One of the greatest areas of difficulty in the Square Dance movement, as in many others; is the lack of effective leadership. All too of ten the leadership of square and round dance organizations falls to individuals who did not know enough to say "no" or to individuals who, although enthusiastic about the role they are accepting, have little or no native ability or training for the leadership demands which will be expected of them. let alone any idea of what will be required of them. It may be true that there are born leaders in every generation. However, there are only so many of such persons available to the plethora of organizations we humans contrive. Accordingly, the rest of us have to work at being leaders with the meager resources available to us.
Additionally, it is quite often forgotten that leadership involves more than being a President or some other officer of an organization. It entalls the involvement of individual members of that organization in various constructive roles of leadership, even if this amounts only to making a constructive comment to an officer about some idea that can be utilized in some club function to enhance the enjoyment of the club members or the greeting of new members and guests at club functions to make them feel a part of what is going on.

It is because of the foregoing that 1 feel so strongly about the necessity of the Leadership Training Seminars sponsored by the Callers Cooperative of Rochester with the help of the Federation, and the maximum participation by as many square dancers in such seminars as possible.

The December meeting of the Federation for the last several years has been the Leadershif Training Seminar. Participation in this is not limited to club officers and Federation Representatives. Rather it is for the entirety of the square dance community in the greater Rochester area. Your participation in the Seminar is imperative to make it a success, not to mention the benefits accruing to you and your clubs.

This year's Leadership Training Seminar will take place on 7 December 1980 and will be held at the Green Lantern Inn in Fairport, New York. It will consist of the Leadership Seminar from 2:00 to 5:00, a cocktail hour from 5:00 to 5:30, a buffet dinner from 5:30 to 6:30 (at the modest cost of $\$ 5.00$ ) and a free dance, for the participants, from 6:30 to 8:30.

# doing Your Part

Do you really look forward to going to your club $d_{\text {ance }}$ for the evening? Is it nice being greeted when you arrive by smiling, friendly faces? Do you enjoy a different type of dance occasionally with a theme enhanced by clever decorations and a party atmosphere? Does the dance level seem relatively unimportant because the rest of the evening is so nice? In short, is your club just plain fun to belong to?

These things don't just happen, but come about because some people got together and gave it some very careful thought and planning. They are your club officers, and without their time and dedicated efforts your club could not survive. Those officers are people not much different from you.

Now is the time of the year when nominating committees are looking for a new crop of people to run the club next year. It is every member's responsibility, when asked, to serve at least once in some capacity. You can be sure if you are asked it is because someone thought you would do a good job in that particular function. Try to remember that a club that has trouble finding officers is either stagnant or shrinking. If you belong to this type of club, you may be just the person to reverse the trend. Clubs are influenced by their leaders; if their attitude is indifferent, so will be the club's; if they clique together, so will others.

When you accept an office, you owe it to yourself and the club to EDUCATE yourself on the entire square dance picture. What is the "level system!' and how is it useful? How can we promote friendliness and make all our members and guests feel welcome? How can we change attitudes to minimize the destructive influence of cliques and differences of dancer ability? Even if you are the refreshment chairman, your input at board meetings of all the club's affairs is as important as anyone else's.

In closing, remember if a club is worthy of having you as a member, you are worthy, and indeed needed, as an officer to help keep the club alive and healthy.

## FEDERATION

The November 11 Federation meeting featured a lively discussion on square dance promotion and publicity, reviewing the present effort of the Federation and individual clubs, and exchanging ideas on ways to reach more people effectively. Two new committees resulted. Rita Hoadley will organize a group of demonstration dancers, while Maryln Dailey will prepare a leaflet to hand out at demonstration dances.

A summary of the insurance *plan available through the Federation will be malled to individual clubs with the January meeting notice.

The annual dues for teen clubs was reduced to $\$ 4.25$. The Hilton Hillbillies and the Hicks and Chicks are currently active and were welcomed into the Federation.

Reports were received from the treasurer, secretary, DOR, and PROMENADER representatives.

The need for a Grievance committee to resolve disputes between a club and caller was discussed but no action was taken.

For the quarter beginning in October, 1980, CALLERLAB has selected one new movement for use in workshops at Mainstream Dances. This move was written by Lee Kopman and is called COUPLE UP. The definition and some dancing examples follow:

COUPLE UP: From any Box Foursome, ALL BOX CIRCULATE one place and, without stopping, those facing out turn back in the direction of body flow to end in facing pairs. (For Right Handed Boxes, the flow is to the right and for Left Handed Boxes, the flow is to the left.) Timing is 6 steps.

DANCING EXAMPLES:
From Box 1-4 (Eight Chain Thru 23) Touch 1/4, Scoot Back Couple Up, Pass Thru, Wheel \& Deal, Zoom, Centers Pass Thru, Allemande Left.

From lp2p (facing lines 22) Pass Thru, Boys Run, Scoot Back, Couple Up, Pass the Ocean, Girls Trade, Boys Run, Everybody Promenade Home.

From Static Square (14) Head Couples Slide Thru, Pass Thru, Circle Four-Head Gents Break and Make Two Lines, Pass Thru, Boys Run, Couple Up, Allemande Left.

Please remember that this is the Quarterly Selection category and does not mean that all Mainstream dancers must learn the figure but only those groups that enjoy something extra. It should be workshopped before being called at any dance advertised as a Mainstream dance. It appears to be another good way to get into facing couples from waves. It can be varied as to girls or boys doing the turn back and can be called from any of the formation partner pairings that permit this definition to be used (APD). Please note, however, that not all groups desire this call in other than standard position ing.

## 

Rhythm is the essence of all true dancing! Without rhythm, you are not dancing! And with poor, uncertain rhythm you are dancing very poorly indeed. It doesn.' t matter, quite as much with beginners. But with experienced dancers you should become more experienced with rhythm with each step you take. This silent seeking for perfect rhythm will keep you dancing all your lives, and still seeking the truths that ile beyond it. But ignore the rhythm, make it purely secondary, seek for the outward forms of style only, and you will soon tire of the game and quit it forever.

Square dancing may be the mortar that will bind all our little stones together, bind our groups together. Its deep folk qualities working into the cracks and interstices of our fractured lives, may help to bind the nation together.

## Keep it simple, keep it folk--have fun!
