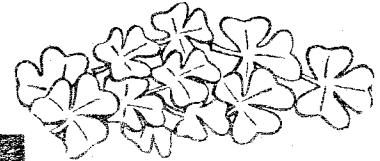

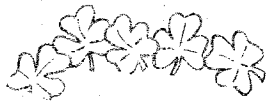


ED FOOTE

Ed serves on the board for CALLERLAB, conducts callers' clinics, writes regularly for square dance magazines and a caller note service. He is well known for his teaching tapes. Ed uses Pittsburgh, PA, as his home base, but travels over 50,000 miles a year calling full time. He finds time to be the regular caller for five clubs in western Pennsylvania. Ed calls over 350 dances a year!

The smiling faces of the dancers reflect how easily Ed can put dancers through beautiful, intricate choreography--truly an art all square dancers will appreciate.



THE BARTONS

Peter and Beryl Barton are highly qualified to lead the round dancing at DANCE O RAMA. They have studied the history of dancing and hold gold medals in international ballroom dancing. Some of the rounds they have written include MEMORIES, MOTHER KELLY'S FOXTROT, SOMEONE LIKE YOU, JEALOUS, and CANADIAN CAPERS.

The Bartons have been on staff at many festivals and conventions in the United States and Canada, including the Canadian Nationals. Home is Toronto, where they have their Evergreen R/D club, and also an eight-couple round dance formation team called the Silhouettes. They give monthly R/D styling clinics for interested teachers and dancers.

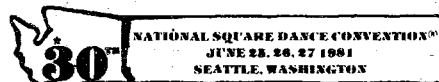

Caller Profile



Orlo originally had five years of square dancing experience before dropping out, and later he and Rita returned to class, graduating in 1969. He very soon became interested in thinking up new things for dancers to do, and wrote a dozen new calls, some of which enjoyed a brief national popularity. He joined CCR to keep in contact with the callers who might use his choreography, and to find out what kind of choreography the callers might want help with.

Late in 1974 Orlo started writing "Square Dance Call of the Month." These were new calls, old calls that deserved some more attention, and sometimes original calls. A paragraph describing the call was printed in PROMENADER and a sheet of dance examples was made up for the callers. Later this became the start of a series called "Using the Basics," in which each call of what were then the 75 Basics was discussed from the choreographer's point of view, and a number of examples illustrating various ways of using it were written.

Since 1976 Orlo has been writing singing call figures, intended to give the dancers variety by combining Mainstream calls in ways a little different from the old familiar patterns, without being too difficult for the average club dancer. There are now over 300 of these.

Rita and Orlo have been members and held office in EKCO Squares and Genesee Dancers, have taken minor jobs on the Dance-O-Rama committee for several years, and were Federation Presidents for the 1979-80 season.

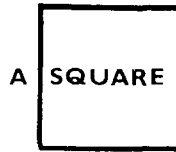
D-O-R update

and if I don't see you in a set.....

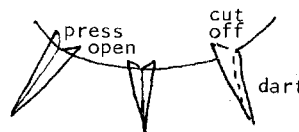

Another tip for a gathered skirt:

To eliminate the extra bulk at the waistline, make darts evenly around the top of the skirt. Cut off the extra fabric in the dart, then make your gathering stitches. I find the easiest way to gather is to make two rows of the longest stitch, and then pull the two rows of thread to fit the waistband, or the other tier. It is best to pin the gathering edge at even intervals, and to do one section at a time.

CARMEN'S COLUMN

SQUARE DANCE THERAPY -- TRY A WEEKEND

Would you like to improve your dancing, meet new friends, travel, lift yourselves out of a rut, get a general up-lifting and fresh viewpoint of the square dance activity? Whether you are a new or experienced dancer, I can think of nothing that can excite or revive your enthusiasm for square dancing like a well-run weekend.

The weekend is our square dance "revival," because it is there that you can meet people from many other clubs over a wide area and get a feeling of unity and comradeship. You will dance intensively over a relatively long period to some of the best callers in the country. With all that practice and expert leadership, you cannot help but be a better dancer for it.

What is a weekend? It is a square dance oriented vacation put on by one or more callers, usually held in a hotel or campground (during the summer). Generally, a round dance cuer is also present. The weekend usually begins on a Friday evening and ends on a Sunday morning. The program may run like this: Friday evening--get acquainted dance. Saturday morning and afternoon--round and square dance workshops. Saturday evening--square dance in square dance attire. Sunday morning--farewell dance. Some time is allotted for swimming, sightseeing, etc. One or both the evening dances may be followed by After Parties in which snacks, skits, and general socializing is shared by all.

