## \#\#\#\# IT'S YOUR FEDERATION! \#\#\#

The Rochester Area Federation of Westein Round and Square Dance Clubs, Inc. is YOURS. It exists to enable member clubs to collectively promote Western style dancing in ways that are beyond the scope of most individual clubs. The "PROMENADER" is one result of that collective effort.

A circle skirt is one of the easier ones to make, and onTy takes $21 / 4$ to $21 / 2$ yards of material 45 inches wide. A pattern can be made from newspaper according to your own measurements.
Example: $26^{\prime \prime}$ waist, cut down $4^{\prime \prime}$

\begin{aligned}
& 28^{\prime \prime} \text { waist, cut down } 41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \\
& 30^{\prime \prime} \text { waist, cut down } 5^{\prime \prime}
\end{aligned}
$$

then add the length you desire, plus 1 or 2 inches for the hem.

The diagram below is for a skirt 22 1/2" long with a 26" waist.


An important thing to remember about a circle skirt is to let it hang a day before hemming. Circle skirts have a tendency to stretch on bias. So after hanging, measure evenly from waistband all around. Then hem it on the machine.

## CARMEN'S COLUMN



ATTITUDE is a very important aspect of a dancer. It is not enough to only remember and execute calls perfectly, but to have a feeling for the whole square dance picture and how we can help it be better and grow.

I have noticed lately a trend to urge dancers fresh out of class into Plus 1 and 2 dancing, and from there, into clubs other than the club they learned with. Although this may be fine with the people concerned, let's take a look at the possible effect on the growth of square dancing in Rochester.
Our mainstream clubs grow or sustain their membership levels by sponsoring beginner classes. Since the Plus 2 and advanced groups generally sponsor no beginner classes they must recruit their membership exclusively from other clubs. Our problem arises when new dancers are recruitec into clubs sponsoring workshops to advance them into another level. Normally it is these first and second year dancers who bring in the bulk of a new class. Many not only bring them, but dance with them as well during the class. If these dancers now progress into another level and stop dancing with the club they learned with, they will probably not bring their nondancing friends to an open house. As a result, our classes and clubs will become smaller and the whole square dance picture will suffer.

What is a solution? Clubs that sponsor beginner classes should refrain from trying to reach and sustain a Plus 2 level of dancing since that is too large a jump for most to make in the time normally allotted for classes. Clubs and callers should discourage their new graduates from attending Plus 2 and advanced workshops until they have danced with their club at least a year. Finally, clubs that do not sponsor a beginners' class should encourage their members to continue to dance with their home club. Total division by levels of ability and experience is one of the worst things that can happen to square dancing. Who was it that said, united we stand, divided we fall?


## Contra <br> Corner

It is with regret that 1 must announce a change in plans for Dance-0-Rama this year. Tony Parkes will NOT be calling for us and we will have only the evening dance with live music. Ed Butenhof, Rich Castner and Eric Rounds will be calling--and Eric has promised us the very best musicians he can find for an evening of fine dancing.

We hope to have our hall decorated as Sallie Paul has offered her assistance. (How many of you remember the first Dance-0-Rama at Brockport when she was in charge of beautifying the halls?) As plans now stand, we will have part of the evening for everyone to dance contras together---and part of the evening for the especially loved dances that will be "for the ones that know them'. This portion of the evening can be considered "demonstration"---or a chance for square dancers to see what contra dancing is all about when lots of time isn't taken for teaching. As is true with all contra dances, more people can join the lines after the dance is in progress. For the ones of you--or for our group, too---dances and dance figures can be "known" even when the name of the dance is unfamiliar. Sometimes, the "I'll wait to join, after l see what they are doing--" becomes the prudent course.

There are several "rules" when dancing the contras:
1-Always join at the end of the line (you can rush out in the hall to get at the top-or start a new line)
2-If you are "new"--try to get in the middle of the line as it grows.
3-As you face the head of the hall with your partner, the woman should be on her partner's right side--then face each other and back into place. The caller tells you to "cross over" if he wants you to.
4-0nce the dance has started--DON'T LEAVE!! It is even worse to leave the line in a contra dance than it is to sit down in the middle of a square.
5-Just because a "swing" is 8 or even 12 counts long DOES NOT mean it has to be fast. Walk slowly around if you wish. You can ask to go slow.
Ed Butenhof and Rich Castner are both willing to have afternoon contra and traditional square workshops for square dancers if there is enough interest. All we would need is about 16 to 24 couples. A contra workshop should be about $1 \frac{1}{2}$ to 2 hours long. With this information, you would be able to do all the evening dances with confidence. If you are interested, phone me. Remember, this is family kind of dancing. We have always welcomed children in our hall-.... about 9 years and over---with adults, of course.

Ron Fotch is also trying to have clogging demonstrations and workshops available. Next month we will give you final plans. Remember--if you want the workshops, phone me NOW-oror call Betty or Ron. or Ron.

## Geneva Friendship Squares
