THE TULIP SLEEVE

For comfort in dancing, the tulip
sleeve is very popular. To make the
tulip sleeve, take your basic sleeve
pattern and use it to alter into a cap sleeve per Diagram A. Use new sleeve to shape the tulip. Front and back are the same, Diagram B. Join at underarm seam and cross over so that the back comes over the front on the finished sleeve.

Were out here in great numbers and look forward to dancing with you and being your friend. Try to ignore the occasional sourpusses out there and confide in us if they bother you. If we have done our job, you will be back with us in the fall bringing your friends to an open house. And that's what it's all about.

He was on a plane coming back from a business trip and couldn't make connections. I was so grateful that Rich Castner was willing--and able to substitute. We thank him--more than we can say.

I was pleased that so many class graduates decided to find out what contras were all about. Many of you found them to be confusing. They are, after square dancing. The figures in a contra dance are very simple-but the progression can be tricky. Sometimes you do one part when you are "active" and seem to have a totally different dance when you are "inactive". And--how about that 'Fisher's Hornpipe" that Rich called as his second dance? ---A triple? For those of you who stuck it out---you were "active" if you were a "one" and "inactive" if you were a " 2 " or " 3 "', During the progression, the "11" stayed in their role until the end of the line--but the " 2 's" and "3's" alternated their parts until they progressed to the beginning of the line. That was a "wallenge tip"-and believe it or not--it is one of the classic dances that has stood the test of time. It really isn't considered to be a difficult dance once you have all the basics.

Do let us know if you would like a workshop session next year. There are so many things we did not cover this year. Three figures not used in square dancing are "contra corners", "Hey for three" and "Hey for four" and dances using those terms are probably the most fun to do .....something like "grand square".

For those of you going to Detroit and the National Square Dance Convention--do stop by the contra hall which goes full time--and includes "'after parties". The education committee plans a 2 hour workshop each day (Ed will be doing one of them) where all the basics are taught in a progressive order. There are also caller clinics on prompting contras as well as sessions on choosing music for contras. Be sure to check your program for the wide range of programs offered in the "contra hall".