I would recommend, if you go, to convince a friend or two to come with you, because initially the security of having a friend there will help you to relax. Once you are there, try splitting up and dancing in as many different squares as possible. Some of the more memorable times come from the After-After Parties, where a gang will gather in a room and swap stories and jokes. If you do not get invited to attend one of these, invite a couple or two to your room. Or, better yet, wander around and drop in on any noisy group. These gatherings are generally open and you will be welcome.

How do I find a weekend? All over the nation at all times of the year there are weekends put on by a variety of groups and callers. The best way is to know someone who has attended one or more and get their recommendations. If you want to travel, the national square dance publications list many of them. Ask your caller if you can borrow his magazine and get his opinion of what might be best for you. Happy dancing!

FEDERATION NEWS

Notes from the February 12 meeting.

DANCE O RAMA tickets and DOR sashes were distributed to the individual clubs at the February 12 Federation meeting by chairman, Ruth Harris. Cay Jackson, who is in charge of Brockport arrangements, obtained the needed volunteer clubs to cover setup, restoration, sound, signs, both indoor and outdoor, callers' lounge, decorations, transportation, and ticket collection. Barb Butenhof of the Country Dancers invited participation by square dancers in the Contra Hall at the DANCE O RAMA. Ted Sannella will call to live music.

Connie Harper announced plans for the LEUKEMIA dance to be held on Friday, April 3, and passed out flyers and tickets to the club representatives.

The Liability insurance available to clubs through the Federation was described by an agent, as covering injury and property damage lawsuits arising from negligence on the part of the club or a club member. He was asked to investigate broadening the coverage to include injuries to dancers, and report back at the next Federation meeting.

Orlo Hoadley displayed a Silver Club badge to be awarded to dancers who have danced to 25 members of the Callers Co-op. This idea is patterned on the Century Club program to encourage and support local callers.

Eileen Howard of the Village Squares invited the Federation representatives to a dance in March.

Rita Hoadley needs volunteers for a Registry of Demonstration Dancers. She also announced that the Jack of Hearts were disbanding.

Adele Fico, of the GEVA Theater, offered to arrange theater parties for square dance clubs and described the March and April presentations.

DANCE FOR FUN AND HEALTH

Exercise Cuts Medical Bills.

Medical bills for people who exercise three times a week are half as much as for people who don't. A Purdue University study of men between the ages of 35 and 55 found medical bills (excluding those resulting from accidents) over a four-year period averaged \$22 for men exercising three times a week, and \$400 for sedentary men. The study also concluded that the active men were more "emotionally stable and less tense."

Cloverleaves are proud to introduce Rebecca, their newest addition, born to Cindy and Andy Smith.

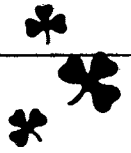

Country Dancers

Bands for March include: Blackthorn Ceilidh Band on the 5th, Overacker Corners on the 12th. March 19 we feature Claudio Buckwald from Trumansburg with his band on their CDR debut. Claudio is a staff regular at Pinewoods Dance and Music Camp each year, and his fiddling is well worth the price of admission. March 26 Eric calls (and fiddles at the same time) with his band Overacker Corners.

As graduation approaches, we hope callers and club people will tell club newcomers that our club is DIFFERENT but very OPEN. We especially welcome teens and young adults, or those who feel young, for the energy level needed is more than in club-styled dancing. Since D-O-R will feature a Graduate Ball in the evening, they can be with us in the afternoon.

Next month I will write more about Dance-O-Rama, but at this time we know we will have live music for our whole contra program. Blackthorn Ceilidh Band (our original band) will play in the afternoon, and Overacker Corners (last year's band) will play in the evening. Our featured caller, Ted Sannella, calls several times a week in the Boston area and has written many interesting three-couple contras he calls "triplets" which are real all-position dancing. We hope to start right out in our afternoon program with some of Ted's triplets. Ted has called at Dance-O-Rama before, as well as at the Atlantic City National Square Dance Convention, so he can work well with club-styled dancers. You will even be comfortable with the handholds on stars, for Boston area uses the box grip. We still use pigeon wing for allemandes and ocean waves. And we really balance!
