two girls. I would say that everyone who square dances, dances some APD in a limited form. For example, if you can do two swing thrus (double!) in a row or if you can do a WHEEL AND DEAL from a line of two men next to two girl, you are dancing some APD.

Whether you realize it or not, some of the subtle challenges and fun come with the caller's ability to put a little variety into the same old stuff. I can think of the fun my square had years ago when the caller said, "Four girls forward and back, dos-a-dos to an ocean wave swing thru, etc." Then it was the men's turn! Those little things were the frosting on the cake for me and the part of what made the evening fun, interesting, and different from all the other evenings.

Yes, the caller, to be effective, must be an expert judge of the floor and be able to determine the dancers' ability to handle such variety in the basics. It can be very frustrating when your square constantly breaks down during the evening. If APD is introduced slowly and with love, a club caller can add fun and variety to the evening without teaching all those brand new calls that everyone forgets all too quickly anyways.

As a dancer, you owe it to yourself to learn how to do the simple basics such as Square Thru, Swing Thru, Circulate, etc. from your partner's position. By doing so, you will be more confident in your dancing, and increase your enjoyment and interest in the activity.



Caller Profile Mike Callahan

Mike started calling in 1960 when he was thirteen years old. In those early years of his calling career he was club caller for the Skirts 'n' Shirts, a teen club, and did a few guest calling dates for other teen groups as well as a few adult clubs in the Rochester area. While Mike was attending St. John Fisher College (1964-68) he began calling more and more for area clubs and started branching out to the Central N.Y. region as well as the Southern Tier.

Shortly after graduation from college, Mike started working for Lincoln First Banks, Inc. in the management training program. He was drafted into the U.S. army in 1968 and, after training in Oklahoma, he was sent to Germany for 18 months. There he did some occasional guest calling for the Soest Belles & Beaux in Soest, Germany.

After the service, Mike resumed his banking career and became an assistant branch manager for Lincoln First. He married his wife, Wanda in July, 1971. In 1974 he decided to leave the bank and devote full time to his calling.

At present, Mike calls for six clubs in the Rochester area, teaches one class and runs his own + 1 and 2 workshops as well as an advanced club. He has been booked for guest dates and festivals in 16 states and Canada. He also calls during the day under private contracts for different area senior citizen groups, school districts, and as a recreation consultant for the Office of the Aging. He has attended four Callers' Schools and is a member of Caller Lab, active on the Quarterly Movements committee.

singles, teens, -Stan Burdick's opinion that clubs, callers and angels, would compete for graduates, -clubs might not promote classes, -sticky problem to choose a caller-teacher, -methods of teaching vary, -regional class nights may not be acceptable to all, -no working regional classes as a precident.

The Classic Squares experience (reported on by Frank Salvagio) was: good attendance, worthwhile supplement to classes, dancers injoyed attending a fun level dance, exposed them to contras, reels, lines, and rounds, exposure to different callers and large group enthusiasm.

It was noted the slack in square dancing was a North and North East USA problem. Stan Burdick said the South and South West was booming. Buffalo area said doing well. (The Buffalo area and the South and South West have callre run clubs.)

Recuritment was the second topic discussed. Roger and Sally Baldwin of Boots and Slippers reported that their techniques included: a sign up list maintained throughout the year containing prospective class members, a personal invitation to class sent to people on this list, demonstrations flyers, and personal invite. Gerry Prister's suggestions: personal invitation by far the best and see it through, open dances with written material to be handed out, (small calling cards not so apt to be thrown out), hold class in convient location, friendliness, saturate the area with posters, use pictures for newspapers, recruit where you work, TV and radio spot announcements, establishment of a standing federation publicity committee to keep square dancing visible in community, hold party for class near graduation time for graduates to invite their friends and relatives to, demonstrate for entertainment, making newcomers groups in community and church aware of your presense.

Discussion followed each of these topics. Each square dancer is invited to please inform the federation of your views on these topics. Send them to Orlo Hoadly, 18 Kingsberry Drive, Rochester, New York 14626.

It's impossible to convay all the information and discussion in this report. Those in attendance seemed to find that their time was well spent and are looking forward to another leadership meeting next year. The Callahans, Hoadleys, and Prister chaired this well organized and smooth running event, with active support from CCR members, who were evident as hosts throughout the three D day of disscussion, dinner, and dancing.


