HOW TO BE AN ANGEL

Now that beginners' classes are underway, some of you will be asked to come and help out an evening or two. Club members who attend the class session to do this are called "angels". To really be helpful, a few simple quidelines should be remembered.

1. First and foremost, the primary reason you are there is to fill in squares so none of the class has to sit out. You are not there to teach. That is the purpose of the instructor.

2. <u>Don't be an assistant instructor</u>. Trying to explain a call while the square is in progress is discourteous to the caller as well as confusing to the beginner who is trying to listen to both. If you must explain something, make a mental note and wait until the tip is over. Better yet, ask the instructor. After all, that's what he is there for.

3. Avoid fancy flourishes, twirls, and incorrect styling such as a waist swing for a do-sa-do. These only tend to confuse and throw others off balance. Execute each call precisely as the caller has taught and leave the fancy stuff for your friends at a club dance. What is being gained if the caller teaches it one way and you dance it another?

4. <u>Do not talk while dancing or the caller is instructing</u> This cannot be overemphasized and refers to people on the sidelines as well. The new dancer has all he can do to concentrate on all the new calls he is learning and asked to recall instantly. Your conversation is distracting even though you are talking to someone else.

5. Do not guide, push, or shove people into position.

Do your part to demonstrate correct styling and positioning. Give a reassuring smile and dance boldly and confidently, but LET THE BEGINNER MAKE HIS OWN MISTAKES. This is very important because it will show the instructor the call has not been fully learned and needs more practice. One has not learned a call unless he can do it without help from others. Class time is the time to make mistakes, then review and practice. Getting through a tip without breaking down is not the objective of a class. A dancer pushed through a call is not learning. Just do your part in the class and save your helpfulness for a class-club dance where the "helping-hand" is really appreciated.

You have probably heard of callers who do not like to have angels at their class. This is only because of some inconsiderate people who interfere with the class progress. However, I do not know of a single caller who would not welcome you if you follow these guidelines.





Well, another season of dancing and socializing is under way. I went to a dance the other night and found I still have <u>Summer</u> in my arches. It will take a few more dances before I have <u>Fall</u> in arches.



The Magic Squares were well represented at Rainbow Weekend hosted by Bob and Nancy Ellis. It was a very enjoyable weekend.


Our classes started on September 12. Our open house was quite successful. Now there will be a few more couples to join in our fun come next spring.






Lima Grand Squares







CUES-M-CALLS

For the quarter beginning on Oct. 1, 1980, CALLERLAB has selected one new movement for use in workshops at Mainstream Dances. This move was written by Lee Kopman and is called COUPLE UP.

COUPLE UP: From any Box Circulate Foursome, ALL BOX CIRCULATE one place and, without stopping, those facing out turn back in the direction of body flow to end in facing pairs. (For Right Handed Boxes, the flow is to the right and for Left Handed Boxes, the flow is to the left.) Timing is 6 steps.

DANCING EXAMPLES:

From Box 1-4 (Eight Chain Thru #23) Touch 1, Scoot Back, Couple Up, Pass Thru, Wheel & Deal, Zoom, Centers Pass Thru, Allemande Left

From lp2p (facing lines #22) Pass Thru, Boys Run, Scoot Back, Couple Up, Pass the Ocean, Girls Trade, Boys Run, Everybody Promenade Home

Please remember that this is in the Quarterly Selection category and does not mean that all Mainstream dancers must learn the figure but only those groups that enjoy something extra. It should be workshopped before being called at any dance advertised as a Mainstream dance. It appears to be another good way to get into facing couples from waves. It can be varied as to boys or girls doing the turn back and can be called from any of the formation partner pairings that permit this definition to be used (APD). Please note, however, that not all groups desire this call in other than standard positioning.




