On Thursday, June 23, the main theme will be
"Building Trust" with Bo and Agnes Semith of Glen Carbon 1L. Leading a discussion on "Relationships" by Bob and Becky Osgood of Los Angeles, Ca. another one on "Communications".

Club money management will be the topic for Friday. Peter $J$ and Jenie Zukauskas of Bel Air, Md. will start out with "Budgets". Ted and Betty Vaile of Peru, In. will continue the discussion with special fund raising projects. This years seminars will conclude on Saturday with a panel on Club Leadership aptly named "Fun Not Frustration" by its moderator Freddie Kadtenthaler of Pocono Pines, Pa. Ably assisting her on the panel. will be Loren and Bobby Foster of Sun Parairie, Wi. Boband Dot Elgin of Harrison City, Pa. and Bob and Janette Kemper of Dak Ridge, Tn.

The Legacy organization was chosen to conduct these sminars as it is the leadership-communicationresource center of the Square Dance Activity. LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE, FEBRUARY 06, 1983
Our 1983 Leadership Conference was a tremendous success. Over 150 people attended, representing 19 area -lubs. The Leadership Conference is a joint venture by ie Callers' Co-op and the Federation.

Callers' Co-op Moderator Mike Harris opened the afternoon conference by introducing Bob and Jeannette Meagher, chairmen of the conference. After a short introduction by Bob Meagher, the first panel on the Rochester Area Federation ("the Group") was presented. Sitting on the panel were Fayne Doering, Bob and Maryin Dailey, and Jim Davidson. Bob Dailey gave a short talk on the Federation. Jim Davidson presented an excellent report on the findings from the square dance club questionnaire that was sent to all the clubs in the Rochester area. It was very interesting. Then there were questions from the floor on how to join the Federation, where does the money taken in for dues go, insurance, publicity, Promenader, Dance-0-Rama, etc.

Next we had the panel on Dance-0-Rama ("the Event"). The panel consisted of our present Chairmen of DOR, Jerry and Joan Sanford, John Fink, and Bob Meagher. Bob gave a short history of Dance-0-Rama. Then the Sanfords discussed this year's DOR, noting the fact that the price of tickets is still within reason for everybody to attend. It is still being held at Brockport, and will include a seminar on Smooth Dancing. Also, new class graduates should be encouraged to attend. Many interesting questions were asked about callers, dance levels, posting lists outside of halls, etc.

After a short coffee break we resumed by introducing the third panel on Club officers ("the Management"). On this panel were Fran and Bud Macomber and Dorothy and $J$ John Hartman. They were asked questions on how to handle problems within a club on roughness, drinking, proper dress, manners, etc. Also how to handle beginners ${ }^{\circ}$ classes and how to bridge the gap between class and club.

The last panel was presented on the Callers' ooperative of Rochester ("the Entertainers"). The panel Consisted of Jerry Carmen, Chip Kellogg, and Mike Callahan. Many questions were askes, including ones about how to mix couples during the dance, the number system, and the possibility of running two-year beginner classes to cut down on the dropout rate of new people.

Bob Meagher closed the conference by thanking everyone for attending. He then thanked his committee; Peg and Myron Huss, Rita and Orlo Hoadley who were absent because of illness, and his wife deanoette. He also thanked all the other people who helped, including Bob and Maryln Dailey, Wanda Callahan, and anyone else he forgot to mention. Special thanks to Jerry Carmen and Mike Harris for providing the sound and programming of. callers and cuers.

After the conference we had a brief Happy Hour, followed by a buffet supper. Then we had a very nice dance, provided by our local callers and cuers.

## STOP the PRESSES

At the March 10th Federation Meeting, a Publicity Committee was established to promote Square Dancing in the Greater Rochester Area. The primary objective of the Committee this year, is to produce a TV commercial and purchase air time during August 1983 to supplement every club's class recruiting efforts.

The entire Square Dance Community can benefit. A telephone number would be aired at the end of the commercial. Anyone calling for more information about Square Dancing would be sent a listing of all Beginner Groups in the Greater Rochester Area, as well as the Federation brochure, "What is Square Dancing?" The listing would include Club Name; Contact Person and Phone Number, Class time, night, and location for each club in the area. Your club's recruiting efforts would be enhanced by this program.

In the last year we have seen four Square Dance Clubs fold in the Rochester area. Many clubs are in financial difficulty. For the last several years, class sizes have been small or non-existent for many clubs. It is time to take positive action. It is time to promote our activity in an on-going, organized way.

In researching this idea, we found that a TV commercial was one of the most effective and reasonable forms of advertising. Yet, we need your financial support. A one dollar donation from every dancer would get this project started. Please help. The Committee's goal is attainable; but with most area dance programs ending in approximately eight weeks, timing is critical. If we are to do anything to help increase class sizes in September, we must have funds now to act on this proposal.

This project is worth a "dollar a dancer" investment. Help promote Square Dancing. Everyone will benefit. (continued on page 6...)
