Making a square dance dress? A good basic bodice pattern is a good beginning. Necklines can be made scoop, square, sweetheart, or whatever looks best on you, and can be put on same bodice. The sleeve, above all, should be comfortable--Star Thrus are difficult if your sleeve is too snug. A full skirt is best for pretty dancing. Circle, gored, or tiered--all are good! Many dresses can be made from one basic beginning; let your imagination go wild and have fun with all varieties of fabric and trims. Just be sure it's all wash and wear.

Do you want your partner's outfit to match yours? That can be a problem if you don't want to tackle a shirt. A tie in a color to match yours can be bought, or made from your fabric. Also take a white or plain colored shirt and make a yoke for the shirt from your fabric.

## CONTRA CORNER

Last month 1 wrote about the Contra Hall at National Conventions. As I read over the column I realized I had left out many square dance callers that are doing their best to include some traditional dances as part of the mainstream programming. While it is probable that Contras will do the same as Squares did back in the early 50's and divide into separate styles--both kinds, traditional and modern, meet the needs of their respective groups. Obviously groups that hold a series of classes can use more complicated material than dances that encourage inexperienced as well as experienced people to attend. The two schools of thought as to the way it should be-will be material for disaussion at Convention clinics for years.

It is interesting to note, however, that some callers cross the line that seems to divide the groups. Jerry Helt from ohio, and an excellent club caller I didn't mention last month, is calling for traditional groups. He has been a feature at Country Dancers several times. I was interested to hear that he called at Tony Parkes' group in Concord, Mass., this fall. Jerry has written some excellent contras that are becoming favorites in the traditional groups. It is great to see him accepted as a caller too.

Bob Howell, also from Ohio, had the chance of being on the Pinewoods staff this past summer as a Western caller for the American and English dance week. Ted Sannella did the New England traditional classes and together they handled a talk on the differences between the two. bob did a great job (he had to work with live music the whole week) and a mixture of dancers with different backgrounds as well as first timers. A real challenge!

There are many camps about the country which are open to anybody. There are always some people with no dance exper-ience--but usually many folk dancers (who travel as mucn as Club square dancers) and others with specialized interest: in dance. Many of the dance weeks combine various types of dance, and campers select as many of the classes as they wish to attend.

Don Armstrong runs a Contra Thanksgiving Party in Binghampton, NY, each year which features contras but also includes squares, rounds, and easy couple dances in the true Lloyd Shaw tradition. It's a fun weekend and about half of the group, or more, are Club square dancers. All sessions with recorded music.
Ralph Page has camp events going throughout the year in or near Keene, NH. The Fall Camp after Labor Day always features Dick Leger as well as contras, and two folk dance groups. Evening parties include material from all the classes. Most sessions are with recorded music.
The Lloyd Shaw Foundation sponsors a Rocky Mountain Dance Week in July in Colorado. Many callers contribute their talents to the program. Classes include some for children, as families (and campers) are encouraged to attend:
My favorite camp, however, is Pinewoods. Sessions run all summer in the Cape Cod area between Buizzards Bay and Plymouth. The camp is run by the Country Song and Dance Society (membership \$20) and hold various kinds of dance and music sessions, including a family week. Ed and I have attended both the American Dance and Music Week and the American and English Dance Week. All sessions are with live music--and the musicians are the top ones in the country. Sandy Bradley, a caller as well as a musician, is of ten on staff--as is Claudio Buckwald (fiddle) who will be calling for Country Dancers on December 3.
If anyone wants more information about attending one lof these camps, give me a ring.
