NEW YORK STATE SQUARE \& ROUND DANCE FEDERATION

New York State Square Dancers'
Legal Obligation Paid Off
```

The New York State Square $\varepsilon$ Round Dance Federation announced, at its State Executive Board Meeting on April 19, 1980, that the final payment had beer made to the at torneys who successfully defended New York State square dancers in the New York State Tax Commission's case against them.

The case developed when the New York State Tax Commission brought action against two southern New York square dance clubs and their presidents in May 1971, for unpaid state sales taxes plus penalties back to August 1965. There:was no intent by the clubs to avoid payment of taxes properly due the State, but rather a sincere belief that square dance clubs were not subject to the tax.

A legal defense fund was raised at that time through contributions from clubs and individual dancers and attorneys were hired to defend the clubs and their presidents. It was not until August 1976 that the case was settled in favor of the square dancers, by which time the legal expenses had considerably exceeded the fund originally cullected.

In January 1977, the Federation offered, on behalf of all dancers in the State, to reinitiate the legal defense fund and to accept contributions toward it. Contributions came from many clubs and individuals within the State and in addition, there were contributions from clubs in ocher states, thus indicating their concern that a similar situation could occur in their own state.

A substantial portion of the final payment was voted by the State Executive Board to be paid from Federation funds on behalf of all of the clubs and dancers of the State who are benefitting from the results of this legal action.

The Federation wishes to thank all of the clubs, callers, and individual dancers who contributed money and time toward the goal of paying off this debt.

We would need to see all the club membership lists, to avoid counting more than once dancers who belong to more than one club. We have more than twice as many clubs now than ten years ago; are there that many more dancers, or is the same number pf people just spread out thinner?

The other question has to do with our class graduates: in last month's PROMENADER were listed over 330 individuals who just graduated, and there were others not listed. Of these only 83 came to Dance-0-Rama this year. Is there something we can do to kindle more enthusiasm among our newest dancers?

CALLERLAB is pleased to announce another step forward in its continuing efforts to include more callers in its international family. This new category of affiliation is the SUBSCRIBER. The CALLERLAB office has received many letters from callers who say they subscribe to and support the CALLERLAB programs and code of ethics but for very good reasons, cannot attend the Annual Convention. Others write to inquire about subscribing to CALLERLAB publications even though they cannot become members. Thus the name SUSCRIBER seemed to be a double edged natural. A SUSCRIBER must meet all the qualifications for full membership except attendance at a Convention. He/she will recieve all CALLERLAB publications which full members recieve but will not be eligible to participate in CALLERLAB business by vote or committee assignment and will not be covered by the CALLERLAB group insurance. Dues for the SUBSCRIBER will be the same as those for a full member, currently $\$ 40.00$. When a suscriber attends a CALLERLAB convention, he/she automatically becomes a full member, having met all other requirements. When a member is unable to retain full membership by attending one Convention every three years the member may revert to SUSCRIBER status rather than be dropped. Those interested in becoming a SUSCRIBER should obtain a recommendation from a CALLERLAB member and send it with thier request and dues to CALLERLAB, Box 679, Pocono Pines, Pennsylvania 18350.
