The Stajo of the PKOMENA IE R wishes you all a Happy Easter and a Happy Spring!!!


Especially for the new dancers we will repeat some of the tips previously in the Promenader.
When making a gathered skirt with three tiers. DON'T use pattern pieces, it's a waste
of fabric, usually.
Measure your desired skirt length and figure the width of the three tiers, graduating each and allow for hem and seams.

EXAMPLE: Finished shirt is $22^{11}$ long.
Top tier is $6^{\prime \prime}$ wide Middle tier is $8^{\prime \prime}$ wide Third tier is $14^{\prime \prime}$ wide
Cut the three tiers across the width of the fabric.
$1 \frac{1}{2}$ widths for the top tier
3 widths for the middle tier
5 or 6 widths for bottom tier
Don't forget the waist band, too.
Four yeards of $44^{\prime \prime}$ material will be anough to allow for extra length or error.

RULES FOR BANNER STEALING

1. Clubs wishing to take part in Banner Steal ing, must register with the local Banner Stealing Association.
2. Those clubs registering with the Association, must have a miniature banner (travelling) that will be used for stealing.
3. In order to steal a member club's banner, the visiting (stealing club) club, must have no less than four (4) couples (one square), who have paid the guest fee at the host club. 4. In the event that more than one club is in attendance for the purpose of stealing the host club's banner, then it will be the duty of the President of the host club to determine some fair way in which to determine which of the visiting (stealing) clubs will be awarded the banner.
4. Once a club's banner has been stolen, that club may retrieve said banner by sending no less than four (4) couples to the stealing club's dance to retrieve their banner. if retrieving club also wishes to be eligible to steal the banner of their hosts, they must then have a second four (4) couples in order to be eligible.
5. At no time can a member club allow any other club to take a banner belonging to another club. Also when a club steals a banner from another club, it is the receiving club's duty to safe guard at all times the banner they have stolen. If said banner has not been retrieved by the owning club within a reasonable period of time (three (3) months), the banner should be returned to the owning club.
6. Banner stealing shall be restricted to regular club dances only and does not include any special dances a club might hold and so designate.

so, you are a club officer or committee chair. man and you have a job to be done. It would be so easy if only eyeryone did their part without a lot of fuss and all you had to do was to thank them for their help. However, how many times have you seen tasks and events poorly planned and coordinated - if anyone can be found to do them in the first place! Any successful event does not just happen, but is the result of careful planning and, most important, management of people. Here are some secrets revealed to you by planners of successful programs. Most appear obvious, but is is surprising how easily forgotten they are in practice.

HAVE A PLAN. Decide what your goals are and write them down. Having a visual reminder helps to keep you on the track.

TURN YOUR COMMITMENT INTO ACTION. You must be careful that your own enthusiasm for your pet project doesn't blind you to other people's reluctance. They may outwardly seem to agree with you, but actually do not. Speak individually to each.person on your team. Give them a chance to express their doubts. Ask them specifically what they are willing to do and when they can do it. Put their commitment in writing and review it with them. Try to eliminate any loopholes through which people can duck out at the last minute. Remember also that it's easier to say YES than NO. They may not want to seem disagree able, so they go along with your plans. It's up to YOU to make sure they really are committed and that their good intentions will turn into action

COMMUNICATE. Your goals must be compatable with those of the group and you can only know this if you talk to them. You must also learn to listen and let others have their say, even if you don't agree. The best way to talk with others in your group is to have a meeting. Open meetings are the best because you do not omit anyone who has something to contribute. Don't be a "little Caesar" and have everything decided except who's going to do the work.

BE A DELEGATER. The most effective leaders delegate responsibilities and do not try to do everything themselves. List all the tasks that must be done and assign people to be responsible for doing them. The leader should try to keep in touch periodically to make sure things are progressing smoothly. Try to do this without the appearance of badgering.

BE PERSISTANT. So, you can't get anyone to volunteer. Ask people you think will do the job. If you are refused, do not take NO for an answer. Ask again the next dance or meeting, but in a different way so you do not seem like you are prodding. That person may have thought it over and, although they will not approach you, will say yes if asked again. Some require even longer to think about it and will say yes the third, fourth, or even fifth time you go around.

\section*{Callers' Co-op}

Our Leadership Conference that was held in February was a great success. One-hundred and fifty dancers representing twenty-four clubs in the Rochester area were present. Also, there were some square dancers from the Buffalo area.

Chuck Prister started off the conference with a talk on "Leadership" and "How to Lead". He said that leadership requires preparation, involvement, the experience of others and the ability to delegate. It is important to remember that to lead takes \(30 \%\) applied common sense and \(70 \%\) communication.

Gerry Prister, was next with her excellent talk on "positive ldeas on How to Lead", such as:
1. Being on time to perform duties
2. Have social committee welcome guests
3. Organize things well in advance
4. Keep the number of officers low
5. Keep a notebook of problem solvers to pass on to the next officers
6. Have a full membership meeting once a year
7. Talk to the caller, discuss ideas
8. Promote square dancing whenever possible Plus, ideas on angels, halls, classes and much, much more.

Herry Carmen concluded Caller's Co-op part of the program with his talk on "Levels" and "Sportsmanship in Square Dancing".

Next came the Federation's turn with a question and answer talk given by Bob and Maryln Dailey. "Waht is the purpose of the Federation?" Maryln asked Bob answered, "To promote square dancing, round dancing and contras in this area." "How do you do that?", Maryln asked. Bob answered, "By demonstrations, TV, papers, radio, banner stealing, dance-0-Rama, and the Promenader."
