



# Caller Profile



#### CHIP KELLOGG

Chip Kellogg, born 1938 in Dansville, now resides at 100 Arbordale Ave., Rochester. He graduated from Dansville High in 1957, where he had become interested in carpentry. After working four years in remodling and new home building, he joined the U.S. Navy Seabees, from which he was discharged as a Second Class Petty Officer (Builder). For the past fifteen years he has been a carpenter/contractor, owner of Murray's Home Improvement. Square dancing caught his attention after a public service announcement on the radio. He graduated from Swinging Singles in April of 1971, But not before trying his first singing call. Chip has attended two caller colleges, and for the past seven years has enjoyed teaching sixteen beginner classes. At the present time he teaches for the Copy Cats/Irondequoit Squares and the WYCO Promenaders, as well as calling for the WYCO Club and has many guest spots and one-nighters in Western New York. He has also had the pleasure of calling for the Sets-In-Order Club in London, England.

Chip has his own club, Melody Squares, dancing Plus 1 and 2 where his best friend and Professional Assistant Sue, is his greatest asset. Chip has been a member of the Caller's Cooperative of Rochester since 1971 and served as a co-moderator for one year. He is also past president of the Swinging Singles and served two years with the Rochester Federation of Round and Square Dance Clubs. He became a member of Callerlab International in 1978 where he met the requirements to become an Accr redited Caller. Chip and Sue enjoy dancing Advanced 2. One of their favorite Nationally-known callers is Ron Libby. For relaxation they enjoy camping, snowmobiling, gardening, and square dance Weekend festivles.

SQUARE A ROUND A TOWN

Spring is here! Classes are graduating, and new dancers are entering the clubs. I'll always have a sentimental spot for the new dancers, for I can remember when I went thru class, I went thru class, I went thru class. Thru class three times? No, not really, but Art Harris, my teacher, said it seemed like it.

Soo, I am taking this opportunity to help the new dancers by putting down a few important tips on the dress and etiquette for square dancers.

#### Men's Dress

- Shoes necessary, especially if you want to appear gracious in de-feet.
- Belt In most cases necessary to stop a disaster
  Pants absolutely necessary, if for no other reason but to cover your shorts.
- 4. Shirt should have collar, cuffs, or both.
- Hair not necessary, but sideburns are, for balance.
- 6. Hat not necessary, unless you are dancing up a storm.

#### Ladies' Dress

- 1. Dresses are necessary, mini, maxi, many.
- 2. Petticoats should only show at the bottom.
- 3. Belt necessary to break up the contours.
- 4. Hair teased or re-teased, on head, any shade.
- 5. Fancy Laces- not necessary on shoes without laces.
- 6. Anything else, true or false, should be hidden.

#### Man or Lady

 Wigs- I don't want to split hairs on this but if you do wear one, be careful on a "dive thru" saw one hanging from a guy's cuff link.

#### Etiquette

- 1. Don't enter a set that already has four couples. unless you intend to round dance.
- 2. Always put you best foot forward, if you have one.
- 3. Don't allemande left your left hand lady if she
- is right handed.4. Don't bow to your partner unless you are facing her or him.
- 5. Don't goof up a set unless you know what you are doing.
- Don't imitate the caller; he is supposed to stand still.
- 7. Don't star thru with your left foot.
- Don't whistle for your corner if he or she is out of position. Call them gently. Say, "Hey Gently, commere".
- 9. Don't walk out of a set, <u>unless</u> the other three couples leave you standing there alone.
- Don't talk during a dance unless you can hear what you are saying. That way you won't offend anyone else.

If you follow these rules, you won't go wrong more than once, I think.

To the new dancers: Don't believe all you hear about me. Nobody, but nobody, could dance that lou-say. (Lou-say...a French word meaning "it's better to pay, than to dance with  $\underline{him}$ ".)

#### BECOME A BETTER DANCER

#### -by Jerry Carmen

About now you will be meeting some of the most enthusiastic square dancers in Rochester. They also want to meet you, have a good time dancing with you, and be your friends. They are the ones who will be promoting square dancing to all their non-dancer friends and, hopefully, bringing them in droves to your club's next beginners class. Who are they? Why, they're the new graduates from this year's beginners classes. Here they are, all excited about their new-found hobby and very nervious about being able to keep up with all the experienced dancers.

Dance with them, welcome them into your squares. Give them your smiles and kind words of encouragement and they'll be with us for years to come. Give them a single sneer or thoughtless comment and they'll be gone tomorrow-perhaps forever, and so will their friends and relatives. Here's a few helpful things to remember while dancing with our new graduates:

1. INVITE them into your square if they seem a bit shy and sit out more than one tip.

2. SMILE no matter how bad things seem to be going. Remember, they are feeling just as bad as you are if they can't make it through the tip.

3. DANCE PROPERLY when these folks are in your square. Don't horse around or do fancy waist swings and twirls. These motions tend to confuse rather than add enjoyment to someone who's having trouble.

4. DON'T SHOVE people into position. Neither new nor experienced dancers like that. Give them a chance to get through the call by themselves. Guiding should be in the form of pointing or a short directional phrase like "over here". If they don't respond, dance around them and do your part. The caller as well as the dancer will appreciate the courtesy.

5. DON'T BE A SQUARE DIRECTOR by trying to dance for everyone and explaining during the tip what went wrong. This is especially annoying to callers as well as other dancers. Be helpful, but don't be a know it all.

6. SAY THANK YOU when the tip is over. Tell them how well they danced. Of course, they'll know how well they did, but they'll appreciate your kind words of encouragement.

Now let's get on the dance floor and show everyone the fun and friendliness our activity really is.





In the meantime, see you all at the Dance-O-Rama. Our group that is going, is growing every day. A grand time should be had by all.


