These recording artists reminded me of a flock of nervous Woodpeckers during the mating season. First they would be peck peck pecking the recorders on, then fly off to a Set. Now the Tip is over and here they come flying back to peck peck their recorders off. You couldn't miss those Woodpeckers, they were all a flutter in the front six Sets.

Six sets? Yes, six sets across a four set hall. Ray Seymour told me he knew they were dancing a little close but he didn ${ }^{\ddagger} t$ know how close until they Chained the Ladles and the guy in the next set Courtesy. Turned Ray.

Angie DiBitetto said, in their set some new calls were introduced, like Do Sa Do and Squeeze Thru. She continued, at one time the Set was soooo tight that when Sam called an Eight Chain Thru, they only had room to do four chains. Man, they were short chained.

Tip Costich said that between Tips he couldn't find an empty chair or a place to set down til he got wind of a seat open in the mens room.

Charlie Tucker got out of the way of the pressing crowd by moving back into the coat racks and he cued the rounds thru the sleeve of an overcoat. At least that's what Roger Bastian said it sounded like.

Singing Sam called a wonderful dance as usual and 1 goofed as usual. I thought 1 could have done better if I had another chance. So I'd shout, "Play it again, Sam." but he wouldn't do it. Sooooo 1 say. . . .

# CARMEN'S COLUMN 

DANCE LEVELS


The Callerlab levels system is a list of calls broken down into plateaus or groups of calls to be progressively learned by a dancer, governed by how involved one wants to be. These plateaus are given names such as Basic, Mainstream, Plus 2, A-1, C-2, etc.

This system is most valuable at large dances where people from many different clubs attend, and different halls are provided to accommodate various tastes in dancing. The halls can now be labeled, and a dancer, knowing which level he is familiar with, can now select a hall to dance in and not worry about the caller using many unfamiliar calls.

Clubs use this system also to tell guests what calls they are expected to know when they attend their dance. So, if you should attend a dance labeled "Mainstream," you will be expected to know all the calls in the Basic, Extended Basic, and Mainstream lists. The caller is free to use any other calls outside these lists, but he must walk you through them first.

What do you do if you attend a Plus 2 dance as a guest and the caller is using calls from the Advanced and Challenge lists with no walkthru? of course, this means the caller is not calling the advertised level, and by not doing so, he is being unfair to you as a guest. My first inclination would be to approach the caller and ask him to stick to the advertised level. I would explain that I'm there to have fun, and if he insists on using calls off the list, to please walk them through first. If I did not get any satisfaction and was sufficiently unhappy, l would ask for my money back and leave.

The point is, if you don't tell the people in charge, nothing can be done. If you are unhappy, immediately confront the caller or the club officers. You will either get compliance or an explanation. From there you can either stay or leave. In any event, you will have made the people who can do something about it aware there is a problem. It is true some will ignore you, but it is more likely you will be thanked and a correction will be made--even if it is the club changing or eliminating its level notation in future advertising.

Instead, the new graduate is pressured to attend summer workshops and learn the Plus calls on top of all the Mainstream calls, many of which he is not really sure of yet. It's no wonder that these new people get frustrated.

I had what $I$ consider a pretty nice calling experience the other night. I called for the Copy Cats annual Dessert Social dance. This was advertised as a class/club dance. Many class members from different area classes were in attendance. But there were also many experienced dancers there, some of whom have danced for many years. These experienced dancers were from many area clubs, not just the Copy Cats. The whole crowd mixed so well together with enthusiasm that it was just a super evening. Yes, many people probably came for the refreshments. But l would like to think that many of the experienced dancers that attended did so because the dance level (there's that word again!) didn't really make a heck of a lot of difference to them. They wanted an evening of fun, enjoyment and socializing as well as the opportunity to dance with some new folks, help them along if they needed $i t$, and tell them what the wonderful world of square dancing can do for their social life.

As I drove home from that dance, I thought about al] these things and considered myself very fortunate to be calling in an area which realizes the importance of bringing new people into the square dance world and accepting them.

Experienced dancers: Never forget that the new people who join our clubs each year will someday be the basis for your $M+2$ or $A 2$ or $C 1$ club. All they need is a little T/L/C.

New Graduates: Remember at this time next year how nervous you were and how you desperately longed to be accepted by the experienced people you admired so much.
