


Editor's Note:

CONTRA CORNER

This month I'd like to say a little about the National Conventions. Ed and I have missed only two of them since our first in Kansas City in 1975. That was the first year that contras were first considered a real part of the program and had a full-time hall. That year there were contra panels and workshop sessions. Don Armstrong has often run three 2-hour workshops at more recent conventions. In those days there were not many callers for contras--Bill Castner, Art Seeley, and Walt Cole were the big names--and Ed, just starting, went armed with two or three records. I think he was scheduled to call once or twice (like during the supper hour)--and ended up calling the same dances over and over as the hall exploded with people. Friday evening TWO halls had to be scheduled to accommodate the crowd. Saturday's program saw even more people take part in the new convention feature--and Ed called more and more. Thus it began.

Each year after that more contra callers appeared. There were and still are two schools of thought. Some prefer keeping the 8-count timing-using traditional figures which anybody can do, while Art, Walt, and others tend to introduce the modern club figures and sometimes disregard the 8-count timing which goes better with the more familiar Western hoedown music vocabulary. The dancers? There was no question about what they preferred in Oklahoma City. Again two halls scheduled. The regulars started to FEEL what contras were all about and started to really dance. Many of the contra group stayed with us for the total three days. Others made the rounds of the various square dance halls as well.

Each year we saw the familiar faces of our square dance friends that decided National Conventions were great for doing contras and traditional squares. The program expanded to include Scottish dances, English country dances, and of course some of the big circle formations from the Appalachian part of our country. The biggie callers still included Walt and Art--and Bob Howell, Stan Burdick, John Kaltenthaler, Bob Osgood, Lannie Mequaide from the more modern school of thought and Don Armstrong, Leif Hetland, Cal Campbell, Gib Gilbert, Bill Johnson, Tony Parkes, Bill Litchman among the traditionists. In all fairness, Bob Howell works with both groups and some of the others are starting to.

Contras have a very solid place in the convention and many dancers, as well as some 50 callers, are finding that it is a nice change of pace. Contras should be different. It will be interesting to see what happens next June in Detroit. Each convention seems to have a different spirit and in the contra hall there is no question that the mix of dancers determines the style of the dances. Here the dancers control the hall! When the traditional dancers get wound up the upbeat become more important than the downbeat—and that's what contras are all about. Go to Detroit—get that happy feeling!

CARMEN'S COLUMN

TIPS ON DANCING NEW CALLS




The caller presents a call that has a complicated traffic pattern; we are dancing along and hear a call we have forgotten or never learned. These are two situations we will all encounter sooner or later. In a similar fashion, most of us have seen people learn calls very quickly, or observed a non-dancer get into a square and do surprisingly well. How do they do it? By having a basic knowledge of dance flow and by being observant. We can all train ourselves to be observant, and by doing so, we can get through almost any situation with a reasonable amount of style and minimum confusion to our square. I hope the following hints prove of value to you in the future.

LEARNING A NEW CALL. While walking through a call, notice particularly the starting and ending formations and your position in it. Did you also end up next to the person you started with? Which hands are you holding? Are you facing in or out? Are you an end or a center? Sometimes just knowing where you are supposed to end up can save the square if you draw a blank later.

DANCING AN UNFAMILIAR CALL. Did you ever get through a call you never heard before? It can be done even with a complicated call if you are observant and train yourself to remember a few simple quidelines. Of course, we must assume you are the only couple in your square that doesn't know it. Rule No. 1 is to remember to touch or join hands at the completion of every call with the adjacent person. This will enable us to get (or give) help in getting started correctly when we are not sure where to go. Rule No. 2 says unless someone turns us, we immediately walk forward with both hands extended about chest high and watch for a person coming at us to take a hand. If you reach the end of the square, walk around always turning toward the center. If you do not know where the call ends and you hear another call, walk forward or around until you can execute it. If you must catch your bearings, turn your head but DO NOT STOP. Rule no. 2 holds up because virtually all calls are danced with forward, continuous motion. Rule No. 3 is watch your partner's opposite and do what he or she does. This is because square dancing is symmetrical and whatever you are doing, your partner's opposite will be doing on the other side of the square. Before the tip begins, note who that person is, and do what they do. I once got through Motivate that way.

In summary, here's what to remember:

- Mentally note beginning and ending formations and your position in them.
- 2. Always walk forward with hands up and DO NOT STOP.
- 3. Watch your symmetrical opposite.
