
VICE PRESIDENTS' CORNER


Past queries from schools and shopping centers indicate that, with a little promotion, this could become a very active fun type activity for seniors and anyone else with daytimes that are relatively free.

For comfort in dancing, the tulip sleeve is very popular. To make the tulip sleeve, take your basic sleeve pattern and use it to alter into a cap sleeve per Diagram A. Use new sleeve to shape the tulip. Front and back are the same, Diagram B. Join at underarm seam and cross over so that the back comes over the front on the finished sleeve.

Dear New Dancer,

By now most of you have graduated and probably have joined your sponsoring club or another club that your friends belong to. Chances are you had a wonderful time attending classes and even got a feeling of "family" with the many new friends you made. Now you are graduated and "cast upon the waters" to sink or swim - or so you may feel. You thought you were a pretty good dancer and knew all the calls, but suddenly that caller who has nurtured you along has become a different person behind the mike. It's bad enough you are thown in with a lot of strangers who are, at best, tolerating your presence, but the calls are coming fast and furious and there are even a few you haven't heard before. You are embarassed because you lose your direction often and break the square down (or so you think). Someone walks up to you after a tip and says, "If you can't dance, you shouldn't be here!"

For whatever comfort it is, we were all in your shoes at one time. It's just that some of us have forgotten. We stumbled, struggled, broke down squares and forgot which hand to use for a star thru. There are a lot of us out here rooting for you to make it, and by that I mean to persevere long enough to learn the basic calls well. In class you were introduced to the basic calls, but to really learn them you must dance them again and again and again, until you no longer have to think about what you are going to do. Your graduation was a beginning, not an end. Get out there and dance! Only by continuing to dance regularly can you improve your skills. I'm not saying you should go to workshops to learn more, but travel around and seek out the dances that permit you to practice what you have already been taught. If you find a group you feel comfortable with - stick with it.

Look for experienced dancers who want to help you. We're out here in great numbers and look forward to dancing with you and being your friend. Try to ignore the occasional sourpusses out there and confide in us if they bother you. If we have done our job, you will be back with us in the fall bringing your friends to an open house. And that's what it's all about.

It seemed like every month I was writing a change of plan-and at the last minute there was one more. He was on a plane coming back from a business trip and couldn't make connections. I was so grateful that Rich Castner was willing--and able to substitute. We thank him--more than we can sav.

I was pleased that so many class graduates decided to find out what contras were all about. Many of you found them to be confusing. They are, after square dancing. The figures in a contra dance are very simple--but the progression can be tricky. Sometimes you do one part when you are "active" and seem to have a totally different dance when you are "inactive". And--how about that 'Fisher's Hornpipe" that Rich called as his second dance? ---A triple? For those of you who stuck it out---you were "active" if you were a "one" and "inactive" if you were a "2" or "3". During the progression, the "1" stayed in their role until the end of the line--but the "2's" and "3's" alternated their parts until they progressed to the beginning of the line. That was a "challenge tip"-and believe it or not--it is one of the classic dances that has stood the test of time. It really isn't considered to be a difficult dance once you have all the basics.

Do let us know if you would like a workshop session next year. There are so many things we did not cover this year. Three figures not used in square dancing are "contra corners", "Hey for three" and "Hey for four" and dances using those terms are probably the most fun to do ...something like "grand square".

For those of you going to Detroit and the National Square Dance Convention -- do stop by the contra hall which goes full time--and includes "after parties". The education committee plans a 2 hour workshop each day (Ed will be doing one of them) where all the basics are taught in a progressive order. There are also caller clinics on prompting contras as well as sessions on choosing music for contras. Be sure to check your program for the wide range of programs offered in the "contra hall".

From The Kitchen Shelf

Strawberry Punch 2 pkgs. strawberry Kool-Aid 1½ c. sugar

6 oz. can frozen orange juice 6 oz. can frozen lemonade 3 qts. plus 1 pt. water

10 oz. pkg. frozen strawberries Mix first five ingredients and add strawberries.

For a large group, this recipe makes 300 servings, 4 oz. each. Yellow Punch

10 cans pineapple juice (46 oz. each)
3½ gallon orange juice (frozen

kind mixed with required water)

12 qts. 7-Up

Mix juices and add 7-Up at serving time. If desired, float large scoops of pineapple sherbet in punch bowl.

Daiquiri Punch 2 cans frozen lemonade (12 oz.

each)
1½ bottles 7-Up (2 liters each)
1 to 1½ lemonade cans light
rum

1 can limeade (6 oz. each)
Make an ice ring using limeade, diluted, and add lemon slices. Mix all other ingredients and pour over ice ring in punch bowl.

Miriam's Punch

1 large bottle 7-Up 1 can pineapple juice (64 oz.) 1 can frozen lemonade (6 oz.) 1 can frozen orange juice (6 oz.) Mix fruit juices in punch bowl. Add 7-Up at serving time.

Holiday Punch

5 pkgs. lime Jello (3 oz. each) 2 qts. boiling water 2½ qts. cold water 5 c. sugar

32 oz. pineapple-grapefruit juice

1 cans frozen lemonade (6 oz. each)

Dissolve Jello in boiling water and add all other ingredients. Mix thoroughly. Put into quart plastic cartons and freeze. Thaw punch 1½ to 2½ hours until slushy. Add 1 qt. gingerale per 1 qt. punch.

Variations: Use red Jello with mixed fruit, orange Jello with canned orange drink, and apricot Jello with apricot nectar.
