(Jody is my favorite partner in all of the things 1 do, and is a fine round dance cuer.)

This fall I will be calling for: Merry Mixers, Penn Yan Friendship Squares, and Which Way Whirlers. My classes will be: Merry Mixers, Penn Yan Friendship Squares, and Village Squares. I often call for the Student Union of Buffalo State College, and the Marriott Hotel Chain throughout western New York. On September 25, Jody and 1 will be guest caller and cuer for the first time for Harris Squares. (That's Dad's large club in Buffalo.) Many clubs have invited us to be their guest caller and cuer this comming season also. Bless those clubs willing to give new callers and cuers the opportunity to develope. We're sure looking forward to meeting more of the most wonderful people in the world, square dancers.

My goal in calling is to never loose sight of the fact that square dancing is fun and the FUN must be kept in!
