Editor's editorial: DANCE O RAMA originally and over the years has continued to provide a memorable introduction into the Rochester area dance community for new class graduates. We can remember vividly the first DOR at Cutler Union when we were the new class, how we faltered on "square through four hands," and yet discovered what a great activity square dancing was and still is, mainly because of the people involved. There has always been a hall for new graduates where they could dance comfortably. Yet only 40 new couples attended the 1980 DOR at Brockport. Solution: Class angels and instructors should encourage, talk up, point to, and expect their graduates to dance at DOR, 1981. The time to start is now to make DANCE O RAMA the highlight of their first year.

Ruth Harris announced at the October Federation meeting that Gloria Roth, Dave Hass, Clint McLean, and Mo Howard were engaged for the 1982 DANCE O RAMA. Doris and LaVerne Reilly will be the Round Dance leaders. Suggestions for "national" or "festival" callers for the 1983 program should be forwarded promptly to the D-O-R committee. The policy of hiring two national and two area callers for D-O-R was affirmed.

Orlo and Rita Hoadley were recognized with flowery speeches and tiny presents for their recent service as presidents of the Federation and their help to square dancing extending over many years.

The treasurer announced the seventeen clubs who had paid their \$8.50 annual dues on time. The Bylaws state the deadline is November 1.

Pauline Leiss volunteered to work on nominations for Federation offices. Larry Bartlett with Sam and Rosemary Brown agreed to help plan the Leadership Conference on December 7, with the Callers Co-op committee. Reports were received on Square Dance Week, PROMENADER, and D-O-R activities.

Brockport Ambulance acknowledged a \$75 contribution from the Federation which recognized the vital service they provide for the DANCE O RAMA.

TALKBACK by Jim McCollum

I read with a great deal of interest Jerry Carmen's column in the September issue, discussing the drain of enthusiastic first year graduates from beginning clubs by Plus 2 and other advanced clubs.

Having been an active member of several such clubs at various times during my nefarious career as a Western Square dancer, and having remained throughout that time with my home club, it was my experience that such a "drain" was minimal at best. Relatively few people go into advanced dancing, when one considers their numbers as against the whole square dance community. As a matter of fact, some of the advanced clubs barely scrape by.

The problem is not a drain from home clubs to the advanced ones, but rather the perennial problem of maintaining the interest of recent graduates and even longer term members in the home club itself. These people, particularly those who center their social life around the square dance club, are turned off by a number of factors, including discourtesies from other club members, cliques within the club, poor calling, lack of programming imagination by the club officers, conflicts with jobs and other interests, and plain old loss of interest.

I have no quibble with Jerry's solution, except that it tends to shift the focus from the more important reasons for membership shrinkage to a relatively minor one. Furthermore, it tends to make the advanced clubs look like parasites, which they most certainly are not.

Advanced clubs in this area have contributed to the square dance community in many ways, not the least of which is the retention of square dancers who would have become bored with the fare of the smaller-vocabulary clubs. Moreover, they and their members were among the founders of the Federation, have contributed many of the Federation's officers, including several of its presidents, have contributed PROMENADER editors, and have been deeply committed to and involved in the planning and execution of the annual DANCE O RAMA, to name just a few of their many contributions.

Indeed, we need the whole spectrum of square dancing in our community to give us the depth the movement needs for its continued viability. Obviously there will always be some movement through beginning clubs to the more advanced ones, but it will, nonetheless, be within our square dance community and not out of it.



Caller Profile



BOB ELLIS

Bob Ellis, from Stanley, NY, earns his living as a square dance caller and instructor. He has been calling Western, or Modern Square Dancing for fifteen years, and now calls for four clubs and teaches classes for three of them. The clubs are the Swing-A-Longs of Victor, Diamond Squares of Rochester, Cayuga

Cut-Ups of Auburn, and his original club, Magic Squares of Canandaigua. Guest calling dates take him across New York state as well as Pennsylvania and Ohio on a regular basis.

Prior to calling Western square dances, Bob called for Eastern square dances for many years, was a professional magician and a dairy farmer. He still calls for some traditional square dances and teaches square dancing to high school students in gym classes in several schools, plus two senior citizens groups.

Bob's wife, Nancy, is a very important part of his calling career. Together they lead the Diamond Squares Club of Rochester, sponsor several square dance weekends and campouts, and have taken square dance groups on tours to Nashville, Tenn., the Pocono mountains, and Hawaii. Their future planned tours are the Poconos in June, Nashville in September of 1981, and Hawaii in February, 1982.

Bob and Nancy have six children ranging in age from 9-23. Their two oldest girls have been square dancers, and two of the younger ones are in the activity now.

The Ellises feel that our square dance activity is broad enough to satisfy everyone's desire for recreation or hobby-be it a once a year party dance, mainstream club, plus 2, advanced, or challenge. There is something for everyone, and everyone should feel free to choose how far they want to go and at what point they want to level off.
