# CARMEN'S COLUMN 

WELCOMING OUR NEW GRADS



It has been estimated that we lose $50-80 \%$ or our new grads during the first six months after graduation. This is an alarming rate, especially if we consider that classes have been smaller than usual during the past couple years. It is especially serious since it is primarily these new grads who are responsible for bringing new people to our classes in the fall. Here are a few ideas, not all my own, to welcome and help retain our newest members.

We must remember that the primary goal of all dancers, new and old, is to have FUN. If this ingredient is missing, then the new dancers will soon drop out and maybe try bowling next year. With the complicated dancing we have today, the Plus 1 and Plus 2 calls creeping into our club vocabulary, the inadequate preparation we give new dancers, it is indeed very difficult to have fun. If we, as seasoned square dancers, are willing to make some personal sacrifices, maybe we can retain most of our new members in spite of it all. Keep the following in mind:

1. Take the initlative when you see new dancers. Introduce yourself and invite them to dance with you. Don't just do it that evening, but the following evenings as well.
2. When dancing, try to remember to SMILE. Nothing makes one more self-conscious as when someone else in your square is scowling.
3. Be conservative on yourfancy twirls and gimmicky dancing. You confuse unsure dancers by promenading the wrong way or switching positions with your partner.
4. Nervous people are especially prone to "drawing blanks," even on material they have danced for months. Smile and try to regroup your square in a friendly manner.
5. Your attitude shows. If you look like you are having a good time in spite of breakdowns, they are more likely to relax and dance better the next time.
6. If you notice a lot of new dancers constantly breaking down, point it out to the caller. He just may not have noticed. He can help by mixing if necessary or changing his program to suit them. You will also have let him know that making the new dancers happy is more important in your mind.
7. Try always to keep the FUN in square dancing at any level.

For the quarter beginning April 1, 1981, CALLERLAB has selected one new movement for use in workshops at Mainstream Dances. This move was written by Dick Kenyon and is called RELEASE RECYCLE. The definition and some dancing exampies follow: RELEASE RECYCLE: From a $\frac{1}{4}$ tag formation, the ends of the Right Hand Wave and the outside Boys (beaus) extend to the dancer ahead of them and all finish like a RECYCLE. Ends in a starting Double Pass Thru formation. Timing is 6 steps.

DANCING EXAMPLES:
RELEASE RECYCLE
From Static Square (\#14 on Formations)
Heads Pass the Ocean, RELEASE RECYCLE, Centers Pass Thru Touch to a Wave, Recycle, Square Thru $3 / 4$, Trade By, Left Allemande.

Heads Pass the Ocean, RELEASE REcycle, Double Pass Thru, Centers In, Cast off $3 / 4$, Star Thru, Centers Touch, RELEASE RECYCLE, Centers Pass Thru, Pass Thru, Trade By, Allemande Left.

## BOB MEAGHER

I must say we learn a lot together. We also have two tape groups where I teach $\mathrm{C}-1$ and $\mathrm{C}-2$ level. At present we belong to Teddy Bears A-2 and C-1 clubs and the Rochester Rollaways.

Jeannette and 1 dance and enjoy all levels of dancing from Mainstream to Challenge 2. More than the dancing, we enjoy the people.

Pass the Ocean, Girls Trade, Recycle, Veer Left, Ferris Wheel, Centers Step to a Wave, RELEASE RECYCLE, Zoom, Swing Thru, Turn Thru, Left Allemande.

Please remember that this is the Quarterly Selection for the quarter beginning April 1, 1981. It does not mean that all clubs or all dancers must use the call but rather is for groups that would like to try something extra. It should be workshopped before being used at any dance labeled Mainstream. For the majority of clubs, this call should be used with standard setups only (girl on the boy's right). For groups that can handle variations of Recycle, this call can be used from a variety of Boy-Girl arrangements. However, not all clubs enjoy or desire other than standard positioning.
