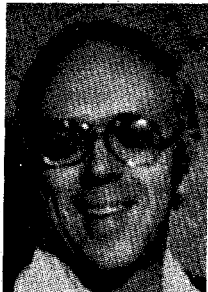

An American Indian Dancer and Performer who calls and teaches contras, squares, International Folk Dances and American Round Dances will bring lots of talent and enthusiasm to 1980 D-O-R. Chip Hendrickson's Country Steppers performed at the 1967 National Square Dance Convention in Philadelphia and Country Steppers II performed 18th Century American Country Dances during the Bi-Centennial in Connecticut.

Chip's experience included Pinewood Camp Staff, a caller at Lincoln Center Country Dances '77 - '79, and a lecturer on Early American Dances in Connecticut and New York State schools and colleges. He has developed successful programs of father/daughter dances for Girl Scouts and PTA groups.

"Chip's Column" in the New England Square Dance Caller Magazine is written to help those who would like to call or dance more in the traditional area. Chip has made twenty records on the Top Caller Label.

All Dancers are invited to come to the Contra Hall at DOR. Even though you may not have any experience with contras, please come and at least see what they're like.

Talented people from nearby North Tonawanda, New York, will be teaching and cueing round dancers at D-O-R 1980. LeVerne and Doris Reilly have taught at the State, National and International Conventions and are firm believers in the cueing of rounds because they feel dancers will be on the dance floor if they are confident of a little help. The Reilly's feel the dance movement goal is to have fun. They are also avid square dancers.

A few of their choreographies include "Remember When", "Moon Over Naples", "So What's New", "Hold Me", and "Third Man Theme" (classics), "You Always Hurt the One You Love", "Yakity Sax", and "All I Need Is You".

The Reilly's have been featured in SETS IN ORDER and ROUND DANCER. They are charter members of Frontier Leaders and Dancers Association and ROUND-A-LAB and are on the Executive Board as advisors of the New York State Dance Federation.

The Reilly's have ballroom danced since their teens and have perfected their ability by attending many workshops and institutes. They have four active round dance clubs and a basics class.

ATTENTION REPORTERS AND OFFICERS!

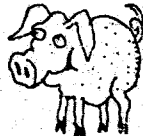

I have received a letter from "Six Former Students" with suggestions for improving the teaching of classes. They would like caller-teachers to make tapes with walk-throughs of the calls, that the students could use at home for review. The letter implies that there are teachers who won't let students tape-record the class sessions.

I have discussed this idea with several callers, and received a lot of comments on the idea. One is that the practice in dancing a call is more important to learning than just memorizing the definition of the call. Another idea is that you could review the definition more easily and cheaply from the Basic Movements and Mainstream Movements booklets published by Set In Order. Some clubs furnish these booklets to their classes, some teachers do not like that idea. Gloria Roth prefers to give her students worksheets on which they themselves keep track of the calls as they are being taught in class.

In any case, there are many angles to what sounds like a simple suggestion. But please don't remain anonymous. Come out of the closet and let's talk about what we might do together for the good of Square Dancing.

Caller Profile



BEN MCGILVERY

Ben, his wife Sadie and their two children, Lawrence and Sharon moved to Rochester from New Jersey in 1961 and live in Charlotte.

Me: Well they won't learn anything.

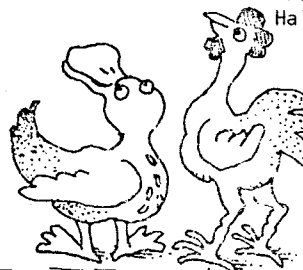
Fran: They will learn how not to...

For the quarter beginning on April 1, 1980, the CALLERLAB Quarterly selections Committee has selected one new figure for use during workshops at Mainstream Dances for those groups who enjoy trying the Quarterly Selections. The figure has seen quite a bit of action and use since its release and is quite easily handled by Mainstream dancers. The figure was Co-Authored by Lee Kopman and Dave Hodson and is called Linear Cycle. The definition has been reworded to conform to Mainstream terminology and has been reviewed and approved by one of the Co-Authors. While the definition appears and is described for right handed waves, it can be adapted to left handed waves and for some groups, it can also be used in other variations. For most Mainstream clubs, however, we encourage the right hand version.

Linear Cycle: In any Right Handed Ocean Waves(s)-Ends and Adjacent centers Single Hinge, Dancers facing out fold, all Double Pass Thru, and Peel Right. Results in facing lines standing at right angles to the starting wave. If done from Left Hand waves, the pass is a left shoulder pass and the peel is to the left.

Some Dancing examples:

1. From 1p2p lines: Pass the Ocean, Linear cycle, Pass thru, Wheel and Deal, (centers) Swing Thru, Turn Thru, Allemande Left.
2. From Box 1-4 Wave: Linear Cycle, Slide Thru, Allemande Left.
3. From Box 1-4 Wave: Swing Thru, Linear Cycle, Box the Gnat, Right and Left Thru, Pass the Ocean, Recycle, Allemande Left.
4. From Box 1-4 Wave: Girls Trade, Linear Cycle, Half Square Thru, Trade By, Allemande Left.
5. From box 1-4 Wave: Girls Trade, Linear Cycle, Sweep $\frac{1}{2}$, Allemande Left.
6. From Tidal Wave: Do-Sa-Do to a wave, (each wave) Linear Cycle, pass Thru, Allemande Left.

General comments: The description allows for the figure to be done from a variety of starting positions including a $\frac{1}{2}$ Tag formation. The timing for the figure should dance comfortably in 10-12 beats although as you gain familiarity with the move, you can do it in less time. This is a comfortable move if not rushed and the Peel Right does not seem to bother the dancers. It is the same action as a normal Peel off for the dancers on the right hand side of the Double Pass Thru.

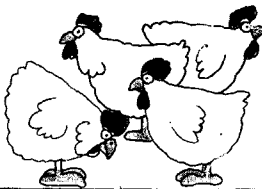
Our Spring celebration started with the St. Patrick's
